.DISCUSSION...

Moisture will increase through Friday as monsoonal flow from the southeast develops. East to southeast winds developing Thursday morning and continuing until the westerly sea breeze arrives mid-afternoon Thursday could be gusty at times. There is a slight chance (20%) of afternoon and evening thunderstorms both Thursday and Friday (10% of a late night thunderstorm Thursday night), and any thunderstorms that form could produce brief gusty winds to 40 MPH and lightning.

Sky/weather.....Partly cloudy (45-55 percent). Slight chance of showers and thunderstorms in the afternoon.
Max temperature.....Around 87.
Min humidity.....28 percent.
Eye level winds.....East winds 3 to 7 mph with gusts to 11 mph becoming west 3 to 6 mph with gusts to 10 mph around 1500.

Major Hazards and Risks:

WEATHER – DRIVING – SITUATIONAL AWARENESS

Weather: Monitor for potential thunderstorm activity and refer to the IRPG pg. 17. Post lookouts when appropriate and monitor weather. A spot outside the line could result in a dangerous rate of spread. Don't be complacent while mopping up, wear proper PPE.

Driving: Drive defensively and make sure you have plenty of clearance when passing on narrow roads. There is no need to speed while enroute to or returning from the fire line. There are residents who remain in the area and drive on the roads. Many of the roads are unpaved and can become very soft with the numerous equipment driving on them.

Fatigue: Take frequent nutrition and hydration breaks throughout the day. Hydrate with a 2 water to 1 electrolyte drink ratio on hot dry days. Monitor personnel for fatigue and plan accordingly with work assignments. Stay operationally ready for possible new assignments.

Situational Awareness: Assess your current situation constantly. Take the time to educate your crew on various parts of your division as it relates to the safety message.

Environmental Hazards: Maintain your Situational Awareness when working in areas that may have farming or cultivation operations. Notify line supervision of any hazards that are found within these properties.

Steep Slopes/Rolling Material/Snags: Watch your footing while hiking in steep terrain. Be careful of loose rolling debris. Maintain Situational Awareness while working around trees and snags.

Mop Up: Conduct a thorough briefing for all personnel. Use all PPE, including eye protection. Maintain proper spacing. Be alert for stump holes. Evaluate any unburned islands and stay alert.

Lookouts, Communication, Escape routes, Safety zones

TAILGATE SAFETY

Planning For Medical Emergencies

- **Safety gear:** Ensure everyone has the appropriate PPE and is using it.
- **Accountability:** Supervisors know where their crews are at all times.
- **Hydration and Nutrition:** Monitor each other for proper hydration and nutrition.
- **Communication:** Everyone knows the comm plan and follows it.
- **Briefing:** Leader's intent is fully communicated, and safety briefing is provided.
- **LCES:** They are clear, understandable, and made known to everyone.

Supervisors and all firefighters need to Review your ICS 206 ask and be able to answer the following questions:

What are we going to do if someone gets hurt?


- Is there personnel and equipment available to assist?

How will we get them out of here?


- What is your best extraction and transport method? Road, helispot, hoist? Primary plan and contingency plan in place?

How long will it take to get them to the hospital?

- Will you request air or ground resources?

ALL	WEATHER	Maintain your situational awareness during critical burn periods with winds that could increase or change direction near steep and narrow canyons/drainages. Monitor for potential thunderstorm activity and refer to the IRPG Pg. 17. Above normal temperatures anticipated	
ALL	FATIGUE, HEAT, & DEHYDRATION	Don't underestimate the task at hand. Adhere to work/rest cycle for all task(s). DRINK WATER before, during and after shifts, up to 1.5 gal. per shift. Review of Line Emergency Notifications. Seek shade when you can. Watch for stack-effect of fatigue and exhaustion; REST & Plan operations.



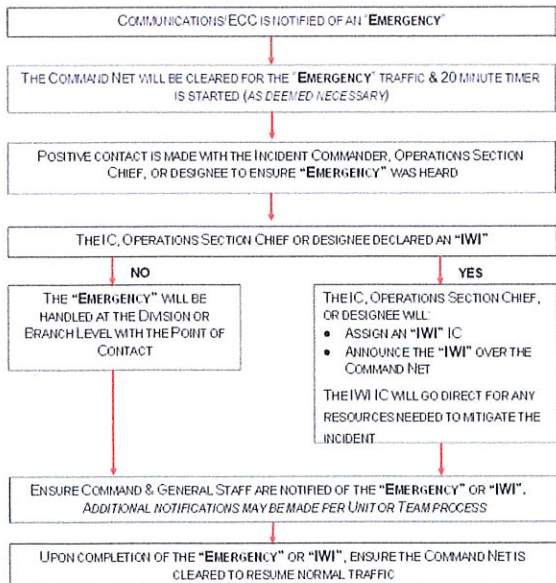
