

DISCUSSION**WEATHER RELIEF IS COMING**

Only minor changes today with the overall weather. Temperatures will continue to cool slightly, but humidity will remain dry. The challenge for the shift weather wise will be the winds, especially the wind direction. Northeasterly winds pushing from the Central Valley will battle the southwesterly winds pushing from the Salinas Valley along the higher terrain near Black Mt Ridgeline. Gusts will accompany the shifting winds. More noticeable cooling trend will kick in Monday.

INPUTS

WEATHER SUMMARY:

Shifting winds and still warm and dry for the operational period.

See IMET forecast in the IAP for detailed weather information.

OUTPUTS

FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL:

The fire remains in the 2017 Garza fire footprint. The fire area is dominated at lower elevations by cured, grazed annual grasses and live shrubs, transitioning to patchy brush and grass-oak woodland intermixed with gray pines in the upper elevations. Cured grass loading increases significantly with elevation. Grass and brush under canopy will have heavier fuels cast into the fuelbeds.

Fire danger indices (ERC, BI, SC) at the Alcalde RAWS continue to trend downward toward seasonal averages and below as the days go forward. As atmospheric moisture increases in the coming days heavier fuels will be slow to respond and still present a threat to the lines. Probability of ignition will reach 60% during the peak burn period. Running surface fire may spot up to a 4/10 of a mile under expected burning conditions.

SPECIFIC:

Branch V

No further movement is anticipated. Heavier fuels in the drainage bottoms may cause flare ups in unburned canopy and scorched brush fuels. Watch for cigars still burning in tree canopies.

Branch XV

This area of the fire is most prone to battling winds, especially Div Lima and Oscar. Firing operations must commence early in the day before peak heating to prevent the chance of a vortex or fire whirl. Spots in Division S will result in fish-hook runs back up the slope. Roll out spot fires into the Dark Hole could result in a slope reversal to the south.

Branch XXV

Scorched canopy and unburned pockets are a significant threat. Heavies will burn vigorously for a few more days.

AIR OPERATIONS:

No smoke impacts to air operations anticipated. Turbulence is likely in areas of battling winds. Mixing height around 7000' AGL, similar to yesterday.

Sunrise: 6:37 A.M.

SAFETY

Watch for fire-weakened trees/branches falling after extended burn-out times of heavy fuels. Heavy fuels and canopy can harbor heat that could become active with increase in wind speed.

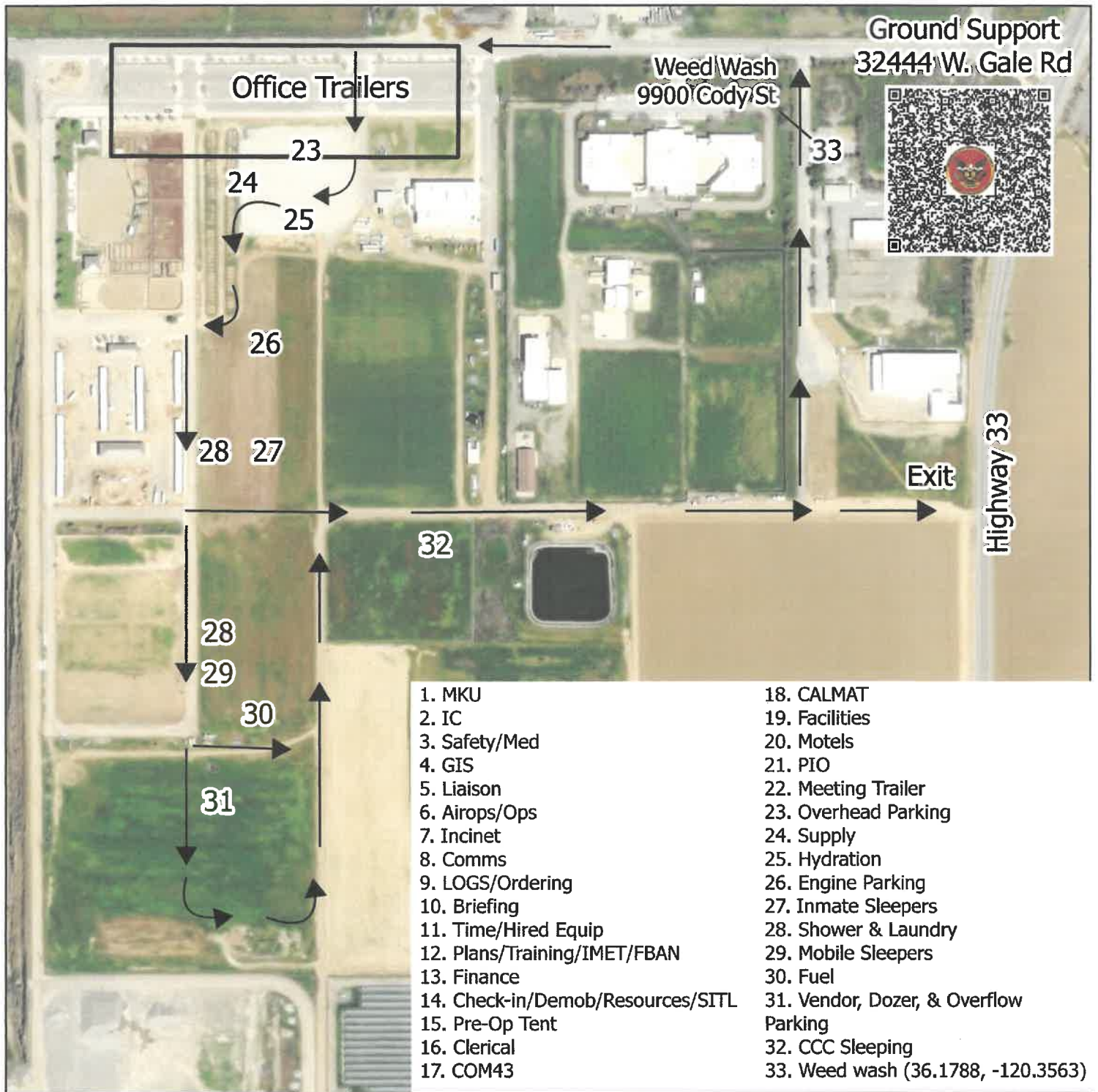
