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DISCUSSION WEATHER PATTERN CHANGE

The gradual cool down and uptick in humidity of the last few days will continue Monday as a storm system sits off the NorCal Coast. Problematic wind directions will once again impact the fire as Central Valley winds battle Salinas Valley winds. Just be heads up for shifting winds over higher terrain near Black Mt. (see below for details). Humidity recovery will increase tonight. Cooler and more moist conditions arrive on Tuesday with a chance for nearby showers.



OUTPUTS

FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL:

Most of the current fire perimeter lies within the 2017 Garza fire footprint. The fire area is dominated at lower elevations by cured, grazed annual grasses and live shrubs, transitioning to patchy brush and grass-oak woodland intermixed with gray pines in the upper elevations. Cured grass loading increases significantly with elevation.

Fire danger indices (ERC, BI, SC) at the Alcalde RAWs are near seasonal averages for the period of record and continue to trend downward. However, fuels throughout the fire area remain dry and receptive. Probability of ignition will be 50-80% during the peak burn period.

SPECIFIC:

DIVS A / F / K: No further movement is anticipated. Isolated heat and smoke production will continue in areas where heavier fuels inside the perimeter were not fully consumed.

DIVS O / S: The fire has reached control features on both divisions, but expect numerous smokes, fire-weakened trees and continued rollout potential in areas of recent fire activity. Remaining islands of unburned brush within the perimeter will support backing and flanking fire spread. Watch for burning snags close to control lines and cigars in tree canopies.

DIVS W / Y: Any remaining pockets of unburned fuel will present a threat to control features until secured, although southwest wind direction will limit spread potential. Expect continued smoldering consumption of heavy fuels interior.

AIR OPERATIONS:

No smoke impacts to air operations anticipated. Turbulence remains likely in areas of battling winds. Mixing height 5000' AGL.

SAFETY

As observed fire activity decreases, continue to assess the fire environment for changes and hazards, and remain prepared to react to rollout or new ignitions.

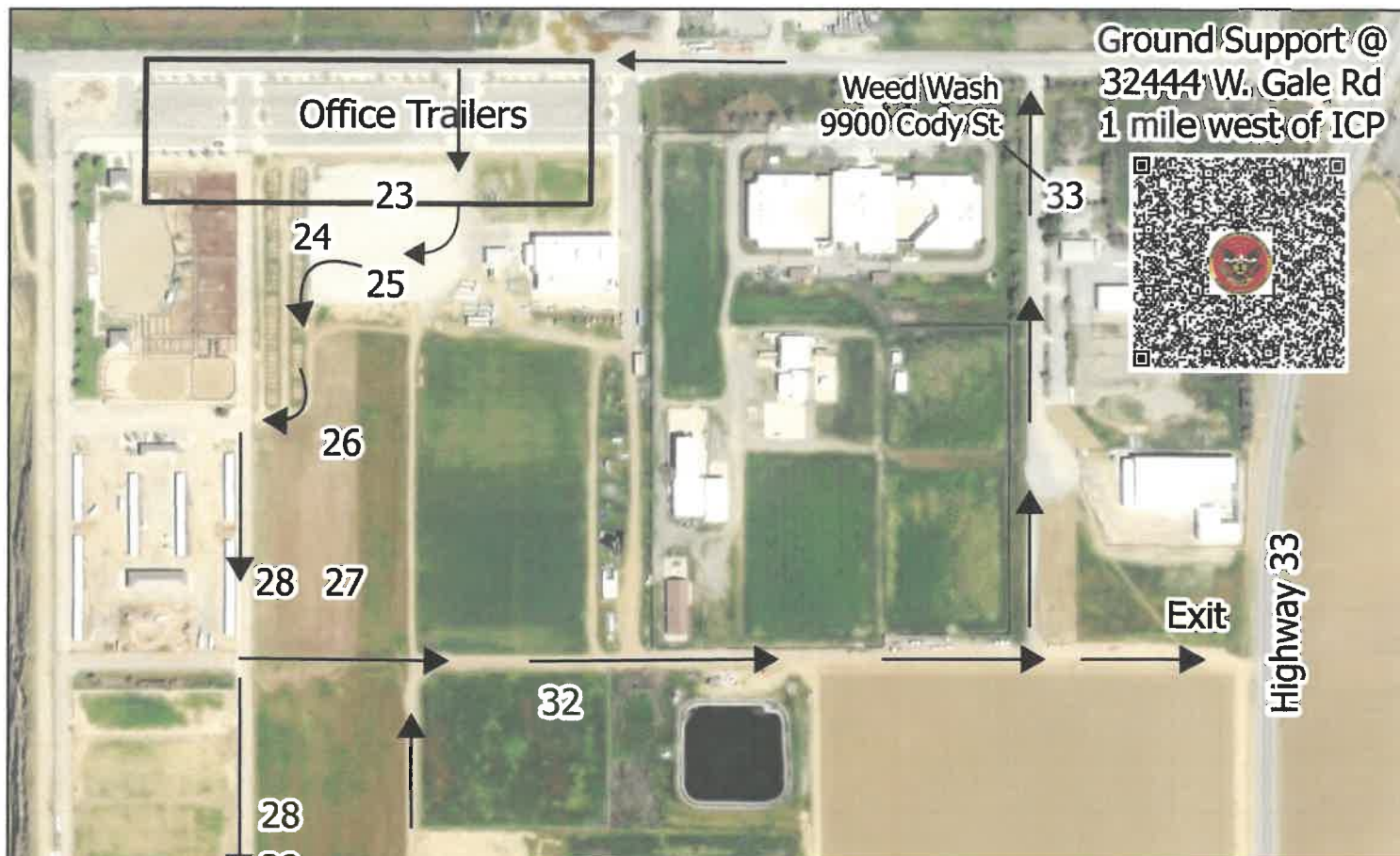

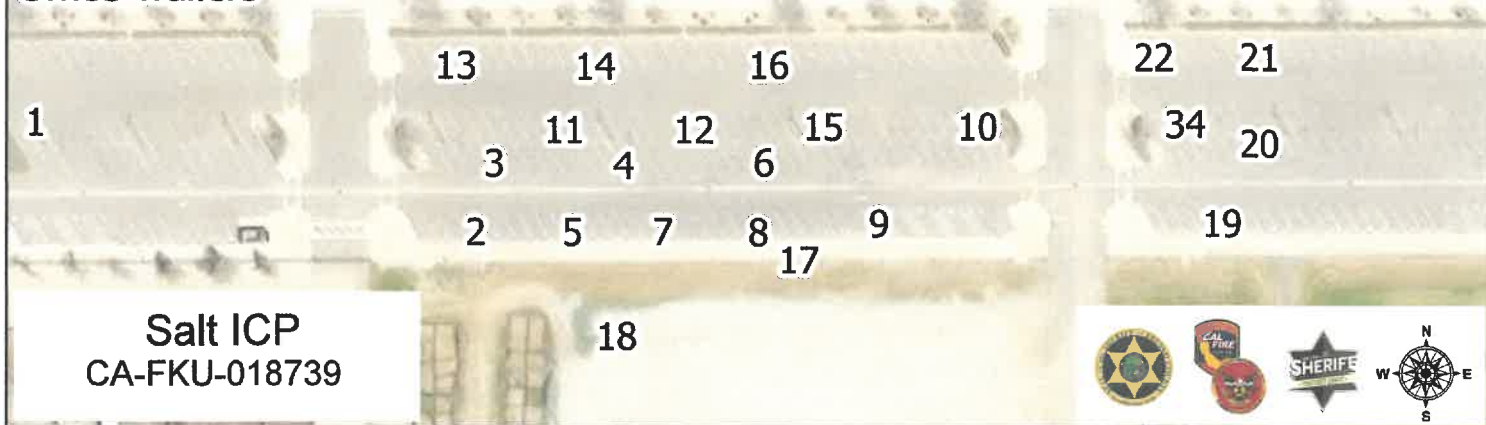
