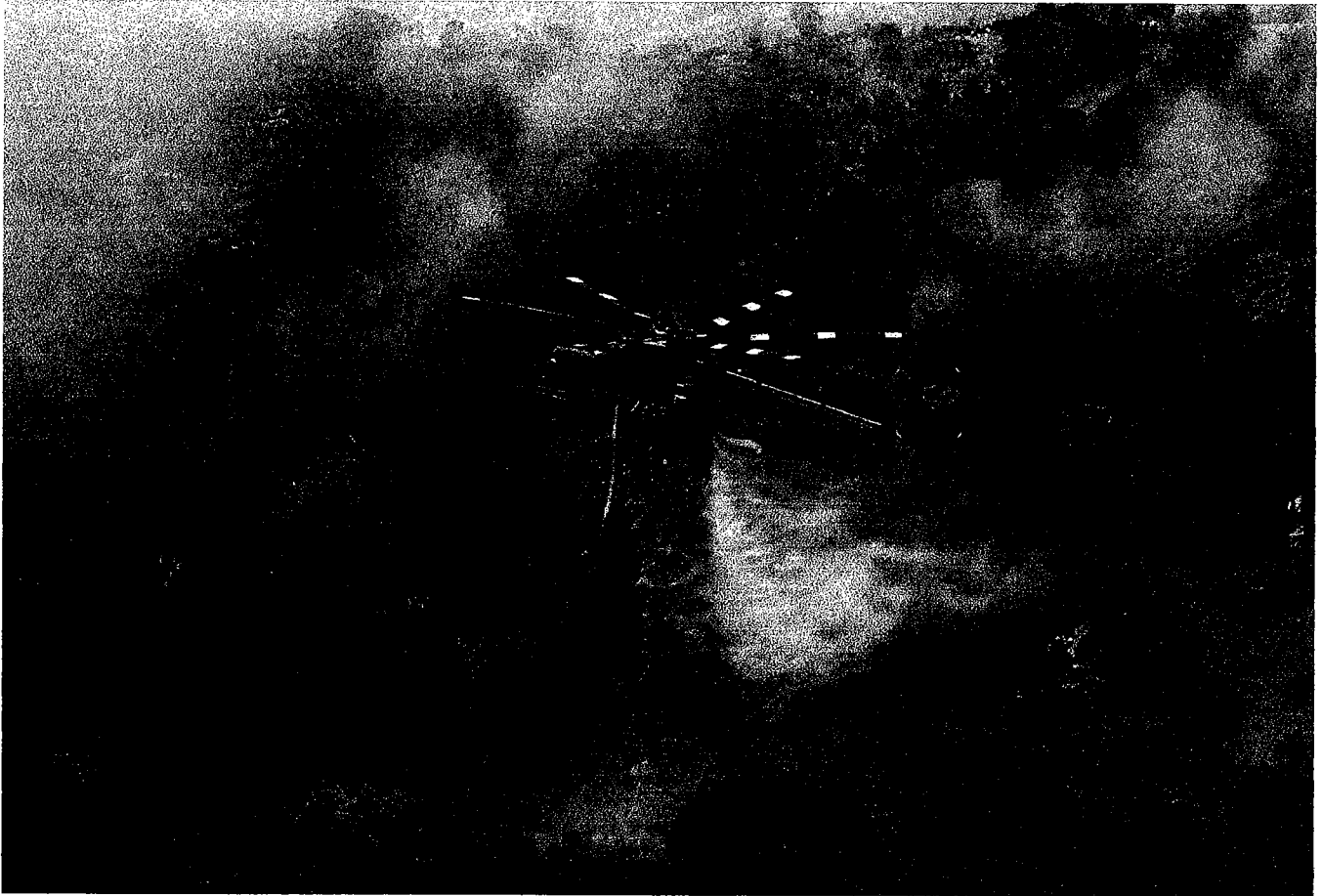





WEATHER DISCUSSION: High pressure cell centered near Four Corners region will continue the trends from the Southeast and moisture over the Incident. There is a chance of thunderstorms from the morning through late afternoon over the incident. For tonight through Wednesday, an upper trough moving inland to the north will cause the general winds to shift to the southwest. This will bring dry and stable air across the Incident. For Thursday through the coming weekend...the winds switch back to southeast as the High pressure cell rebuilds over the Four Corners area.

WEATHER FORECAST:

WEATHER: Partly Cloudy, chance of thunderstorms late morning through late afternoon. LAL 2. Chance of wetting rain 15 percent.

TEMPERATURES: Highs 85 to 90...near 97 desert floor. Lows 68 to 73.

HUMIDITY: Minimum 25 to 35 percent. Maximum 55 to 60 percent.

WINDS:

RIDGETOP - Southeast 5 mph through the mid afternoon, becoming Southwest 10 mph during the late afternoon and evening, diminishing to West 3 to 5 mph after midnight.

SLOPE/VALLEY - Upslope 3 to 8 mph through the afternoon, becoming West 10 mph with gusts 15 mph during the evening, diminishing to West 2 to 5 mph after midnight

STABILITY/INVERSION: Weak Inversion near 5000 ft MSL until 0800 PDT and after 2000 PDT. Mixing level lifting to 10,000 ft MSL 0900 PDT through 1800 PDT. Transport winds Southeast 4 mph until 1500 PDT, then West to Southwest 3 to 6 mph after 1500 PDT.

OUTLOOK FOR Tuesday, July 26, 2011:

few morning clouds otherwise sunny and clear. Highs 88 ridges to 98 desert floor. Lows 55 to 60 except near 70 desert floor. Min RH 18%. Max RH 30-40%. Upslope winds 3 to 8 mph becoming West 10 mph with gusts 20 mph mid afternoon and evening.

EXTENDED FORECAST:

WEDNESDAY...Sunny/Clear. Highs 88 to 95. Lows 55 to 60. Min RH 15%. Max RH 35%. Winds West 5 to 10 mph.

THURSDAY...Partly Cloudy. Highs 86 to 95. Lows 65 to 70. Min RH 15-20%. Max RH 35% ridges and 55% desert floor. Winds Southeast 5 mph.

FRIDAY...Sunny in the morning then Partly Cloudy. Highs 87 to 93. Lows 68 to 71. Min RH 25%. Max RH 40% ridges to 55% desert floors. Wind southeast 5 mph...except West 10 mph in the late afternoon and evening.

SATURDAY...Partly cloudy. Slight chance of thunderstorms. LAL 2. Highs 86 to 91. Lows 65 to 70. Min RH 30 to 35%. Max RH 55 to 65%. Winds southeast 5 mph.

Eagle Fire Safety Message

July 25, 2011

Major Hazards and Risks:

WEATHER!!!! Be aware of changing conditions and erratic winds. Review the weather forecast. Be alert for possible thunderstorm development.

ALWAYS watch for **SNAGS**. Avoid them, flag them and report them so we can get them mitigated.

Steep, Rugged Terrain Watch footing, maintain distance from other crew members.

FATIGUE, DEHYDRATION AND HEAT EXHAUSTION!!! Get plenty of rest, watch for fatigue and mitigate, and follow proper hydration procedures.

Review the Heat Exhaustion Safety Alert! Ensure crew members follow the guidelines!

There may be unexploded ordinance from training exercises in the fire area popping off with fire contact. If you encounter ordinance: stay away do not touch it. Flag the area and report it.

Key Points:

Drive slowly and carefully in camp, on the highways, and roads in the fire area.

Watch for snakes, bees, and ticks.

The Ten Standard Orders are **FIRM**. There is no compromise.

Every Crew: Conduct AND document your tailgate safety message.

Establish and Maintain your LCES.

Each element needs to be established AND maintained throughout the shift, if LCES is compromised, mitigate it.

LCES Topic of the Day: L

Do you have your lookouts posted. Can they see the crew location and the fire. Do they have adequate communications with the crew.

Watchout topic of the day: #6

Instructions and assignments not clear.

Make sure you understand the mission and the plan. Communicate with other resources and division supervisors.

SAFETY ALERT

HEAT RELATED ILLNESS

HEAT RELATED ILLNESS IS PREVENTABLE!!!!

All personnel shall follow established guidelines.

Heat-induced illness is a result of the body's inability to cope with heat. This can be a minor symptom or a serious life-threatening injury. While recognition and treatment are important, prevention is the key.

Becoming acclimated to working in a hot environment takes time.

- It normally takes 4-8 days to acclimate
- Fatigue and alcohol consumption delays this process
- Persons not acclimated are at increased risk and can suffer heat-related illness at lower levels of heat and work activity

Personnel need to pre-hydrate before work and continuously hydrate during work.

- Water is the primary form of fluid replacement
- Before work, it is recommended to drink 20 ounces of sports drink
- During work drink 8 ounces of water every 15 minutes (1 Quart/hour)
- Cool / cold water is preferred
- Consider a carbohydrate / electrolyte sports drink as a portion (25%-50%) of the fluid intake

Avoid Hyponatremia

- Hyponatremia develops when the concentration of sodium is diluted in the bloodstream
- Exercise-induced hyponatremia occurs when this phenomenon is caused by excess water intake during exercise or work
- Proper nutrition and consumption of carbohydrate/electrolyte sports drinks as part of hydration will assist in avoiding hyponatremia
- Symptoms can include disorientation, headache, muscle cramps and nausea

Take Frequent Rest Breaks

- Hydrate during the rest break
- Create improvised shade, get out of the sun
- Document your rest breaks

Avoid Certain Drinks

- To help prevent dehydration, **AVOID** carbonated beverages and performance beverages such as Red Bull, Rock Star, Monster Drinks, etc.
- Caffeine hastens fluid loss in the urine.

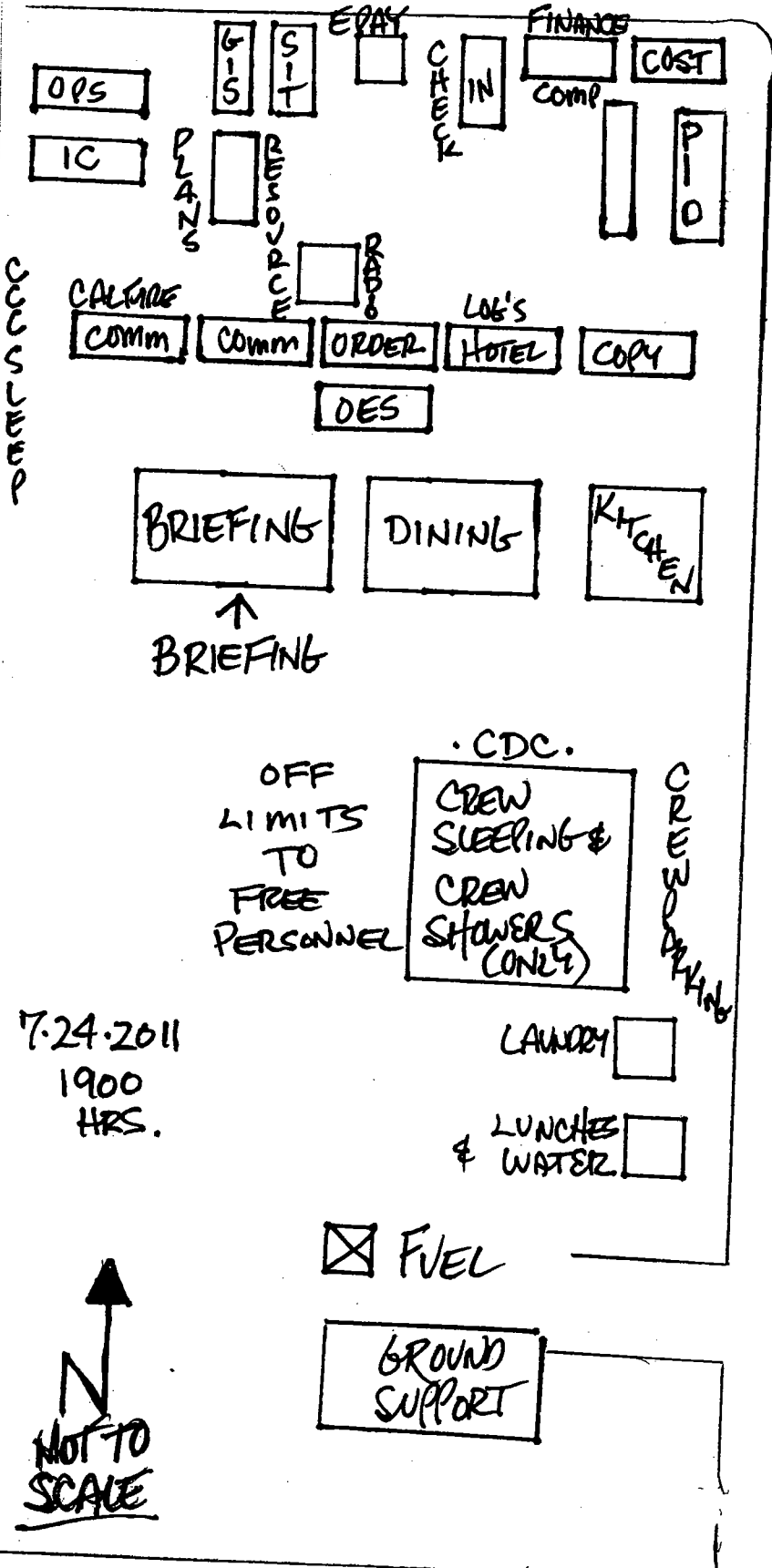

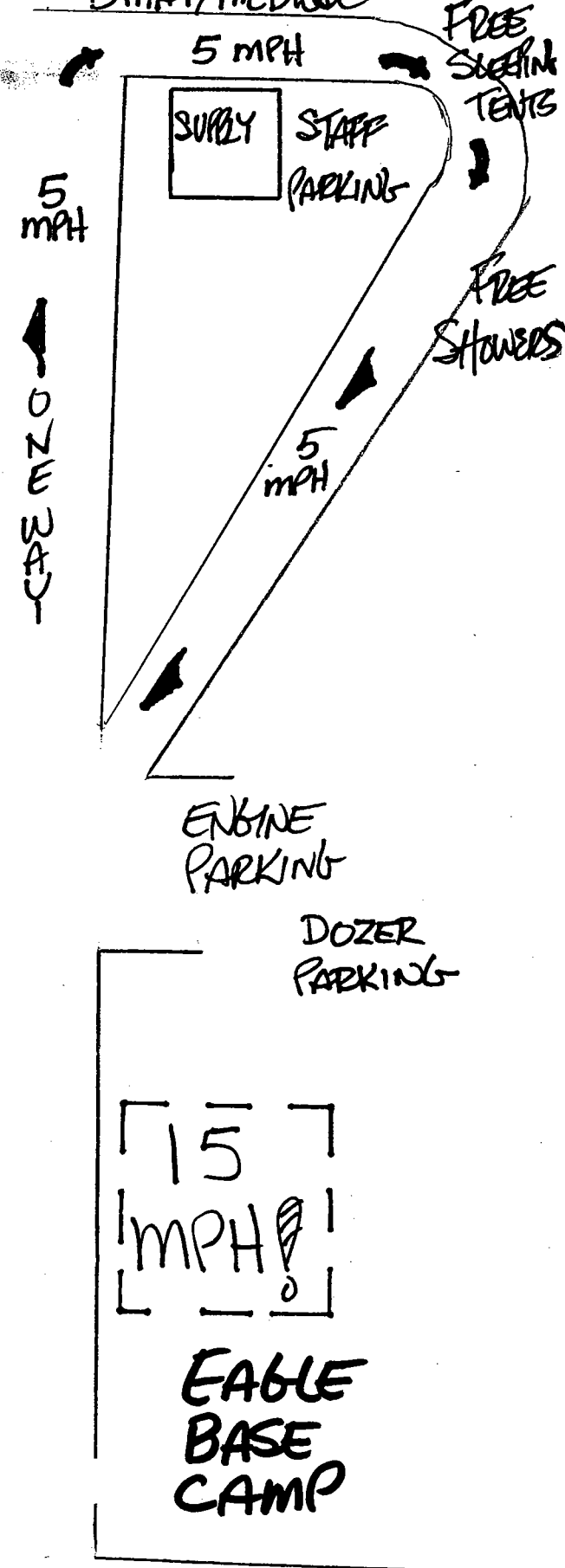
