WEATHER DISCUSSION: High pressure builds over the region bringing another round of hot and very dry weather. Mid and lower slope winds will continue to be strongly terrain driven over the next few days. Ridge winds will primarily come from north/northeast the next couple days with occasional bouts of northwest winds possible from onshore influences.

Coastal Sage Scrub fuel, primarily chamise and button brush, have seasonally low live fuel moisture for this time of year. Fire continues to burn in areas burned by both the 1999 Kirk and 2008 Basin Fires, and further south in fuels burned only once by the 2008 Basin fire. Snags, skeleton brush and heavy downed fuel are abundant.

<u>Probability of ignition</u>: Day: Shaded 50-70% Unshaded 70-90%

Night: 40-60%

SPECIFIC

BRANCH III, IV, VI

A general wind direction of Northeast will be favorable for operations. With the increase in temperature and the corresponding decrease in humidity expect the fire conditions to change accordingly. Due to the lighter general winds look for the local terrain influences to affect wind directions as the day heats up. By midday the upslope winds will out compete the ridge top winds. The local threshold for 10hr fuel moisture will be met by early afternoon and will readily burn.

Look for the fire behavior to stabilize and diminish around 1900 as the humidity increases. This will last for a few hours. The humidity will slowly fall from 2200 through the early morning hours. Fire activity will gradually increase in and above the thermal belt 3500ft.

AIR OPERATIONS

A very shallow inversion may occur but should have little effect on air operations. VFR conditions expected through the remainder of the days operational period.

SAFETY

The complexity of operations should make us recall the basics. Standard Order Number 3 is emphasized today: **Base all actions on current and expected behavior of the fire.** Base all of your actions, not just some of them, on fire behavior while you're in the fire environment.

Upper ridge building over area will allow marine layer to re-establish near the coast around 1000 ft, but should not impact the coast. Expect northeasterly winds again continuing into mid-morning, giving way to breezy westerly winds in the afternoon along coastal ridge. Upper ridge will continue to warm and dry through the weekend.

WEATHER FORECAST For Thursday:

WEATHER: Shallow marine layer to about 1000ft this morning, staying west of coast. Northeast to East winds overnight into this morning will help dry airmass over burn area by sunrise.

FIRELINE QUESTIONS TO EMPHASIZE SAFETY

TEN QUESTIONS EVERY FIREFIGHTER MUST ASK AND ANSWER YES TO BEFORE ENGAGING IN FIRE SUPPRESSION

- 1. Do you understand the organization for this fire and your place in it?
- 2. Is there a plan and do you understand it?
- 3. Do you know it is OK to ask questions and ensure that the instructions you are given, provide for your safety and the safety of your fellow fire fighters?
- 4. Do you know the weather forecast for today?
- 5. Have you assessed fire behavior and made a prediction?
- 6. Are you interactive with the Standard Fire Orders and Watch Out Situations?
- 7. Do you have the Lookouts, Communications, Escape Routes, and Safety Zones in place?
- 8. Do you understand that it's both your responsibility and your right to say No to orders that cannot be accomplished without compromising one or more of the *Standard Fire Orders* or without mitigating each of the *Watch Out Situations*?
- 9. Can you describe the fire environment you are going to operate in?
- 10. Are you prepared to engage; monitor the fire environment, be proactive, and make adjustments?

BACK TO THE BASICS: Size-Up; when does it start and when does it end? On our way to this fire we were sizing-up the weather, fuels, topography and the condition of our crew. Now that we have several shifts under our belts, are we still doing this? If not, we should be! Size-up is a continual and ongoing process that should last us through the incident and safely back home.

CIRCLE OF SAFETY:

- Walk around the vehicle.
- Check the windshield, wipers, and wiper fluid level
- Keep windows, mirrors, and lights clean to better see and be seen
- Check headlights, turn signals, tail lights, reflectors and running lights.
- Adjust mirrors.
- Check front and back tires (including wheels and lug nuts).
- Under the hood, check all fluid levels and especially the Air Filter



SNAGS AND HAZARD TREES:

All trees, especially large trees are potentially dangerous.

- Trees don't tell when they are going to fall, they just do. Be heads up!
- Minimize your exposure time and resources around hazard tree.
- How many times do we have a conversation under large trees?

DEHYDRATION:

If you're thirsty, you've waited too long to drink water. You need to drink a minimum of 32 ounces of water per hour during the day shift.

FACT:

- If you lose 3 % of your hydration, you will lose 20% of your energy.
- If you lose 5% of your hydration, you lose 50% and you will need to visit medical.

Meal Periods (Actual Hours Worked Employees)

Compensable meal periods <u>are the exception</u>, not the rule (5 CFR 551.411 (c) 36 and 29 CFR 785.19 (a))

Personnel <u>assigned to the fireline</u> may be compensated for their meal period if all of the following conditions are met:

- The fire is not controlled, and
- The Operations Section Chief makes a decision that it is critical to the effort of controlling the fire that personnel remain at their post of duty and continue to work as they eat, **and**
- The compensable meal break is approved by the supervisor at the next level and it is documented in remarks on the CTR, SF-261.

In those situations where all other incident <u>support personnel cannot be relieved</u> from performing work and must remain at a post of duty, a meal period may be recorded as time worked for which compensation shall be allowed and <u>documented in remarks block on the CTR, SF-261</u>.

For <u>personnel in support positions</u>, and <u>fireline personnel after control</u> of the fire, a meal period of <u>at least</u> 30 minutes must be ordered and taken for each work shift (e.g., a <u>minimum</u> 30 minute break for shifts of 8 hours or more). All meal periods unless justified in remarks must be shown as a 30 minute break.

Local Government responding under CFAA follow their department policy and guidelines regarding hours and meal breaks.

On-Shift Time

On-shift time includes a combination of actual work, ordered standby, and compensable travel. On-shift time has a specific start and ending time and is recorded as clock hours. Each resource is responsible for ensuring they are meeting their 2/1 Work Rest Ratio and/or getting approval in advance from their supervisor and completing a Work Rest/Mitigation form to be approved by IC.

Archaeological and Historical Sites Fireline Guidance for the SOBERANES Incident

One of the values we protect on our National Forest is Heritage Resources, this includes the preservation of Historic sites, Archaeological sites, and sites with traditional or sacred values.

Known archaeological sites are flagged for avoidance with blue flagging tape and yellow and black stripe flagging tape together. Do not compromise safety for the protection and preservation of archaeological and historic sites. When feasible and prudent:

- 1. Be on the lookout for prehistoric and historic sites. Prehistoric archaeological sites include boulders and bedrock with mortars and cupules, holes and grinding surfaces, temporary camps containing scatters of stone flakes, and deposits of dark brown to blackish soil with shell fragments (midden) occurring in layers or mounds on flat surfaces near sources of water, along coastal areas and wetlands, along ridges and saddles, and other areas suitable for camping. Historic sites include old wooden cabins, barns, corrals and other buildings, rock foundations and historic artifact scatters. These kinds of resources are often found in the same kinds of environmental settings as prehistoric camp sites.
- 2. Some archaeological and historical sites have not been flagged yet. If you observe artifacts, features, or sites, attempt to avoid dozing or driving through and/or parking on these sites, if feasible, especially with heavy equipment. Some sites can be protected through avoidance, or by carefully removing flammable materials adjacent to sensitive features, or by wrapping with protective fireproof fabric.
- 3. If you can't avoid sites, minimize disturbance as much as feasible, only clearing the surface to as minimal a depth and width as necessary.
- 4. Leave all artifacts in place. Some artifacts may have been intentionally placed for religious or ceremonial reasons.
- 5. When a site is discovered, flag it for visibility and report its location to a Division Supervisor. If feasible, plot locations of discovered resources on a map, and take a gps reading and photograph. Leave the information with an archaeologist (in the READ tent) so that sites can be relocated and protected during both the suppression and fire suppression repair phases of the Incident.
- 6. If you encounter a burial or human remains, cease work in the area immediately and contact the USFS Archaeologist. State law requires that the Archaeologist contact the Coroner, who will determine if the remains are part of a crime scene.

Sexual Harassment

Inappropriate actions or comments will not be tolerated. Everyone is expected to act in a professional manner. It is your responsibility to stop inappropriate actions or comments immediately upon becoming aware of such. Sexual Harassment must be reported to the Human Resource Specialist or Incident Commander. When outside of your designated sleeping area, you are required to wear at least a shirt, appropriate shorts, and shoes or sandals. If you need clarification of these expectations contact the Human Resource Specialist or IC. What we PERMIT we PROMOTE!!!!

SAFETY

The commitment to and accountability for safety is a joint responsibility of firefighters, managers and administrators. Individuals must personally be committed and responsible for their own performance and accountability. Everyone assigned to this incident can expect an assignment that follows all safety rules & regulations. Every person is expected to perform his or her duties in compliance with all known safety practices at all times. Anything less is unacceptable.

EMPHASIS AREAS

Training

All trainees and trainers are expected to follow the procedures outlined in the California Interagency Incident Management Team 4 **Training Expectations** – **See back page.**

Evaluations

All supervisory personnel assigned will complete an ICS 225 Incident Personnel Performance Rating form for their assigned resources according to agency policy or contractual agreement.

Injuries/Claims

Ensure all injuries and potential claims are reported to the Comp/Claims Unit for completion of appropriate paperwork. Contract claims will be reported to the Procurement Unit Leader.

Work Rest Cycles

The 2: 1 work/rest ratio is mandatory. For every two hours on shift you will be required to rest for one hour. Every effort shall be used to limit work hours to a maximum of 16. If circumstances require you to exceed 16 hours, this needs to be coordinated in advance with your supervisor and the Justification/Mitigation form completed to support the excessive hours prior to submitting for approval by the IC. It is your responsibility to comply with this direction and provide the appropriate documentation to your Supervisor and Finance.

Position Qualifications

Personnel shall only be assigned to positions for which they are qualified. Proof of qualifications shall be approved prior to being assigned to any fire line position. Non-fireline positions may be filled based on the word of the employee pending home unit confirmation, which must be requested immediately. Contract dozer operators, tactical water tender operators and contract fallers must provide proof that they have received the annual fire refresher training.

Engagement/Disengagement

The 10 Standard Orders & 18 Watchout Situations will be followed at all times and mitigated as needed. Staying aware of your situation is critical. This includes Geographic Area and incident briefings. Follow the Risk Management Process outlined in the Incident Response Pocket Guide.

Debriefing

All Branch Directors/Division/Group Supervisors will report to their Supervisor and Situation Unit at the end of the operational period for debriefing with emphasis on the accomplishment of objectives. All unit logs (ICS 214) will be turned in after the debriefing to Documentation reflecting accomplishment and/or special incidents that occurred during the operational period.

Crew Time Reports/Shift Tickets

It is your responsibility to ensure all time is properly accounted for and recorded each shift. The records are to be <u>reviewed and signed</u> by the next level supervisor. A finance "Rules of Engagement" document will be provided in the IAP explaining further requirements.

Social Media

It is your responsibility to know and understand guidelines for firefighter photography, video and social media use. California Interagency Incident Management Team 4 goal is simple: to participate online in a respectful, relevant way that protects our incident's professional reputation, does not confuse the public about the incident and follows the letter and spirit of the law. Be mindful that social media postings can be viewed as unprofessional, damage careers and lead to disciplinary actions. For further information, contact the Public Information Officer.




TRAINING EXPECTATIONS


- 1. Upon arrival at the incident and after check-in, the trainee will bring the following documents to the initial meeting with the training specialist:
 - a. A properly initiated Position Task Book.
 - b. Your Request Number and your Agency (3) letter identifier.
 - c. Your agencies Fire Chief or Training Officers name, address, and phone number to insure that a copy of the training documents will be mailed back to your home unit.
 - d. Your current Incident Qualification Card (red card) that identifies you as a Trainee in the position you are seeking to be trained.
- 2. Have you identified or has a Trainer been assigned to you and if so, have the Trainer present when you meet with the training specialist.
- 3. At closeout and prior to entering the demobilization process, you should complete, sign, and review with the trainer the Final exit interview form. Once the form is complete, bring the following documents to the Training Specialist for closeout;
 - a. Position Taskbook (Evaluation Record dated and signed by the Trainer).
 - b. Completed ICS 225 (Personal Evaluation Record) dated and signed by both the trainee and trainer.
 - c. Completed Final Exit Interview Form dated and signed by both the trainee and the trainer.


Trainer Expectations


- 1. Arrive with the Trainee at the initial meeting with the Training Specialist.
- 2. Be ready to provide your Contact information and your Incident Request number.
- 3. Have a Current Incident Qualifications Card (Red Card) in a position of equal or greater qualifications that the Trainee is trying to achieve.
- 4. Be willing to educate, support, and provide professional and consistent feed back to the trainee during the assignment.
- 5. Throughout the incident the trainer shall continue to monitor and review with the trainee their tasks and goals within the taskbook.
- 6. The trainer, where appropriate is expected to sign off task's that are achieved by the trainee and to complete and sign the following documents.
 - a. ICS 225 (Personal Evaluation Form)
 - b. Evaluation Record at the back of the taskbook.
- 7. The trainer shall portray a positive and professional attitude that lets the trainee know that it is desirable to ask for direction and feedback.
- 8. When accepting the role as a trainer, you are expected to act in a professional manner that represents the California Interagency Incident Management Team 4 and your home agency.


