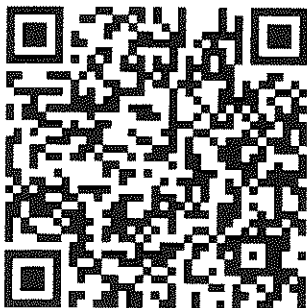



WEATHER DISCUSSION: Strong upper ridge remains over the region today. Surface thermal trough (low pressure) will become positioned over the fire area for several hours this afternoon before moving over the Salinas and Central valleys by late this afternoon. Expect far less wind than yesterday but winds will still battle out for a dominant direction on the ridges. Additionally, a well-mixed boundary layer will allow smoke column development up to 12,000 feet with a potential for shallow pyrocumulus capping. Little change in ridge conditions with another night of very poor humidity recovery around 10%. Most east side valley locations may not see much recovery either possibly staying warm and as dry as 30-35% humidity overnight.

WEATHER FORECAST FOR TODAY: **** Continued Very Hot and Dry ****

WEATHER: Hot, dry and sunny. Shallow pyrocumulus development is possible on columns that reach 12,000 ft.

TEMPERATURES: Highs in the mid-80s to low 90s ridges and upper 90s to mid-100s valleys. (3-5 degrees warmer).

HUMIDITY: 5-9% lowest valleys. 10-14% elsewhere (down 3-5%).

20 FT WINDS:

RIDGETOP / UPPER SLOPE – Southeast winds 8-12 mph with gusts to 20 mph shifting northwest 4-6 mph with gusts to 15 around 1500 hrs.

LOWER SLOPE / VALLEY – Upslope winds 3 to 5 mph developing mid-morning then becoming up-valley 8 to 11 mph with gust 15 to 20 mph in the afternoon.

INLAND MARINE LAYER: None.

WEATHER FORECAST FOR TONIGHT:

WEATHER: Clear.

TEMPERATURES: Lows 55 to 60 in the valleys and in the upper 70s thermal belt and ridges. (5 to 8 degrees warmer).

HUMIDITY: Ridge/Thermal Belt: 8 to 14%. Valleys: Around 30%.

20 FT WINDS:

RIDGETOP / UPPER SLOPE – Northwest winds 5-7 mph with gusts to 15 mph shifting northeast 3-6 mph with gusts to 12 mph around 0200 hours.

LOWER SLOPE/VALLEY – Down-slope winds 2 to 4 mph becoming down-valley 4 to 8 mph after midnight.

Inland Marine Layer: None.

Thermal Belt: 3000 feet.

EXTENDED FORECAST: Strong high pressure will persist Tuesday for continued hot and dry weather with very strong thermal belts and consistently poor night time humidity recoveries. Winds will become more onshore out of the northwest starting Tuesday afternoon then gradually strengthen Wednesday and Thursday. Winds shift back to the west and southwest ahead of a dry cold front. The cold front will push through Friday bringing the potential for strong winds with low humidity. Temperatures will cool significantly Saturday and Sunday, however, breezy northerly winds will continue.

Fire continues to burn in areas burned by both the 1999 Kirk and 2008 Basin Fires, and further south in fuels burned only once by the 2008 Basin fire. Snags, skeleton brush and heavy downed fuel are abundant.

<u>BRANCH III, IV</u>					
Most of the local critical thresholds will be met again today. Winds will not be as strong today as they were yesterday. Where there is still higher concentrations of heat in the interior it is possible to see extreme fire behavior with rapid upslope runs and the buildup of a plume. Where the heat is isolated an occasional flare-up and short upslope run could occur. Spotting distances will be < 1/10 th mile.					
Tonight will be dry and remain fairly warm, especially in and above the thermal belt. Where there is concentrations of heat interior it will be possible to have extreme fire behavior with rapid upslope and downslope runs. Most of the areas where there is isolated heat expect creeping and smoldering with an isolated flare-up.					
AIR OPERATIONS

SAFETY					
Standard Firefighting Order # 2 is key today: Know what you fire is doing at all times. Although this fire has exhibited little activity in recent days, it is not out. Hot stump holes, creeping duff fire, and fire-weakened snags and trees remain. Remain alert for these and other potentially hazardous phenomena.

FIRE BEHAVIOR

Coastal Sage shrub fuel moisture, primarily chamise and button brush are running below seasonal averages. Abundant dead fuels remain from the 1999 Kirk and 2008 Basin fires. Many drainage bottoms did not burn during these previous fires and contain deep duff under timber and brush.

10-hour fuels yesterday 3% Coastal Ridge.

Probability of Ignition: 75-80%

SPECIFIC

Branch VII: Another hot dry day to test hot spots in Higgins Creek drainage. The fire has the potential to burn out an entire basin in just a couple of hours or less if positioned near the bottom. Spread will be up slope up drainage. Brush fuel type will exhibit flame lengths near 10 feet.

AIR OPERATIONS:

No known impacts to aviation.

SAFETY:

Your heads are in mop up and suppression rehab. Be prepared to shift to initial attack if new activity emerges. Talk about how you would configure and approach a spreading fire.

Don't take life too seriously. You'll never get out of it alive.

- Stay calm; we are not part of their race.
- Maintain a heightened level of awareness around blind corners.
- Watch out for park visitors that stop to take photos, and block the roadway.
- ***Slow down, slow down, and slow down!***

Hydration and Heat Stress

- Drink water before, during and after shifts
- Carry up to 6 quarts to drink while on the line.
- Drink three quarts of water for each quart of electrolyte replacement.
- Be alert for signs of heat stress in yourself and others.
- Monitor mental status after any stumbling episodes.
- Don't dilute liquid electrolyte replacement drinks with water.
- Take “cool down breaks” as possible.

HINTS AND GUIDELINES FOR EQUIPMENT MANAGEMENT

Officials responsible for **ordering and/or directing the use of the equipment are responsible** for ensuring the following tasks are completed on all equipment assigned to the incident.

Rental Equipment Use Record (Shift Ticket): These must be completed in proper increment (hours, miles, days, and off-shift) and turned in daily by the equipment supervisor/manager at the end of the shift. Ask contractor for a copy of their agreement to verify how their equipment is paid and if they don't have a copy then get with Equipment Time Unit in Finance at first opportunity. Sign your name **and print** your name and title. Indicate in the remarks where/what the assignment was for the day (ie. Initial attack, Division X, Staging)

- **Hourly rate** – nearest quarter hour.
- **Daily rate** – by calendar day except for first and last day. Post hours on shift daily.
- **Mileage rate** – nearest mile. Show hours on shift for person operating.

Management of the Equipment: If no longer needed place equipment off shift or identify as excess through your section chief so they can coordinate with plans and finance to ensure documents are closed out properly. Provide notice to the contractor in writing on a General Msg. Form and have contractor sign as acknowledging notification.

Document operator hours to monitor for Work/Rest compliance. DO NOT request/allow contractor to work a double shift without verifying with Finance to see if they were hired with 1 or 2 operators. If only 1 operator then there needs to be documentation on file to support a rate change to double shift approved by a section chief or above.

TIME UNDER HIRE: If a shift ticket hasn't been started prior to the equipment being assigned to you, begin the initial time from when equipment began travel to the incident. Equipment is under hire from time they began travel to incident and return to point of hire. Verify with ROSS.

Work time is when equipment is actually working, wheels are rolling or main engine is running and a responsible official has ordered the use of. Off shift is when no operator is available, equipment is broken down or is not required for an assignment.



EQUIPMENT HIRED BY THE HOUR with an operator is either on or off shift according to the agreement. For each calendar day equipment is under hire for at least 8 hrs the government will pay not less than the Minimum Daily Guarantee. If equipment is under hire for less than 8 hrs the amount earned for that day will be not less than ½ of the Minimum Daily Guarantee unless agreement specifies differently.

EQUIPMENT HIRED ON A DAILY RATE needs hours under hire recorded on the first and last day of an incident. Payment is made based upon full days or 50% of the daily rate for periods less than 8 hours, which apply only to the first and last day of an incident.



EQUIPMENT HIRED BY THE MILE needs hours under hire recorded on all days to determine the applicable minimum daily payment as well as the number of miles.

AD HIRES are to be tracked on a Crew Time Report for hours worked.

AD Casuals

If casual is assigned to a different position qualification during assignment (as documented on SF-261, CTR), adjust the pay rate to the appropriate rate for that position. Note on Casual Hire Form and OF-288.

Meal Periods (Actual Hours Worked Employees)

Compensable meal periods are the exception, not the rule (5 CFR 551.411 (c) 36 and 29 CFR 785.19 (a))

Personnel assigned to the fireline may be compensated for their meal period if all of the following conditions are met:

- The fire is not controlled, **and**
- The Operations Section Chief makes a decision that it is critical to the effort of controlling the fire that personnel remain at their post of duty and continue to work as they eat, **and**
- The compensable meal break is approved by the supervisor at the next level and it is documented in remarks on the CTR, SF-261.

In those situations where all other incident support personnel cannot be relieved from performing work and must remain at a post of duty, a meal period may be recorded as time worked for which compensation shall be allowed and documented in remarks block on the CTR, SF-261.

For personnel in support positions, and fireline personnel after control of the fire, a meal period of at least 30 minutes must be ordered and taken for each work shift (e.g., a minimum 30 minute break for shifts of 8 hours or more). All meal periods unless justified in remarks must be shown as a 30 minute break.

Local Government responding under CFAA follow their department policy and guidelines regarding hours and meal breaks.

On-Shift Time

On-shift time includes a combination of actual work, ordered standby, and compensable travel. On-shift time has a specific start and ending time and is recorded as clock hours. Each resource is responsible for ensuring they are meeting their 2/1 Work Rest Ratio and/or getting approval in advance from their supervisor and completing a Work Rest/Mitigation form to be approved by IC.

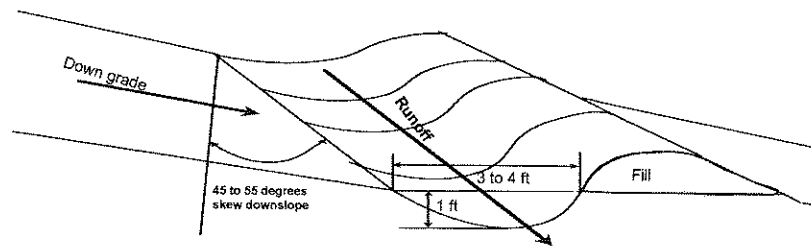
Waterbaring:

6 D's of Waterbars!

- ❖ **DISTANCE:** Depending on slope and erosion potential (how much soil a hard rain will carry) the spacing **BETWEEN** the waterbars.

Gradient	Moderate Erosion Hazard Spacing (feet)	High Erosion Hazard Spacing (feet)
1% - 10%	200	150
11% - 25%	150	100
26% - 50%	100	75
>50%	75	50

- ❖ **DIAGONAL:** Dig waterbars at a 45° to 55° to help prevent them from acting as check dams and filling with sediment.
- ❖ **DIRECTION:** Direct them into the **GREEN** if possible, but make sure to follow the natural flow the water will take.
- ❖ **DIVERT:** Move the water **OFF** the fire line so that it does not erode the land.
- ❖ **DISCHARGE:** Make sure there is an **OPENING** at the end of the waterbar.
- ❖ **DISSIPATE:** Drain the water into something that will **BREAK UP ENERGY** flow such as rocks or brush or place debris to prevent erosion off of the fireline.
- ❖ **DURABLE:** Dig the trench deep enough that it will **LAST** at least until the line is revegetated (years not weeks).

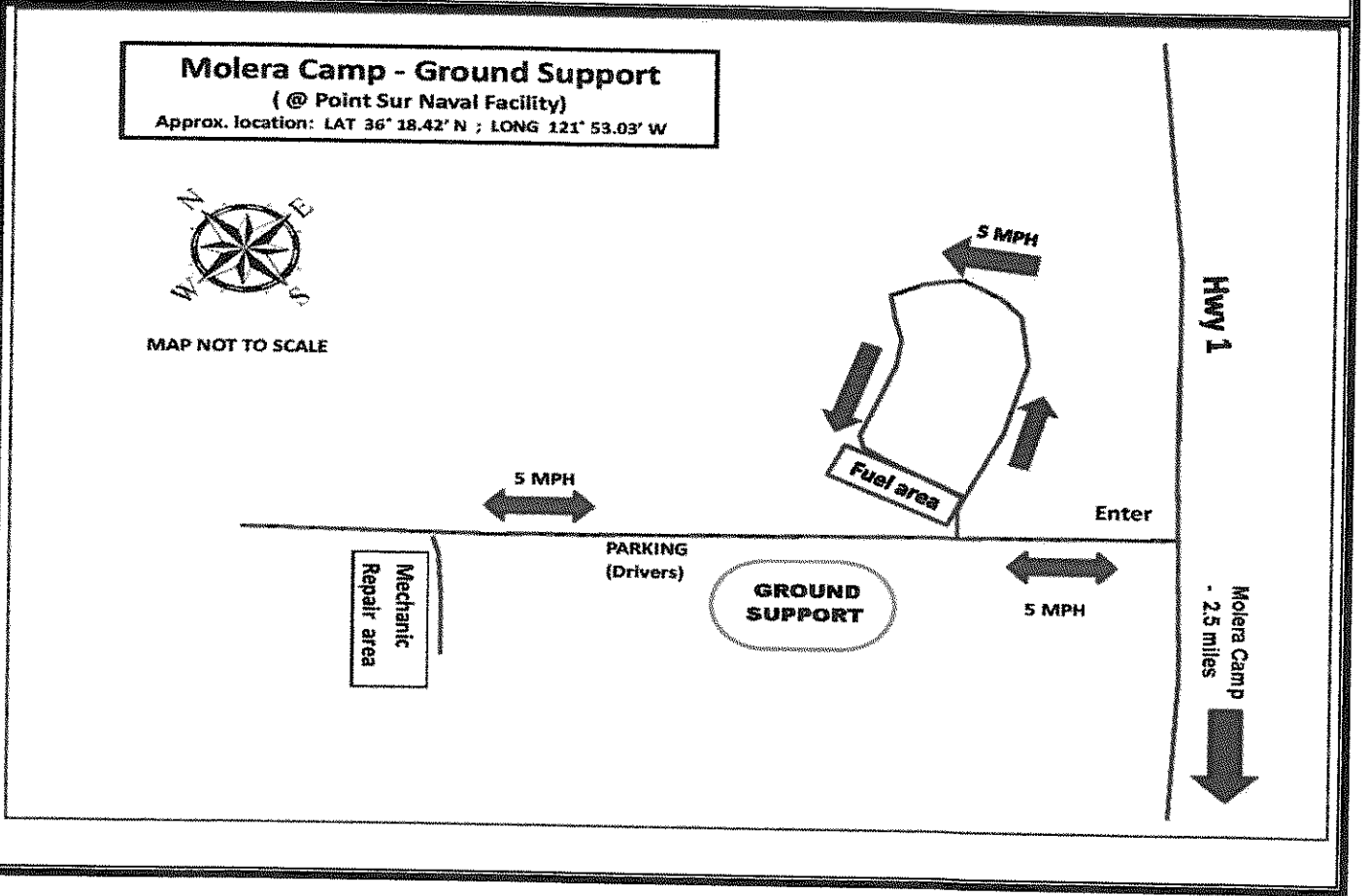
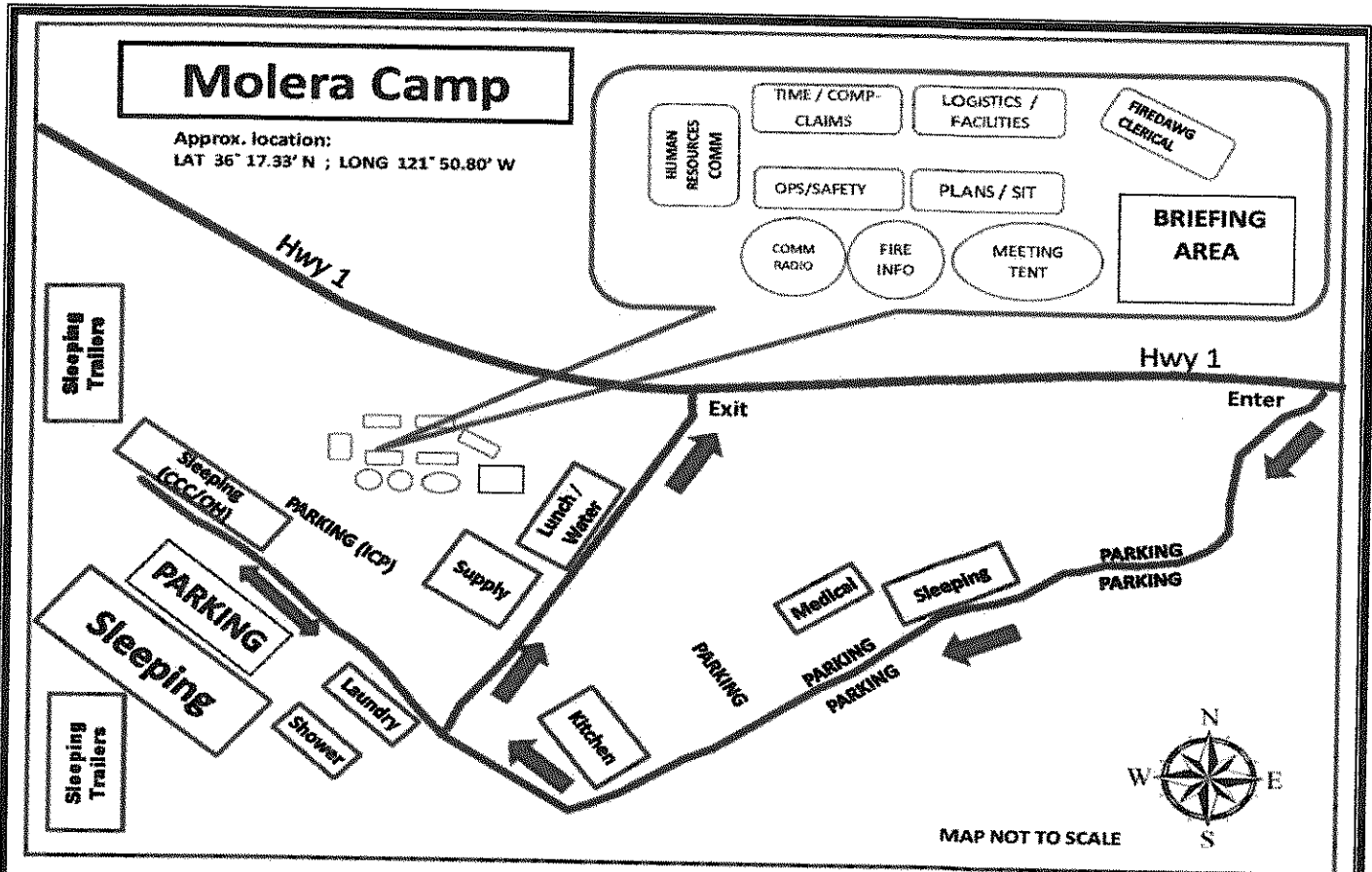




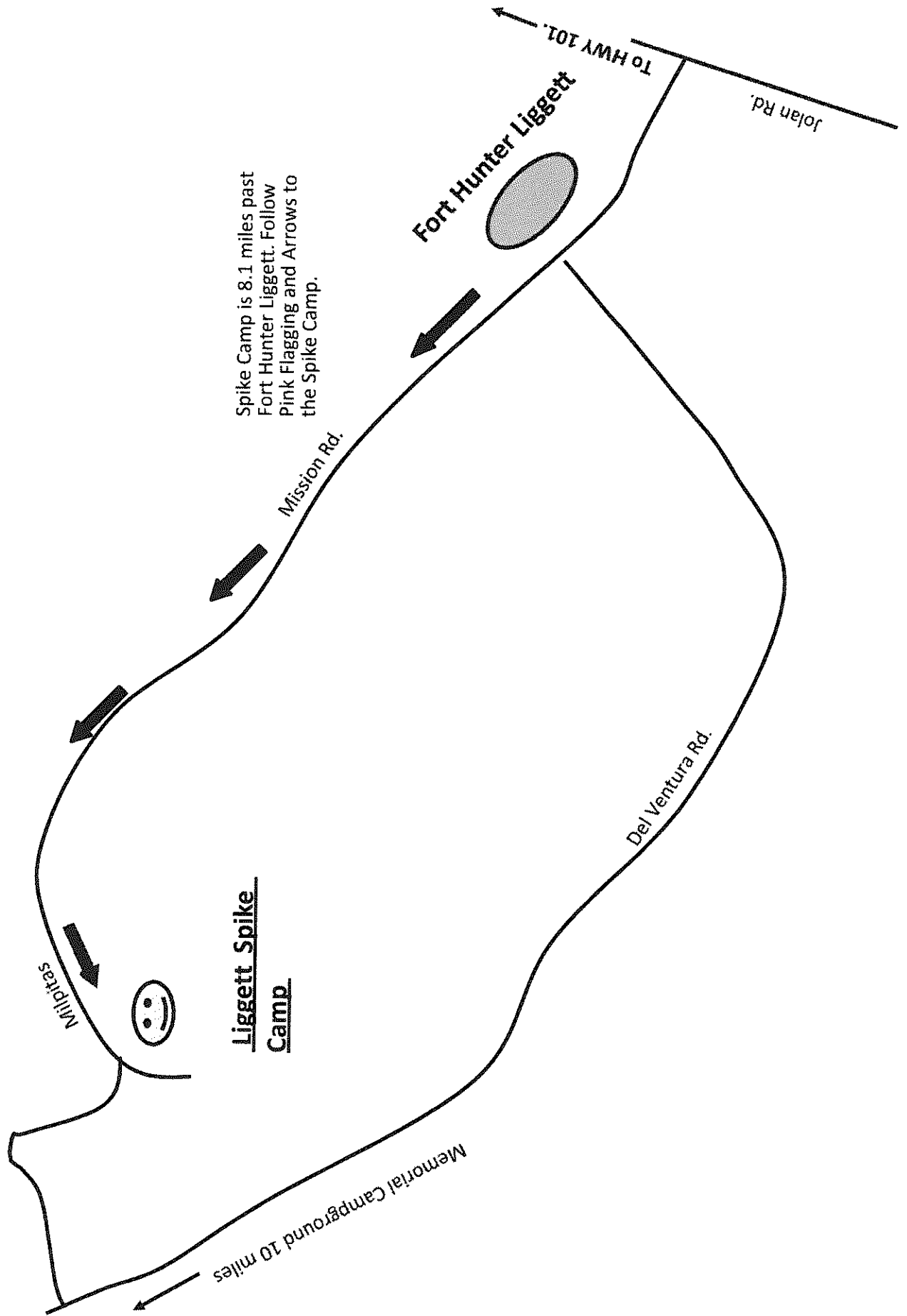
MAIN STREET
NOT TO SCALE



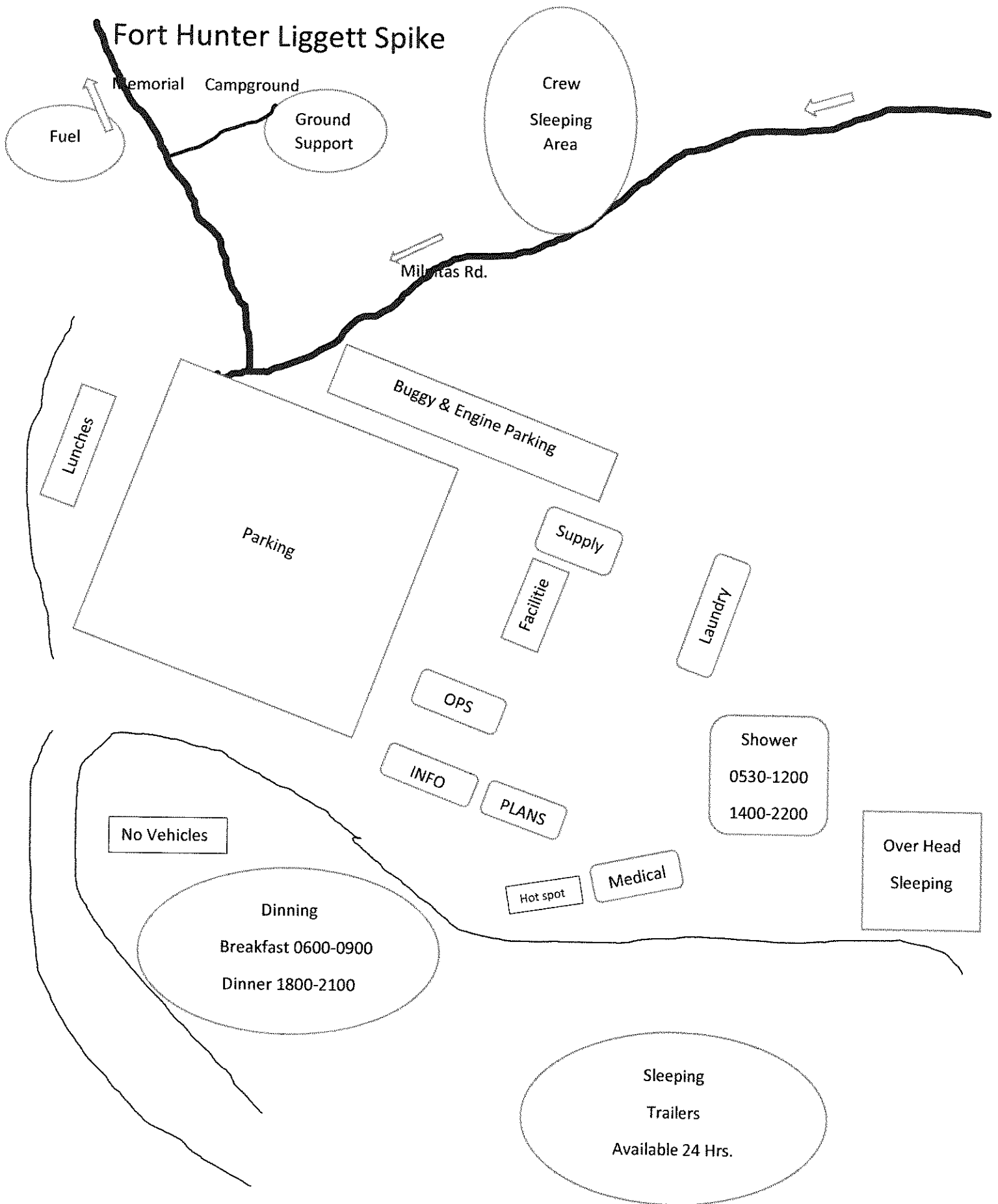
TORO PARK ICP MAP



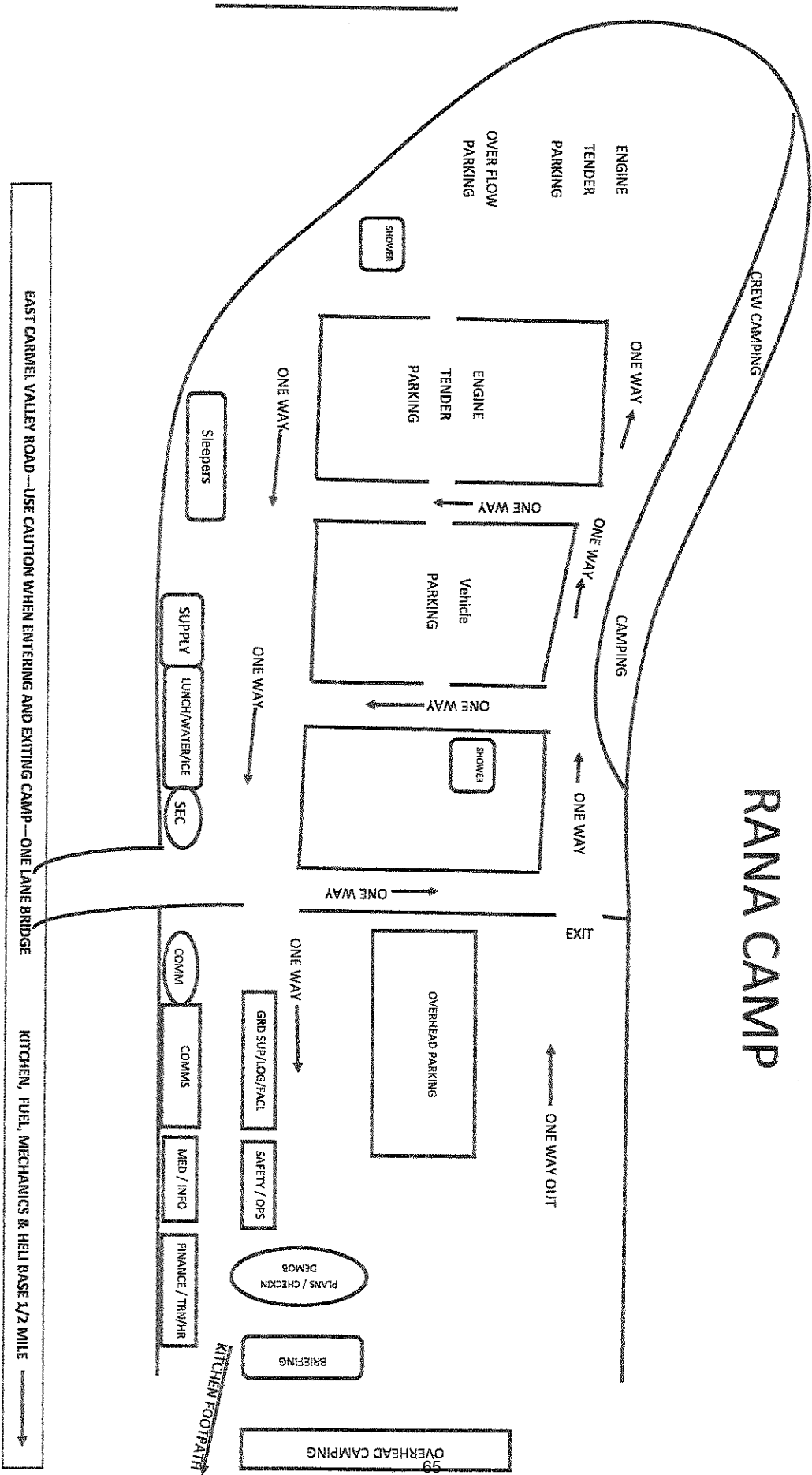
Liggett Spike Camp Directional Map
