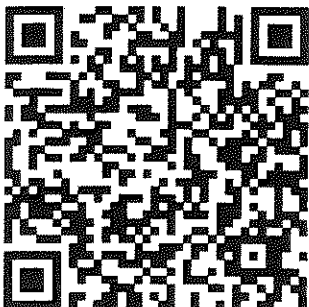



General Control Objectives for the Incident (include alternatives) Management Objectives <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Provide for the safety of all responders and the public by utilizing national Risk Management Standards and the implementation of appropriate mitigations. • Reduce firefighter exposure by only engaging fire assignments with the highest probability of success. • Engage cooperators and stakeholders to jointly provide for the defense of communities, infrastructure and economic interests. • Utilize local resource specialists to identify and protect sensitive sites and cultural resource values by minimizing impacts from suppression operations. • Maintain and enhance community, County, State, National Forest and stakeholder relationships through accurate and timely dissemination of information. • Assess and implement suppression repair needs, where appropriate in coordination with the Resource Advisor following agency policy. • Manage incident costs effectively for the values at risk through regular and ongoing cost analysis. Control Objectives Keep Fire <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • East of the Coast Ridge Road. • North of Nacimiento-Fergusson Road. • West of Carmel Valley and Reliz Canyon. • South of current containment lines in Branches II and III. 			
6. Weather Forecast for Operational Period <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Temperatures will cool slightly today as the marine layer begins to deepen but it will still be rather warm over much of the fire area. Relative humidity will continue to be low, falling into the mid teens to upper single digits in the afternoon. Strong thermal belts will form again overnight at mid-slope and higher. Light SE winds will turn SW and increase in the afternoon.

Weather Discussion: Onshore flow will gradually deepen the marine layer along the coast today as the upper level ridge begins to weaken and shift east. For the fire area, the impacts of the deepening marine layer will be minimal today with temperatures cooling slightly but conditions still remaining warm and dry. Winds along the coast and on ridges will begin the day relatively light and out of the south to southeast then shift to the southwest late morning and increase through the afternoon. Ridge winds will turn northwesterly by late afternoon or early evening. In lower, more protected drainages terrain driven slope and valley circulations will dominate.

WEATHER FORECAST for Tonight: Mostly clear with some low stratus along the coast with the marine layer around 1000 ft. Minimum temperatures 55 to 60 except around 70 along ridges. RHs increasing to 30 to 45% at lower elevations...highest in west side valleys, but remaining or falling back to around 15% from mid-slope to ridges overnight. West wind 10 to 15 mph along ridges in the evening shifting SE 5 to 7 mph overnight. Terrain driven down-slope/down-valley winds 4 – 8 mph lower down.

EXTENDED FORECAST for Thursday through Tuesday: The marine layer will gradually deepen as an upper trough approaches from the northwest gradually cooling temperatures. Increasing humidities will begin influencing the lowest elevations of the fire area Thursday night, although relative humidities mid slope and higher will remain drier in the 15 to 20% range. Winds will become more consistently west to southwest Thursday then turn northwesterly and increase in strength as a dry cold front pushes across the area late in the day Friday. Breezy northwest winds with cooler temperatures and higher relative humidities are expected to continue through this weekend as a series of upper level troughs swing through the Pacific Northwest. Conditions will begin to gradually warm again around Tuesday as an upper level ridge begins building over the Pacific to west of California.

Coastal Sage Scrub fuel, primarily chamise and button brush, have seasonally low live fuel moisture for this time of year. Fire continues to burn in areas burned by both the 1999 Kirk and 2008 Basin Fires, and further south in fuels burned only once by the 2008 Basin fire. Snags, skeleton brush and heavy downed fuel are abundant.

Probability of ignition: Day: **Shaded 60%** **Unshaded 90%**
Night: **60%**

BRANCH III, IV

Slightly cooler, but still very dry conditions today. Expect to get smokes popping up from isolated heat within the fire perimeter. The potential is still there for large fire growth, but the probability is low due to minimal active fire perimeter.

West Operational area may have some creeping and smoldering within Higgins Creek area where there is still heat.

East Operational area will continue to have smoke pop up where there is heat. Expect creeping and smoldering where there is still scattered heat. Within the Church Ranch area there will be active fire behavior within the fire perimeter between Pine Valley and Tasajara Drainage where the fire continues to burn. There will likely be upslope rapid runs. It is possible for plumes to develop, but they will be short lived. Spotting distances in this area >1/10th mile.

- A driver shall only drive if they have had 8 consecutive hours off duty before beginning shift.
- If you are tired, stop and take a short break.
- A passenger should remain awake during the hours of darkness to increase the safety factor.
- Before departing, take a minute to ensure the windshield is clean and that the floor of the vehicle is free of possible rolling materials.

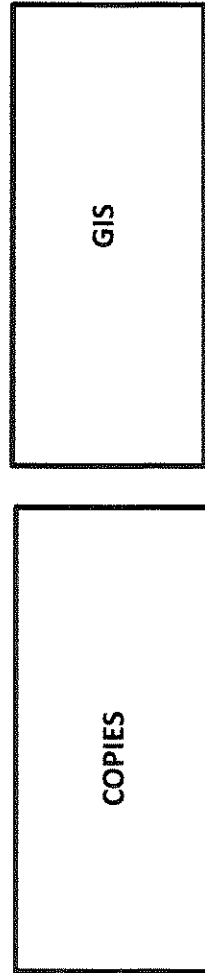
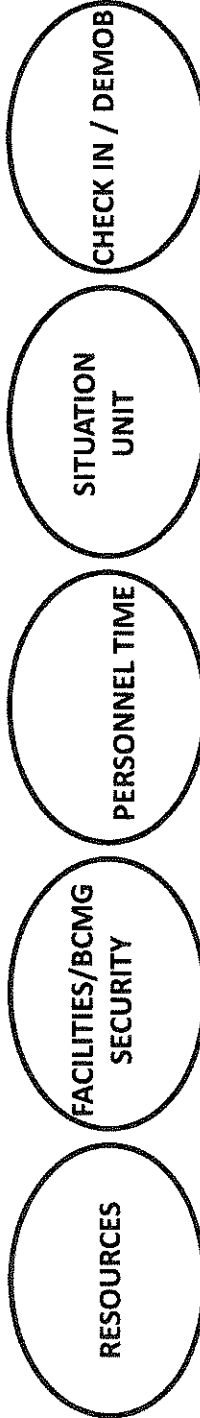
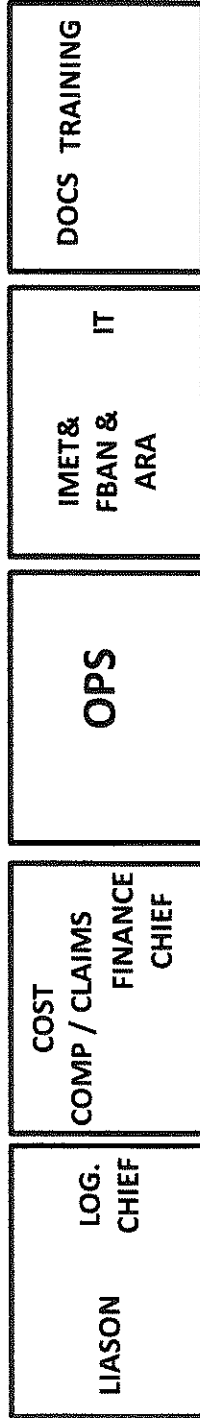
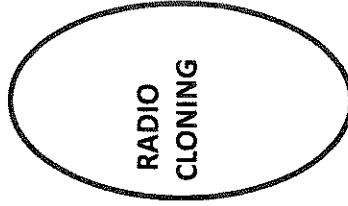


TORO PARK ICP MAP
