


FORECAST ISSUED: 2000 9/28/16

Weather Discussion: Upper level southwesterly flow ahead of an approaching trough will continue to gradually deepen the marine layer along the coast. Relative humidities in coastal valleys and those with lower elevation connections to the coast such as the Arroyo Seco area will be higher this morning due to the intrusion of marine air further inland. Much of the fire area however will remain above the marine layer for another warm and dry day. Ridge level winds will begin the day out of the southwest and turn northwesterly in the afternoon. These northwest winds will mix down into NW to SE running drainages such as Pine Valley and Miller Canyon in the afternoon enhancing up-valley winds.

WEATHER FORECAST for Tonight: Mostly clear. Marine layer to around 2000 ft. Low stratus pushing inland along the coast and extending into the Carmel Valley to just below Ranch Helibase by morning. Lows in the upper 40s to lower 50s coastal valleys and 55 to 60 elsewhere...except around 70 in the thermal belt near 3000 ft. RHs increasing to 45 to 50% at lower elevations, but remaining or falling back to 15 to 20% from mid-slope and higher overnight. Along ridges...NW wind 10 to 15 mph with gusts to 20-25 mph in the evening becoming SW 8 to 11 mph overnight. Elsewhere...terrain driven down-slope/down-valley winds 4 to 8 mph.

OUTLOOK for Friday: A dry cold front approaching the area will bring W to SW winds 10 to 15 mph in the morning increasing to 15 to 20 mph midday. Winds will become NW 20 to 30 mph in the late afternoon and continue in that range through the night but become more northerly in direction. Highs in the upper 70s ridges to mid-80s valleys. Minimum RHs 20 to 25%. Lows mid 40s to lower 50s with nighttime recoveries 70 to 80%.

EXTENDED FORECAST for Saturday through Tuesday: The cooling trend will continue Saturday through Monday with high temperatures in the mid to upper 60s along ridges and mid to upper 70s in valleys. Relative humidity recoveries will be good to excellent each night with marine clouds hanging over ridges at times. Breezy N to NW winds 15 to 25 mph will continue Saturday. An upper trough swinging through northern California will bring a stronger push of NW winds Sunday and Sunday night in the 25 to 35 mph range. A gradual warming trend will begin Tuesday and Wednesday as an upper level ridge begins building over the Pacific pushes west towards California.

ALL DIVISIONS

Expect to get smokes from isolated heat within the fire perimeter. Surface fuels remain extremely dry due to drought conditions. Areas that appeared to be dormant for several weeks, are now starting to show themselves. The potential is still there for large fire growth, but the probability is low due to minimal active fire perimeter.

West Operational area may have some creeping and smoldering heat.

East Operational area will continue to have smoke pop up where there is heat. Expect creeping and smoldering where there is still scattered heat. Within the Church Ranch area there will be active fire behavior within the fire perimeter between Pine Valley and Tasajara Drainage where the fire continues to burn. There will likely be upslope rapid runs. It is possible for plumes to develop, but they will be short lived. Spotting distances in this area >1/10th mile.

AIR OPERATIONS

VFR conditions may be present throughout the operational period.

SAFETY

Be aware of secondary fire effects i.e. soft road shoulders, snags, landslides and re-burn potential

Situational Awareness:

Start the day with a briefing and re-brief during the day as the job changes. Use all the assessment guides to develop and maintain Situational Awareness. Constantly re-evaluate your situation throughout the day. Use the time tested process of “Looking Up, Down, and All Around”, and the other assessment materials from the Incident Response Pocket Guide.

WATCH-OUTS

- **Transition** – The transition between Incident Management Teams is often called the 19 th Watch Out Situation. Take extra time to ensure that everyone fully understands the plan and is able to implement it seamlessly.
- **Communications** – With the changes in the work areas, ensure that communications exist. Will a human repeater be necessary? Are you cloned to the right group you are working in?
- **Vehicle Driving** - Roads are steep and narrow with many blind corners. Drive slowly, defensively, with your lights on, and stay on your side of the road! **WATCH OUT** for commercial, private, and other vehicles that commonly drive faster than we do.
- **Wildlife/Hunters** – Hunting season is here. Even though the Forest is closed, they still might be out there. Deer are very common on the incident, especially during the dawn and dusk hours. When you see one deer, expect others to follow.
- **Medical Plan** - Know where assigned medical personnel are located. Know in advance the request process in the Medical Plan. Ensure positive communications with the ICP.
- **Danger/Hazard Trees** - Continue to evaluate the areas around and under all trees. Use the IRPG guidelines on page 22. Minimize the exposure, and exposure time.

Fight Complacency

- One common reason for firefighter injury in the latter stages of a fire is when the firefighter throws her/his mind into neutral and doesn't think about the work they are doing. They are not thinking about how to do the job right, but just how to get the job done so they can just get home. Couple this with fatigue, and you really have a “**WATCHOUT.**”
- There's a difference in between **just** getting the job done, versus getting the job done when **MENTALLY ENGAGED.**

So with that, keep your mind engaged and attentive to the task. Continually ask yourself if you are doing the job safely, the way you were trained. Keep an eye on your co-workers too. If you see them doing something that is unsafe, **YOU NEED TO SAY SOMETHING** immediately about the unsafe act.

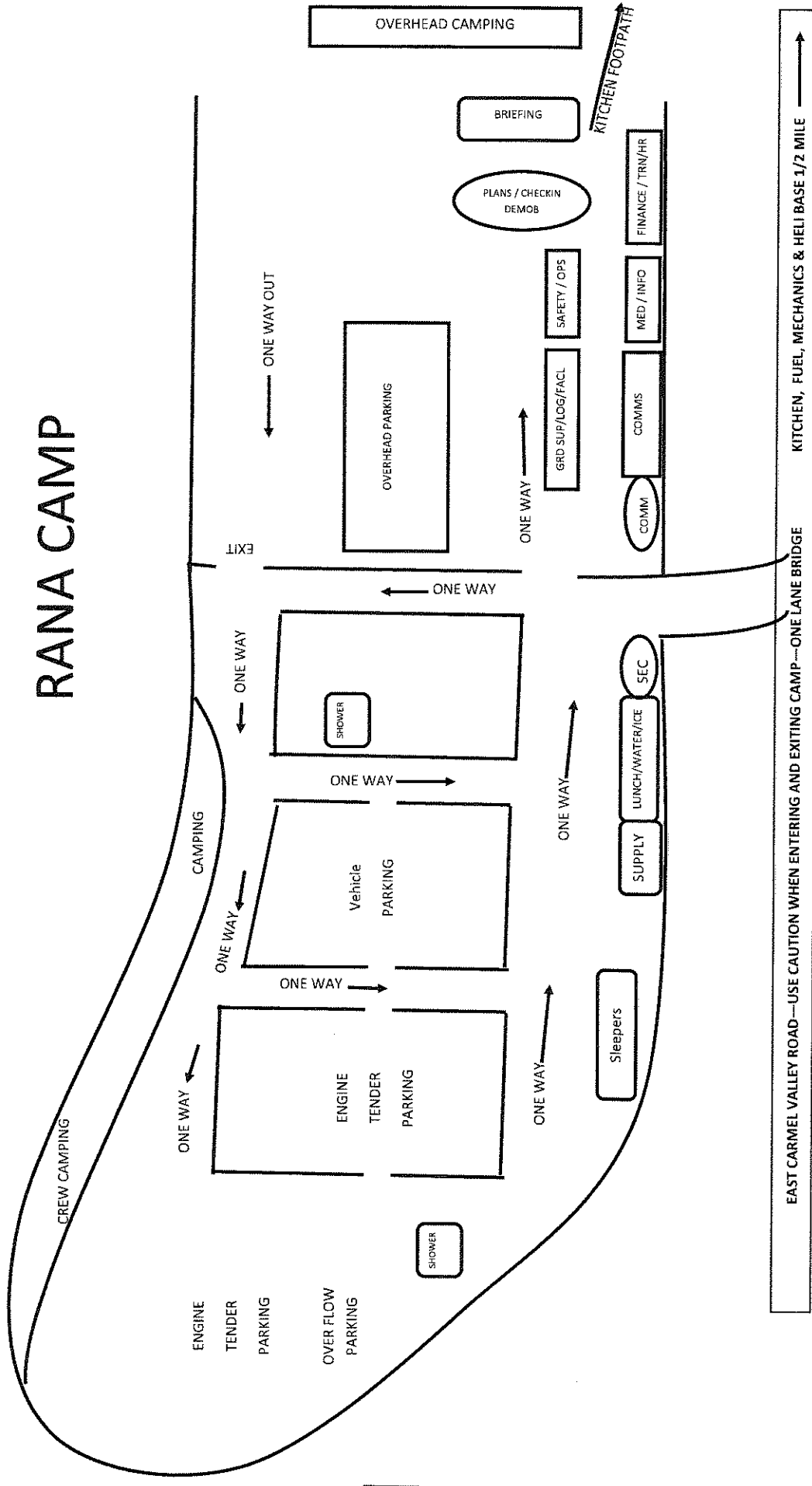
