Carbon Monoxide Poisoning

Carbon Monoxide (CO) is an odorless, tasteless, and invisible gas. Elevated CO levels can be associated with operational tasks such as: direct line construction, holding operations and during mop-up. This increases as crews are exposed during these tasks for long periods or consecutive work periods.

Elevated CO levels may also be found in areas with high smoke concentration or areas recently burned. These areas include:

- Near the active flame front and smoldering fuels.
- Areas of heavy smoke concentrations due to inversions or downwind of the fire and/or topography (saddles, basins, ravines, etc).
- Extended work periods around motorized equipment.
- Working in enclosed areas with motorized equipment.

Moderate	Possible headache, nausea, and increasing fatigue.	Increasing impairment of alertness, vision discrimination, judgement of time, physical coordination, and/or becoming increasingly complacent.
High	Headache, fatigue, drowsiness, nausea, vomiting, dizziness, convulsions, cardiorespiratory difficulty.	Above behavior becomes more acute to extreme.

If workers are showing signs and/or symptoms of CO poisoning as listed above, move them away from the area and to an area with "fresh air". Personnel who display the symptoms or behaviors listed above should be evaluated and determined fit for duty before their next work assignment/period.

To prevent exposure to high concentrations of CO:

- When possible, select strategy and tactics that minimize worker exposure to smoke concentrations (indirect attack).
- Rotate workers from areas with elevated smoke levels to areas of less smoke and/or cleaner air.
- Instruct personnel to take their breaks in areas of less smoke and/or cleaner air if possible.
- Continually monitor personnel for the signs and/or symptoms listed above.

When this happens it reflects poorly on all that are attached to this incident. Posting an inappropriate video, photo or blog comment could have unwanted effects. It may be unsafe to shoot photos or video and a firefighter who is concentrating on a camera can't be looking up, down and all around.

"Detwiler" CAMMU 014474 Incident Fireline Suppression Repair Plan

I. Objectives

The objective of the Suppression Repair Plan is to mitigate possible adverse effects to resources resulting from fire suppression activities on the Detwiler Fire, in a manner which does not compromise firefighter safety. The mitigations described within this plan have been developed to apply to constructed fire lines, watercourse crossings, access roads, drop points, heli-spots and any other locations disturbed by fire suppression activities. A Repair Specialist will be assigned to ensure that work is done as required and according to the Emergency Fire Suppression Repair Plan. Additional specialists or equipment may be used if the need arises. Specialists will release equipment from the area when their work is completed.

II. General Repair Guidelines

A. Helispots/Staging Areas/Safety Zones

- 1) Re-contour to the original slope as requested by the Repair Specialist.
- 2) Remove soil, and/or breach berms so that runoff can be dissipated. Cross drain these areas to effectively dissipate water runoff.
- 3) Place disturbed vegetation, brush and trees, piled during line construction, on the surface of safety zones and open areas. This may be done with equipment or hand crews.

B. Roads

- 1) Repair roads to pre-fire condition as requested by the Repair Specialist.
- 2) Re-establish existing berms where applicable.
- 3) Breach berms to facilitate drainage, where applicable.
- 4) Clean culverts plugged with soil and rock resulting from fire road use.
- 5) Remove all slash and debris from culvert inlets/outlets.
- 6) Blading or grading of roads may be necessary. Grading shall be done after all suppression repair work is completed for areas accessed by the roads being graded.
- 7) Where vegetative material was cut and deposited adjacent to permanent roads it shall be lopped and scattered to a depth within 30" of the soil surface.

C. Firelines; Hand and Dozer

Install waterbars as described in the guidelines below. Waterbars are designed to intercept, slow and spread the precipitation run-off in order to reduce sediment transport and soil erosion. The idea is to move water off the fireline before it can build up enough energy to erode and transport sediment. Re-establish waterbars and rolling dips using pre-fire locations. Flatten berms along fire lines to match natural contours. Utilize cut vegetation for erosion control on steep dozer and hand lines.

Waterbar Guidelines:

1) Spacing: These spacing distances should be used as a guide. Judgment should be used in locating waterbars to minimize erosion potential. It may not be possible or necessary to place waterbars in steep or rocky areas. Install water-bars at the following recommended *minimum* intervals:

Fire line Gradient (% slope)	Minimum Distance Between Water-Bars (feet)				
0 to 10	200				
11 to 25	100				
25+	50				

- 2) Location: Locate waterbars at natural slope breaks or to take advantage of natural features when possible. Direct water to unburned areas, and/or resistant surfaces with high vegetation cover when possible. Waterbars should extend beyond the width of the trail and discharge into undisturbed areas, rocky ground, or filter areas well protected with slash and vegetative cover.
- 3) Depth and Width: Waterbars need to be cut into the ground surface; do not simply push up soil. On dozer constructed line waterbar depths should be at least 6 inches; total height from bottom of ditch to

top of waterbar should average at least 12 inches and not exceed 24 inches. On hand constructed line waterbar depths should be at least 4 inches; total height from bottom of ditch to top of water-bar should average at least 8 inches and not exceed 18 inches. The width of the waterbar channel should be enough to handle expected water flows and to avoid plugging when a normal amount of sloughing occurs.

4) Angle: Determine the average gradient in percent slope of the fire line being waterbarred. Add 5 to the average gradient. This approximates the angle in degrees for the water bar. Do not install water bars at an angle steeper than 45 degrees as this will increase water velocity rather than slow it down.

D. Watercourses

- 1) Watercourse crossings shall be dipped to original configuration. Waterbreaks shall be installed on each side of channel to divert flow off of trails prior to entering watercourse channel.
- 2) Remove all soil and debris that was placed in any stream channel. A Repair Specialist will review the site for acceptability. If all foreign material cannot be removed with heavy equipment, the material shall be removed by hand. The approaches to the crossing shall be sloped back to prevent future stream bank failure.

E. Archaeological or Historic Sites (if discovered)

- 1) All sites and potential sites shall be flagged and avoided.
- 2) Impacted sites will be reported to the Suppression Repair Specialist as soon as possible.
- 3) If sites are encroached upon, work will stop immediately and the Division/Group Supervisor or Suppression Repair Specialist will be notified.

F. Other Repair Concerns

- 1) Remove all trash from fire lines and other affected areas.
- Repair, broken, damaged fences, and/or gates damaged as the result of the fire control operations will be repaired. (Note: Extent and condition of damage should be documented prior to repairs.)
- 3) Grade and water roads, as needed, that were used during fire control operations. Roads should be outsloped with rolling dips where degradation of the road prism has resulted from fire control operations.

CULTURAL MESSAGE

On this Fire, there are a significant amount of both prehistoric archeological sites and historical sites. The prehistoric sites could range from small rock outcrops with seed processing mortars or slicks to large seasonal camps. These could include more features like bedrock milling locations, midden soil (dark black colored soil), lithic scatters, and other surface artifacts.

There are a variety of historic sites as well. The most common are mining sites, historic camps, and railroad grades (mostly down near the Merced River). There could be metal can dumps, cement pads, mining equipment, glass, ceramics, and other debris.

Be Careful if you encounter a former Mine in the Field

They pose environmental as well as physical dangers!

There could be only partially covered open vertical shafts. Be careful working in these areas. There also could be chemical residues that could be harmful. Stay away if possible.

If you find any prehistoric or historic site, contact Herb Dallas at (951) 840-0004. Take a GPS point if possible or mark its location on a map. Report any mining hazards to the Situational Unit Leader. Flag the location in the field as well, if you feel it poses a danger to other field personnel. Take a GPS point.






