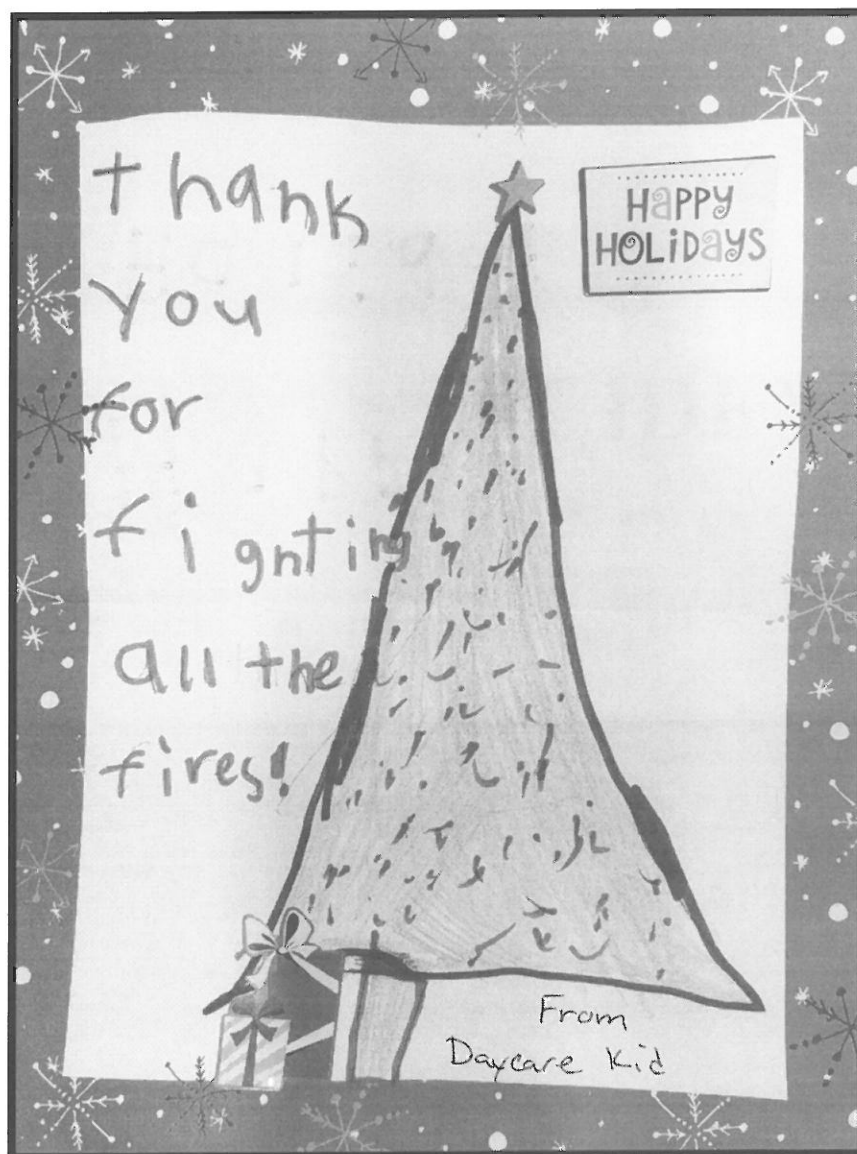





GENERAL CONTROL OBJECTIVES</b>  <b>Management Objectives</b> -Provide for and maintain public and first responder safety by utilizing the incident safety analysis process. -Protect critical assets at risk to include the agricultural industry, historical assets within the affected area, infrastructure and improvements, watersheds, and transmission lines. -Utilize tactics that consider protection of sensitive natural and cultural resources in the affected wilderness areas, the Sespe Wild and Scenic River, and the Sespe Condor Sanctuary. - Ensure transparent, timely, and accurate communication at all levels of the incident. -Be financially responsible for all assigned management and fire suppression tactics. - Foster and enhance community and political relationships. -All management actions and efforts will be focused on serving, safeguarding, and protecting the citizens and natural resources within Ventura County, Santa Barbara County, and Los Padres National Forest.  <b>Control Objectives</b> -Hold fire within the current southern perimeter to protect life and property values in the wildland-urban interface. -Keep the fire south of the Mount Pinos Ranger District boundary to minimize impacts to the Sespe watershed, Sespe Wild and Scenic River, and the Sespe Wilderness. -Keep the fire east of Gibraltar Road and north and east of 5N16 Road to minimize exposure and duration of incident. -Hold fire within the current eastern perimeter to minimize impact to the condor sanctuary, oil fields, and wilderness.

The persistent high pressure ridge over the Pacific will remain in place for the next few days with continued warm and dry conditions across Southern California. High temperatures are expected to be roughly 10 degrees above normal...and overnight RH recovery is expected to be poor at best. Weak surface pressure gradients will once again translate into light winds along the ridges and upper slopes changing through the day from north northeast in the morning to southwest in the afternoon and back to north overnight. Light onshore winds are expected along the coast and lower elevations.

The extremely dry air mass and warm temperatures expected over California will maintain elevated fire threat conditions through the week. Rainfall is not expected through the end of the year.

### WEATHER FORECAST:

**WEATHER:** Mostly Clear/some high clouds.  
**TEMPERATURES:** Max: 63-70 except 58-65 ridges/upper slopes.  
Min: 44-50 coast, 33-38 ridges isolated lower 30s in sheltered areas.  
**HUMIDITY:** Min: 5-10% except 20-25% lower slopes/valleys.  
Max: 20-25% ridges/upper slopes with 50-55% near the coast/valleys.

### OUTPUTS

#### FIRE BEHAVIOR

##### GENERAL:

Fuels in the fire area remain critically dry. With the short days and lack of significant wind, minimal to no forward fire progression is expected. With four days of poor RH recovery, expect to see more visible smoke within the fire perimeter. The fire will be most active after about 1300hrs until sundown. Cloud shading will diminish fire behavior.

Areas with the most potential for fire spread are those areas with continuous one hour (grass/needle cast) fuels. Identify these areas in your assigned work location.

If any spotting occurs it will be short range or from rollout. Pig 70%

##### SPECIFIC:

###### Ventura Zone/Branch II

No forward fire spread is expected. Heat remains in Bear Haven and expect to see some smoke in this area. Heat also remains in the Cherry Creek and Tule Creek drainages, expect active interior burning. With the incomplete consumption of fuels from the previous burning near Hartman Ranch there is a potential for reburn but it is low. Pockets of timber will continue to hold fire and some torching should be expected.

###### Santa Barbara Zone/Branch X

No forward fire progression is expected in the Santa Barbara Zone. Expect to see some interior pockets of smoke but the fire will not challenge containment.

No significant fire activity expected tonight in the absence of wind.

**AIR OPERATIONS:** Clear Skies and minimal winds, VFR conditions







## Summary of Suppression Damage Repair Guidelines

**Objectives** - The objective of the fire suppression repair is:

- Reduce the potential for soil erosion and sedimentation
- Reduce the visual impacts of fire line as well other suppression activities when feasible
- Repair roads and drainage structures to a functioning condition
- Protect natural and cultural resources from additional potential damage

### Critical Guidelines

**Sensitive Sites** are marked with Orange and White “Special Treatment Zone” flagging.

**Back-haul** all trash and un-needed flagging. Please leave safety flagging in place.

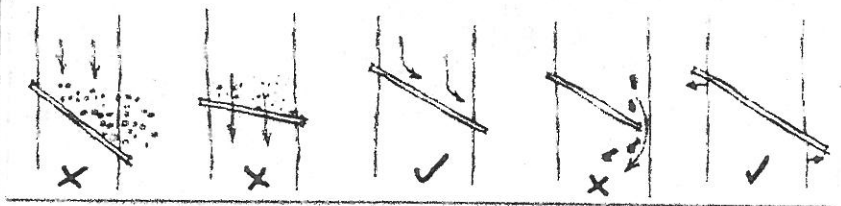
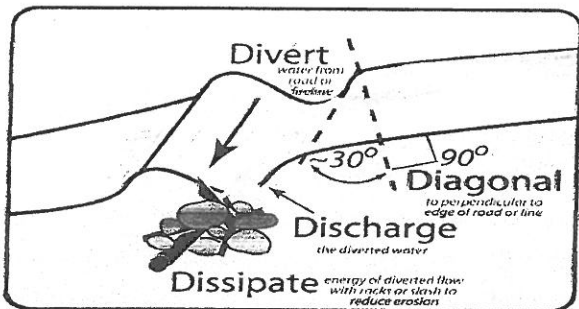
**On Firelines, waterbars** should be installed as described below, fire line covered with slash, and entrances blocked.

#### Line

Fire line Gradient (% slope)	Distance Between Waterbars (A) (feet)	<b>Think 5-D System</b>	
0-10	None	Distance	Reduce the distance water can run in a straight line
10 to 15	150	Diagonal	Don't bully the flow, lead it away
15 to 30	100	Divert	Move the water off the fireline
30 to 40	50	Discharge	Good water bar is not a dam – must have open outlet.
Over 40	25	Dissipate	Water should spread out from outlet like a shower not a fire hose.

- These are guidelines and are not intended to restrict the implementation of more or less water bars if the need or lack of need is justified.
- Firefighter safety should be taken into account; if slopes are too steep for safe implementation then waterbars should not be constructed, if sensitive resources are not present.

**DEPTH AND WIDTH:** Waterbars need to be cut into surface, do not simply push up soil. They should be deep enough to redirect the water from expected rain to area.



**Safety Zone, and Staging Areas:** These fire suppression activity areas should be repaired to standards similar to fire line repair. Waterbars place where appropriate. Use cleared vegetative material, and slash for soil cover

**Watercourses:** Work with READs to determine appropriate repair needs. Remove deposited soil from streams, watercourses, swales, or draws back to the original contour. Remove only as much as feasible without further damage to the watercourse. Restore bank channels at fire line crossings back to the shape seen adjacent to the crossing. Pull perched soil from drainage edges and spread it evenly across the fire line.

**Water Drafting Sites:** Water sources developed as a water draft site are to be restored to a condition resembling pre fire use. Remove any dams, dikes, or other impoundments that were created for fire suppression activities.

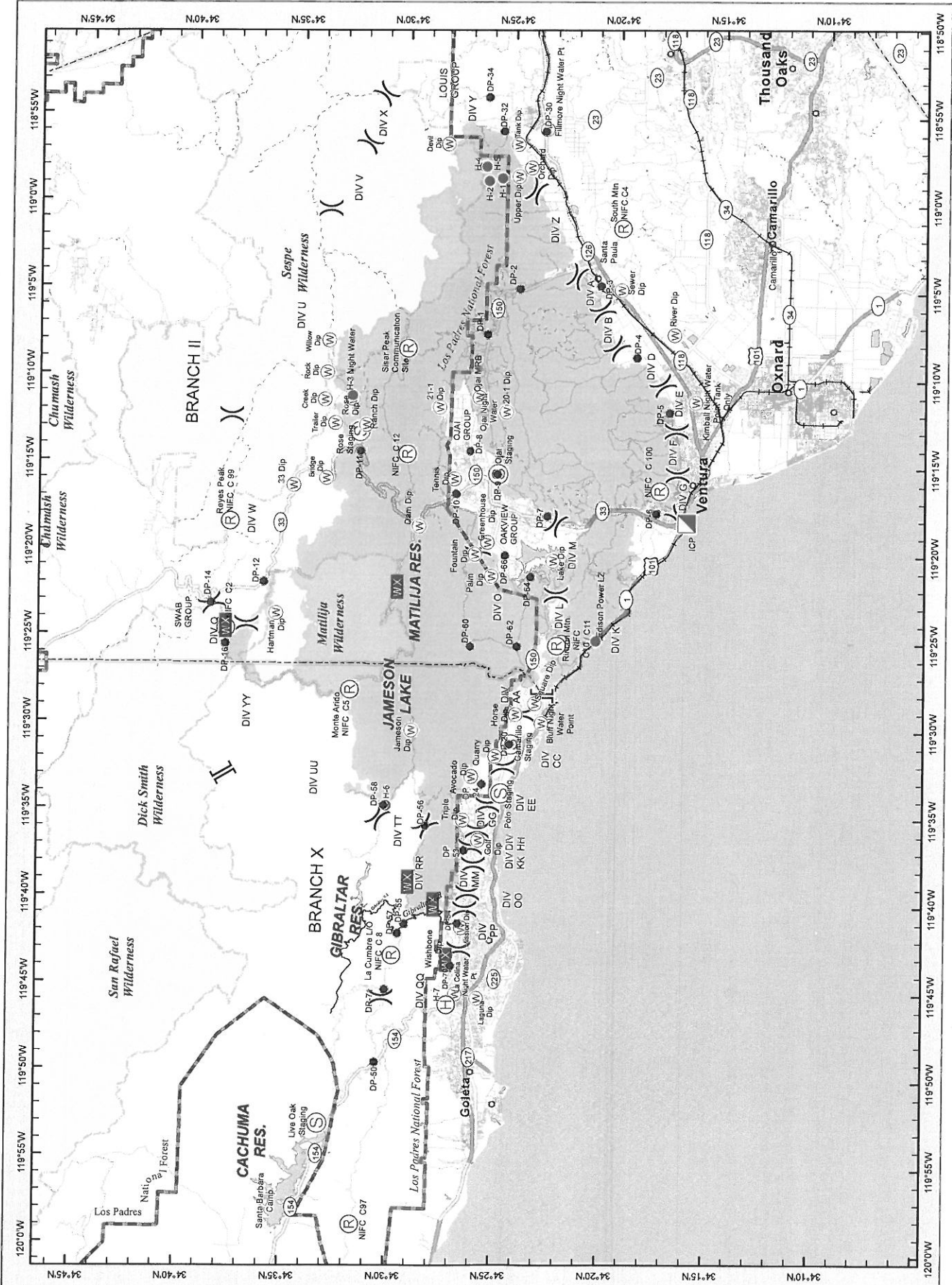
