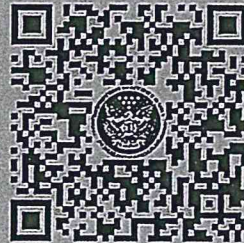



.DISCUSSION...Hot weather will continue through Tuesday as high pressure continues over the area. Temperatures will be a few degrees cooler on Wednesday followed by more cooling on Thursday as high pressure weakens. Marine layer will remain very shallow through Tuesday night resulting in poor overnight RH recoveries. Seabreeze winds are expected to remain light through Tuesday night. By Wednesday the marine layer may deepen enough to allow gusty seabreeze winds to make it to the burn area Wednesday afternoon.



INPUTS

WEATHER SUMMARY:

The weather will remain warm and dry for the next several days with a high pressure over the area. The marine layer will not have an effect on the fire area overnight. High temperatures will be 88-93 degrees with minimum relative humidity 25-30 percent. Low temperature overnight will be 69-74 degrees and relative humidity 40-45 percent. Winds will be west 5 to 10 mph during the day changing to northwest up to 5 mph overnight. Transport winds will be northwest around 10 mph during the day dropping to 5-10 mph overnight.

OUTPUTS

FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL:

The fire has been the most active in the brush fields with flame lengths up to 20 feet and a moderate rate of spread, less than 20 ch/hr. This will increase during upslope runs or during increased winds across the slope. The understory in the oak trees will be sheltered from the wind for most of the time with low flame lengths and slow to moderate rates of spread. In more open canopies this will increase, especially during the transition into the open grass fields on the ridges and lower slopes. The rate of spread will increase with the high winds on the lower slopes, which can transition from across the slope to downslope during the evening hours. The marine layer will not affect the fire overnight, and will allow the fire to continue to actively burn throughout the night.

SPECIFIC:

The main ridgeline of the mountains in the fire location runs from northwest to southeast. This feature lines up with the northwest transport wind and will continue to push the fire southeast on the top of the ridge and on the upper portion of the slopes. The mid and lower slopes are more influenced by the upslope and downslope flow. The fire will make runs in the lower slopes, in the grass and drainages with the downslope winds. Watch for the west wind to influence the downslope flow increasing the fire intensity and rate of spread. Spotting has been minimal and will remain short range when it does occur. As the fire continues to move across the slope be aware of slope driven runs. Continue to monitor the weather in your area throughout the shift as there are several different wind patterns influencing the fire. Please bring any observations to the FBAN or IMET.

AIR OPERATIONS

The mixing height above the fire is low which may limit aircraft use over portions of the fire.

SAFETY

The wind pattern is different on different portions of the slope, keep current on the conditions in you portion of the fire and watch what the fire is doing around you.
