

WEATHER DISCUSSION

High pressure over the region on Saturday will weaken as an area of low pressure moves northward up the California coast. Winds aloft over the fire area will turn from the southwest on Saturday to a southeasterly direction on Sunday. The change in the winds aloft will bring the potential for winds at the surface to turn to a new south to southeast direction which has not yet been observed on the fires. Additionally sub-tropical moisture from a former tropical weather system will move northward into the region on Sunday and this will bring the threat of thunderstorms with dry lightning on Sunday through Monday. These thunderstorms pose a risk of very gusty and erratic winds as well as the lightning threat. A Fire Weather Watch for Dry Lightning is in effect from midday Sunday until midday Monday.

WEATHER SUMMARY:

Fire Weather Watch for Dry Lightning in Effect From 11 am Sunday through 11 am Monday

The weather will continue to be warm and dry through today, maximum temperatures 79-84 degrees and a minimum humidity of 18-26 percent. Minimal humidity recovery is expected overnight, 40 to 45 percent. The winds will be out of the west to southwest 7-12 mpg with gusts to 18 mph, becoming southwest after 1600. See the weather briefing for more details.

OUTPUTS

FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL:

The smoke cleared out more yesterday than previous days, allowing sunlight to heat the fuels, increasing the fire activity. The fire activity increases around 1500 as the temperatures increase and winds increase in speed. Today will start to see a shift in the wind pattern, from northwest to the south southwest, and possible southeast by early Sunday morning. A Fire Weather Watch is in effect for the fire area for the incoming weather system. The change in weather has the potential for strong wind gust in the opposite direction compared to the past several days. This will test the control lines on the north and west sides of the fire. Winds will continue to change throughout the day. The atmosphere will become unstable as the front moves in and will allow for more vertical rise of the smoke column. When the fire activity increases the potential for longer spotting distances will increase.

SPECIFIC:

The west side of the fire will have wind transitioning from parallel with the line to across the line. Unburned fuel near the line has the potential to become active again, and potentially re-burn if a heat source is present. Any new starts across the line have the potential to grow rapidly on the exposed ridgetop with moderate winds, over 10 mph. There are numerous homes in the Corral de Tierra Road and the San Benancio Road which would be impacted in a very short period of time. In the southern portion on Division D the winds will become perpendicular to the line until late in the night or Sunday morning. The south wind will be beneficial for completing line along the southern portion of the fire. There will be many different micro wind patterns due to the terrain future in the fire area.

AIR OPERATIONS

The air should have more clearing tomorrow allowing for better conditions for aircraft.

SAFETY

The wind will be changing throughout the day along with an increasing unstable environment, continue to watch the weather conditions in the area you are assigned and surrounding areas.

FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL:

The smoke cleared out more yesterday than previous days, allowing sunlight to heat the fuels, increasing the fire activity. The fire activity increases around 1500 as the temperatures increase and winds increase in speed. Today will start to see a shift in the wind pattern, from northwest to the south southwest, and possible southeast by early Sunday morning. A Fire Weather Watch is in affect for the fire area for the incoming weather system. The change on weather has the potential for strong wind gust in the opposite direction compared to the past several days. This will test the control lines on the north and west sides of the fire. Winds will continue to change throughout the day. The atmosphere will become unstable as the front moves in and will allow for more vertical rise of the smoke column. When the fire activity increases the potential for longer spotting distances will increase.

SPECIFIC:

The Carmel Fire is slightly more sheltered in most places, but will still feel the effects of the changing wind. The north side of the fire will have wind perpendicular to the line for most of the shift. A south wind will aid in holding the southern portion of the fire. The west portion of the fire will have wind in alignment in the canyon where the San Clemente Creek and Carmel River meet near San Clemente Drive. This could create some difficult winds in the creek bottom as it will create eddies around the bends in the creek. The varying terrain will create different wind patterns on a micro scale.



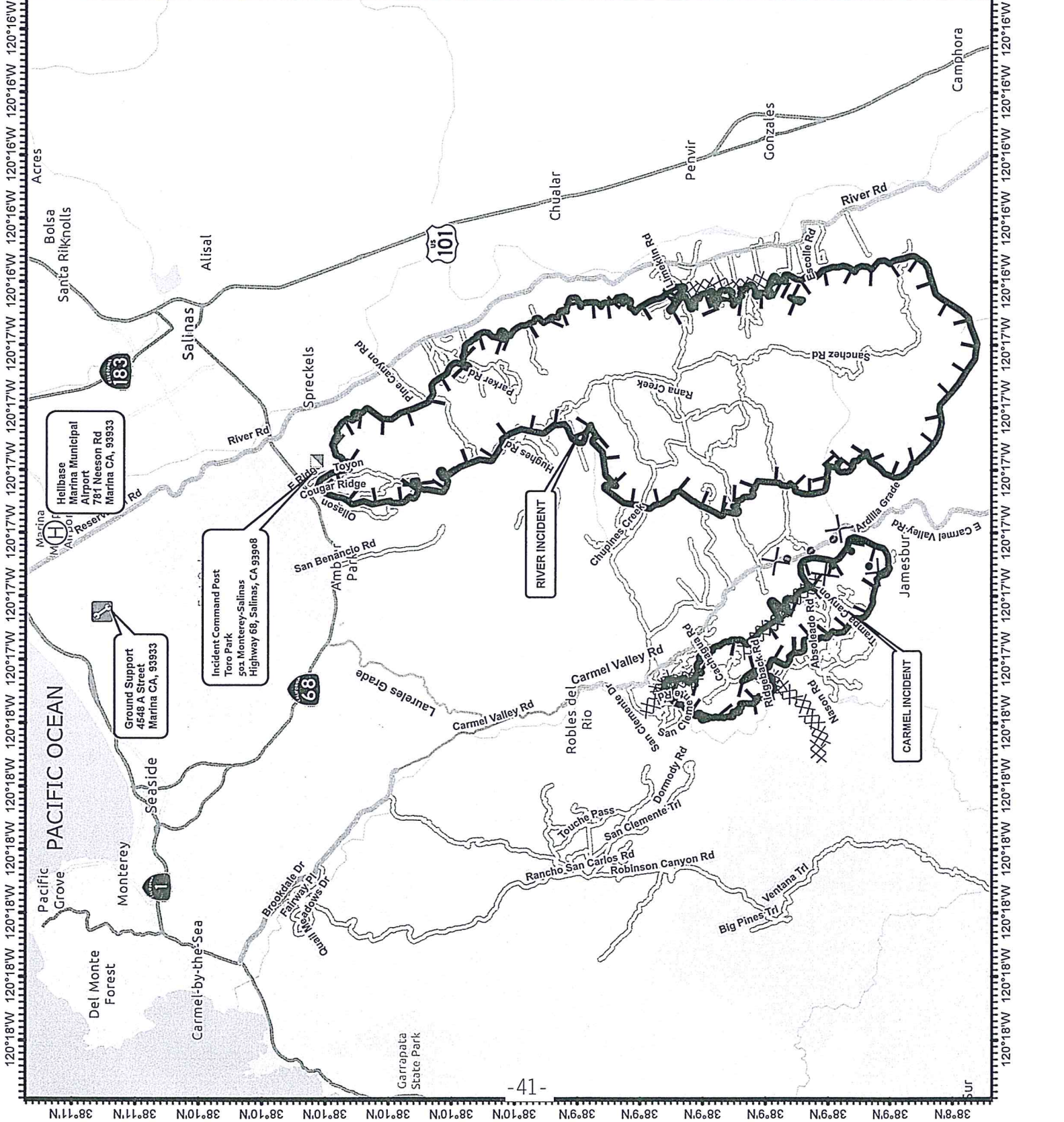
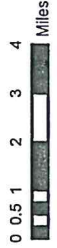
