




...Red Flag Warning for Gusty Outflow Winds and Dry Lightning in Effect Through 5 pm Monday...

WEATHER DISCUSSION: Low pressure will move up the coast on Monday keeping the threat of thunderstorms with gusty outflow winds and dry lightning in the forecast through the day. By Monday night the low will move north and drier air will flow into the fire area. This will end the threat of thunderstorms over the incident. The flow pattern aloft into the fire area will remain from a southeasterly direction on Monday and then shift to the southwest on Tuesday. Temperatures and humidity trends will show little change Monday and Tuesday.

WEATHER SUMMARY:

Red Flag Warning for Gusty Outflow Winds and Dry Lightning in Effect Through 5 pm Monday

The weather will be warm with maximum temperatures 80-85 degrees and a minimum humidity of 30-38 percent and winds southwest 3-7 mph. Overnight temperatures will be 65-72 degrees and humidity 40-45 percent, and winds southwest 3-6 mph. LAL of 2 during the day dropping to 1 overnight. See the weather briefing for more details.

OUTPUTS

FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL:

The Red Flag Warning is still in effect during the day, with the possibility of lightning and strong gusty outflow winds. Continue to observe the weather throughout the day, it will continue to change. The shading from the smoke and clouds may clear out throughout the day bringing more sunlight to the fuels in the afternoon. The humidity stayed high through the shift yesterday, reducing the fire activity. The fire continues to burn in interior islands and smolder around homes and in the heavier fuels. The wind from the southeast was only present in the fire area for a short period of time, returning to a northwest flow.

SPECIFIC:

The southern end of the fire in Division D continues to have active fire. The wind should remain calm throughout the day, unless cumulus clouds build in the area. The fire will become more active in the afternoon and will create a vertically building column when it consumes brush or heavier fuels. The potential for roll out exist in the steeper terrain, especially as the heavier material continue to consume. The winds may be variable throughout the day, more terrain driven, this may change if there is solar heating in the area. The current weather pattern may not develop strong enough to keep the wind in a steady direction. The weather front will continue to the north bringing back warm and dry weather with a northwest flow the following shift.

AIR OPERATIONS


There may be limited aircraft availability due to weather and smoke settling in the lower elevations.

SAFETY

- There is still the potential for lightning in the area today, refer to the safety message and have a plan for when it arrives in the area.
- The wind will be changing throughout the day along with an increasing unstable environment, continue to watch the weather conditions in the area you are assigned and surrounding areas.





FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL:

The Red Flag Warning is still in effect during the day, with the possibility of lightning and strong gusty outflow winds. Continue to observe the weather throughout the day, it will continue to change. The shading from the smoke and clouds may clear out throughout the day bringing more sunlight to the fuels in the afternoon. The humidity stayed high through the shift yesterday, reducing the fire activity. The fire continues to burn in interior islands and smolder around homes and in the heavier fuels. The wind from the southeast was only present in the fire area for a short period of time, returning to a northwest flow.

SPECIFIC:

The main issues for the fire will be rolling material in the steep terrain, especially in the Carmel River canyon. There are sections of the line where the heavy material has been smoldering and shifting causing them to break free and roll. In area with incomplete burning there is the possibility for the remaining vegetation to burn if there is a heat source. These instances will occur more often when the sun comes out and begins to heat and dry the fuels. Continue to look for the heat sources near the line as the wind will still be shifting in multiple directions as the weather system moves through the area.

AIR OPERATIONS

There may be limited aircraft availability due to weather and smoke settling in the lower elevations.

SAFETY

- There is still the potential for lightning in the area today, refer to the safety message and have a plan for when it arrives in the area.
- The wind will be changing throughout the day along with an increasing unstable environment, continue to watch the weather conditions in the area you are assigned and surrounding areas.

Weather:

Constantly monitor for changes in weather. Areas that may have previously burned can **re-burn**. Utilize your Lookouts, Communications, Escape Routes and Safety Zones.

Wildland/Urban Interface:

Reference the **CAL FIRE** structure defense guide card & pg. 12-16 in the IRPG. Keep alert for WUI hazards.

Driving:

Drive defensively and use seat belts at all times. Expect the unexpected around every curve. Drive slowly and ensure your headlights are on. Steep, narrow or dusty roads throughout fire area. Maintain safe following distances and appropriate speed when traversing roads. Flag unstable roads and other hazards that may be encountered while driving. Follow posted speed limits while driving in Toro base camp

Entrapment Avoidance:

Adhere to the 10 Standard Firefighting orders. Consider the 18 Situations that Shout Watch Out. Consider the Common Denominators of Fire Behavior on Tragedy Fires. Maintain LCES. Establish your decision point(s). Conduct risk management.

Communications:

Ensure your radio load is current per ICS 205 in the IAP. Place human repeaters as necessary to communicate. Be clear and concise with instructions.

Extreme fire behavior potential:

Monitor all weather conditions and forecasts. Make sure ALL personnel receive a thorough briefing every shift. Maintain adequate escape routes and safety zones. Advise all personnel if these are compromised or changed. Set decision points when appropriate.

Power lines:

Follow Power Line Safety guidelines on pg. 24 of the IRPG.
Follow FIRESCOPE identification and management of Life Safety Zones procedures, 3 horizontal strands of fire line tape, write "**Do not enter**" or "**Do not cross**"

Hazardous Trees and Snags:

Be alert of snags. When crews are working in a very hazardous area stay diligent and flag hazardous areas. Avoid taking breaks under trees.

THUNDERSTORM & LIGHTNING SAFETY

REMEMBER!

If you can hear thunder or see lightning (the actual strike vs “heat lightning” described below), you are close enough to the storm to be struck by lightning.

Heat lightning is lightning from a thunderstorm too far away for the thunder to be heard. However, the storm may be moving in your direction.

- Maintain **Situational Awareness** at all times and post **Lookouts** as needed to observe thunder cells.
- Approaching thunder cells will affect wind speed and direction.
- Keep the **“30/30 Rule”** in mind. If you see lightning and hear thunder within 30 seconds, seek shelter and/or follow the established **Safety/Disengagement Plan**.
- Take shelter inside vehicles or buildings.
- If caught outdoors, find a low spot and assume a crouched position, limiting contact with the ground.
- Avoid tall trees, wire fences, utility poles, etc.
- Do not stay on ridgetops, wide open areas, near ledges or rock outcroppings.
- Do not group together.
- Handheld radios and cellular telephones can be used.
- Do not use land line telephones, machinery, or electric motors.
- Remain in a safe environment for at least 30 minutes after the thunder cell has passed.

Thunderstorm Safety

Approaching thunderstorms may be noted by a sudden reverse in wind direction, a noticeable rise in wind speed, and a sharp drop in temperature. Rain, hail, and lightning occur only in the mature stage of a thunderstorm.

Situational Awareness

Observe the 30/30 rule: If you see lightning and hear the thunderclaps follow in less than 30 seconds, take the storm precautions identified below. Do not resume work in exposed areas until 30 minutes after storm activity has passed.

Hazard Control

- Take shelter in a vehicle or building if possible.
- If outdoors, find a low spot away from tall trees, wire fences, utility lines and other elevated conductive objects. Make sure the place you pick is not subject to flooding.
- If in the woods, move to an area with shorter trees.
- If only isolated trees are nearby, keep your distance twice the tree height.
- If in open country, crouch low, with feet together, minimizing contact with the ground. You can use a pack to sit on, but never lay on the ground.
- If you feel your skin tingle or your hair stand on end, immediately crouch low to the ground. Make yourself the smallest possible target and minimize your contact with the ground.
- Don't group together.

- Don't operate landline telephones, machinery, or electric motors.
- Don't handle flammable materials in open containers or metal hand tools.

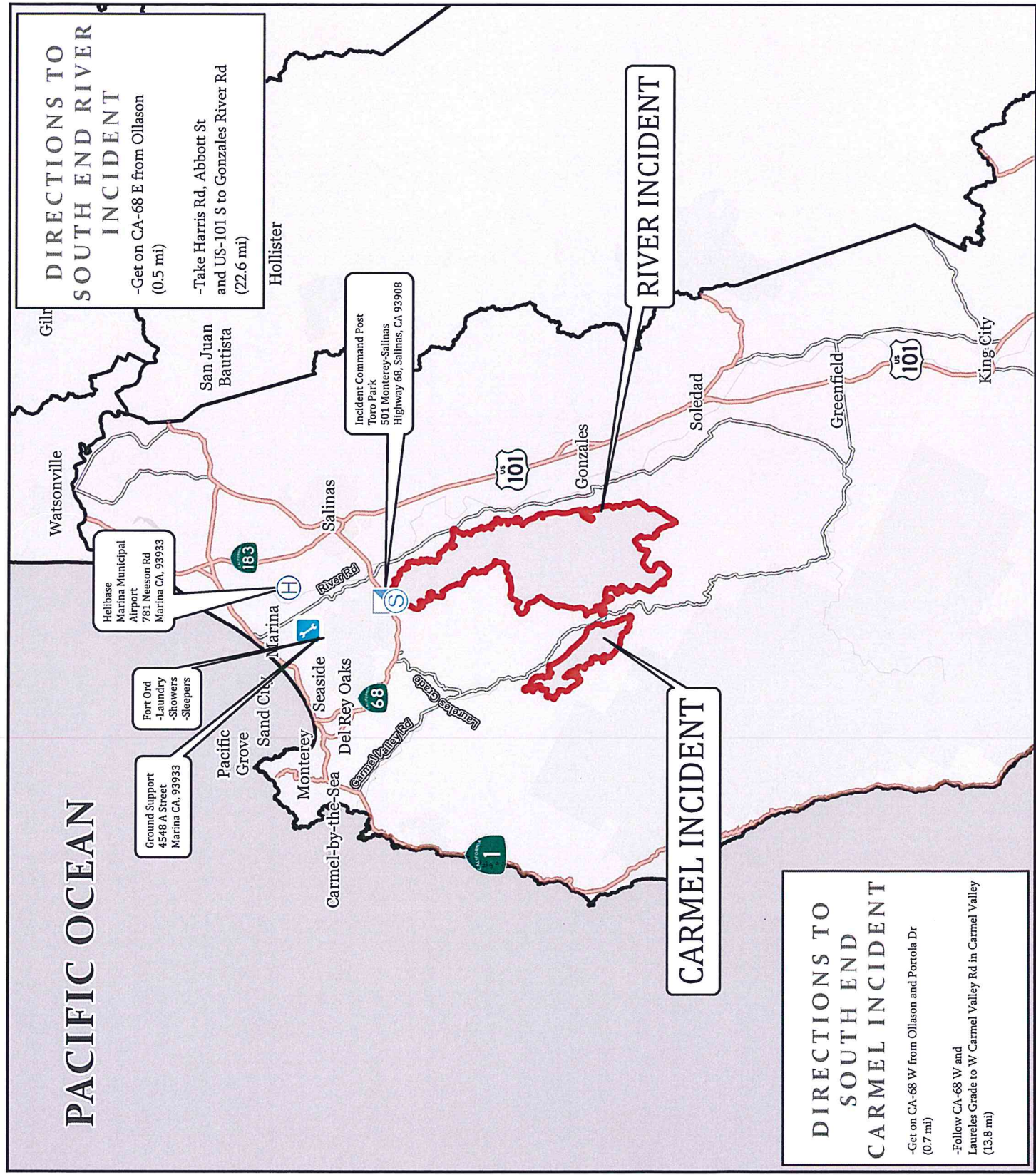

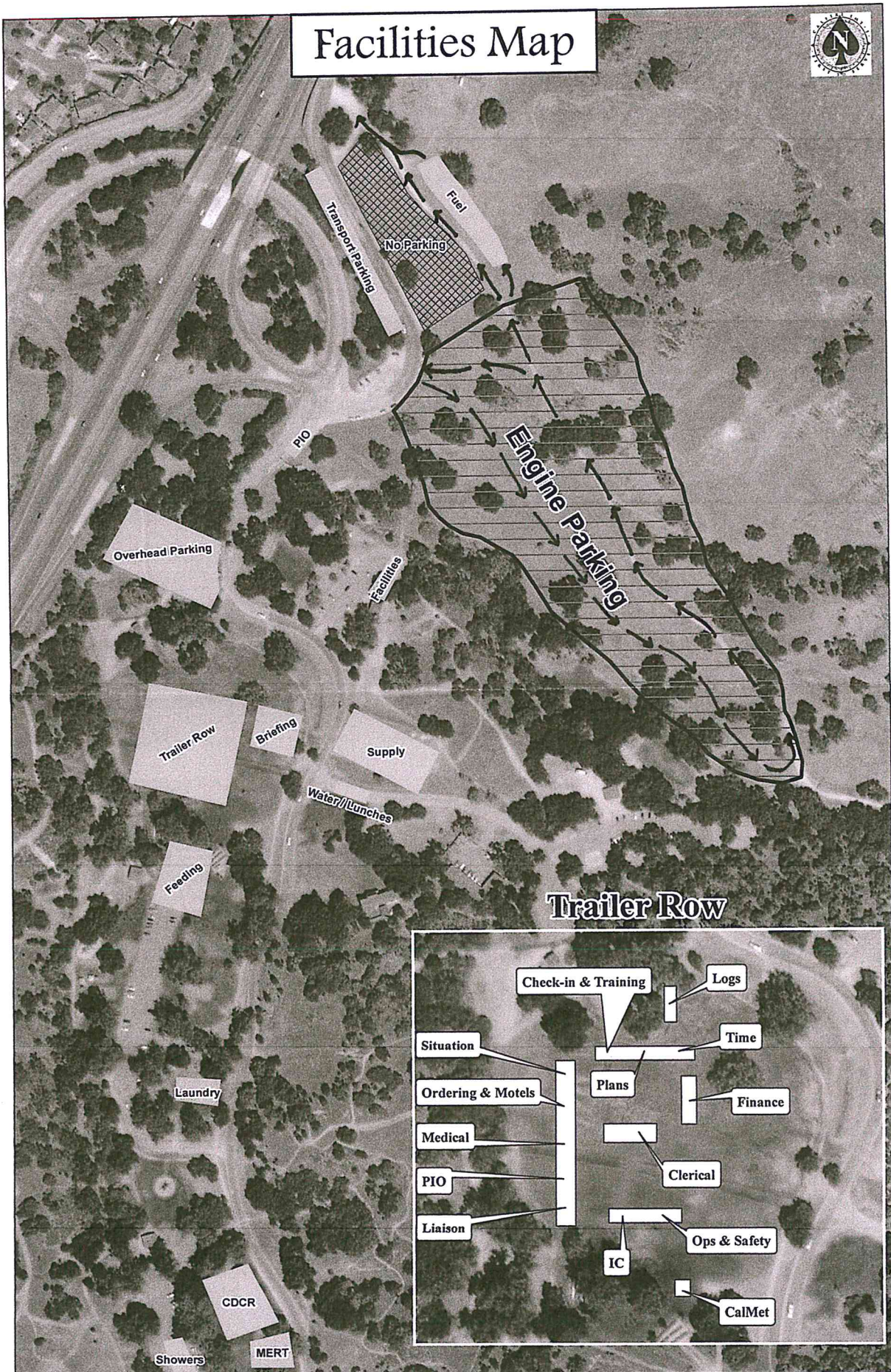
