

INPUTS

WEATHER SUMMARY:

There will be fog in the lower slopes and valleys through 0900. The maximum temperature will be 73-82 degrees in the lower elevations and 85-90 degrees in the higher terrain. Minimum humidity will be 25-35 percent. Wind will be terrain driven through the morning becoming west to northwest 5-11 mph with gust to 18 mph in the afternoon. Overnight patchy fog will return to the lower slopes and valleys. The temperature will drop to 60-75 degrees, and humidity will be 65-75 percent in the lower slopes and 20-30 percent on the upper slopes and ridges. Winds will turn to downslope 2-6 mph.

OUTPUTS

FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL:

The marine layer in the morning and the evening will dampen the activity of the smoldering material. The afternoon will be sunny and breezy increasing the smoldering material. The oak trees tend to burn on the interior, continue to look for signs of smoldering in the trunks and the canopy above. If there is a new start in the area it will be wind driven with the terrain winds or the northwest winds in the afternoon. The lower elevations and the sheltered areas will have a slow rate of spread and low intensity levels. The ridges and slopes will burn with a moderate to rapid rate of spread when slope and wind come into alignment.

SPECIFIC:

There are many areas of the fire line which is underslung, ensure those sections are moped up to prevent rolling material across the line. The root systems of trees can still be smoldering under the surface for several days, look for signs of heat around stumps and trees. The weather can be used to your advantage, when the marine layer will increase the moisture in the air increasing the efficiency during mop up. Continue to work in the areas around homes to ensure there are no more issues with smoldering material or damaged trees. When working in the oak trees be aware of the limbs above which may have been weakened. Rocks in the steep terrain could be unstable as the vegetation holding them in place has burned away.

AIR OPERATIONS

The marine layer will restrict aircraft from the King City Helibase in the morning and early evening.

SAFETY

Steep terrain can create several hazards, watch you footing and be aware of people and equipment working above you.





MAJOR HAZARDS AND RISKS:

Driving:

Drive defensively and use seat belts at all times. Expect the unexpected around every curve. Drive slowly and ensure your headlights are on. Steep, narrow or dusty roads throughout fire area. Maintain safe following distances and appropriate speed when traversing roads. Flag unstable roads and other hazards that may be encountered while driving. Follow posted speed limits while driving in Toro base camp. Check all bridges for structural integrity before crossing.

Weather:

Constantly monitor for changes in weather. Areas that may have previously burned can **re-burn**. Utilize your Lookouts, Communications, Escape Routes and Safety Zones.

Personnel Protective Equipment:

Wear the appropriate PPE for the assigned task. Remove PPE when possible to reduce the exposure to cancer causing contaminants. Wash your PPE as often as possible.

Hazardous Trees and Snags:

Be alert of snags. When crews are working in a very hazardous area stay diligent and flag hazardous areas. Avoid taking breaks under trees.

Wildland/Urban Interface:

Reference the **CAL FIRE** structure defense guide card & pg. 12-16 in the IRPG. Keep alert for WUI hazards.

Communications:


Ensure your radio load is current per ICS 205 in the IAP. Place human repeaters as necessary to communicate. Be clear and concise with instructions.

Aircraft Operations:

Use the assigned air to ground frequency to communicate with aircraft. Stay clear of both rotor wing and fixed wing drop zones. Be clear and concise with your instructions.

Power lines:

Follow Power Line Safety guidelines on pg. 24 of the IRPG.
Follow FIRESCOPE identification and management of Life Safety Zones procedures, 3 horizontal strands of fire line tape, write "**Do not enter**" or "**Do not cross**"

PREVENTATIVE MEASURES TO SLOW THE TRANSMISSION COVID-19:


- Wash your hands regularly with soap and water, or clean them with alcohol-based hand rub.

ADDITIONAL INFO



Archaeological and Historical Sites Fireline Guidance for the River and Carmel Incidents

Do not compromise safety for the protection and preservation of archaeological and historical sites. When feasible and prudent:

1. Be on the lookout for prehistoric and historic sites. Prehistoric archaeological sites include temporary camps containing scatters of obsidian and/or chert flakes that often look like broken glass. More permanent village sites contain circular depressions (house pits), artifact scatters, grinding holes in rocks (bedrock mortars), and dark brown-black soils (midden). These typically occur on flats near sources of water, along ridgetops and saddles, and other such places suitable for camping. Historic sites include old wooden buildings, structures and corrals, stone buildings, rock foundations, wells, and debris scatters. These kinds of resources can be found in the same kinds of environmental settings as prehistoric camp sites.
2. Some archaeological sites have been flagged with orange and white candy-striped "Special Treatment Zone" flagging. If you encounter a flagged area, heavy equipment should not enter or operate within the area. If such an area is entered or operated in, please inform the State Archaeologist. Any questions regarding flagged sites can be directed to the State Archaeologist.
3. While some sites have been flagged, many have not. If you observe artifacts, features, or sites, attempt to avoid dozing or driving through and/or parking on these sites, if feasible, especially with heavy equipment. If you can't avoid sites, minimize disturbance as much as feasible, only clearing the surface to as minimal a depth and width as necessary.
4. Leave all artifacts in place. Some artifacts may have been intentionally placed for religious or ceremonial reasons.
5. When a site is discovered, flag it for visibility and report its location to the Division Supervisor and/or the State Archaeologist. If feasible, note locations of discovered resources on a map. Better yet, take a GPS reading. Leave information with the Plans Section so that the sites can be relocated and protected during both the suppression and fire suppression repair phases of the Incident.
6. If you encounter a burial or other human remains, cease work in that area immediately and contact the CAL FIRE Archaeologist. State law requires that CAL FIRE then contact the County Coroner, who will then determine if the remains are part of a crime scene. If the Coroner determines that the remains are Native American, State law requires the Coroner to contact the Native American Heritage Commission in Sacramento.

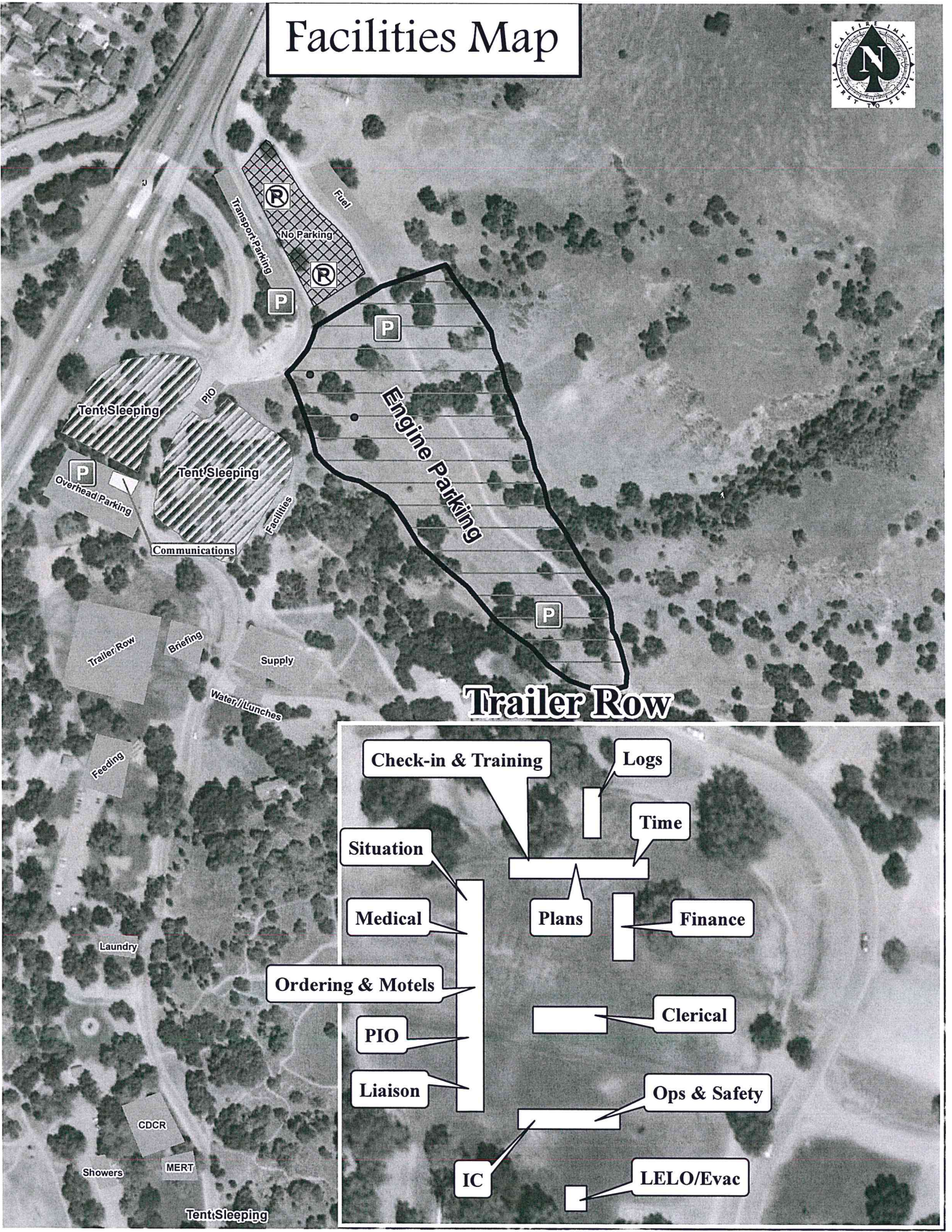

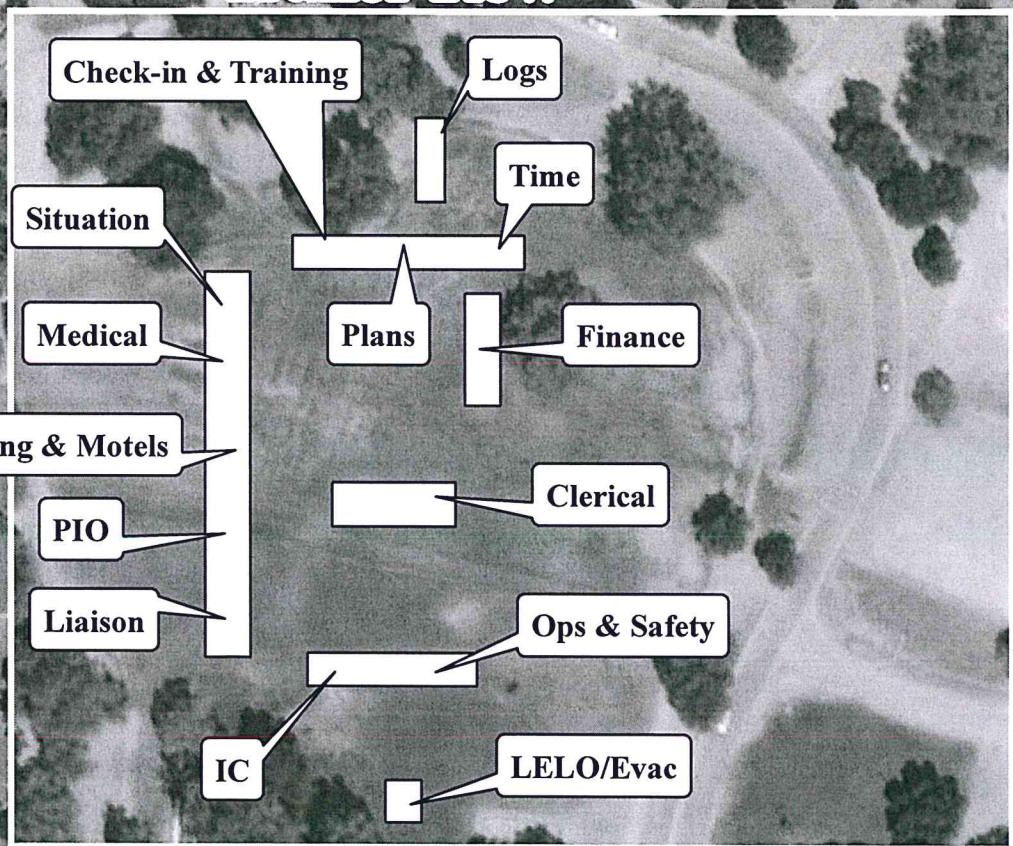

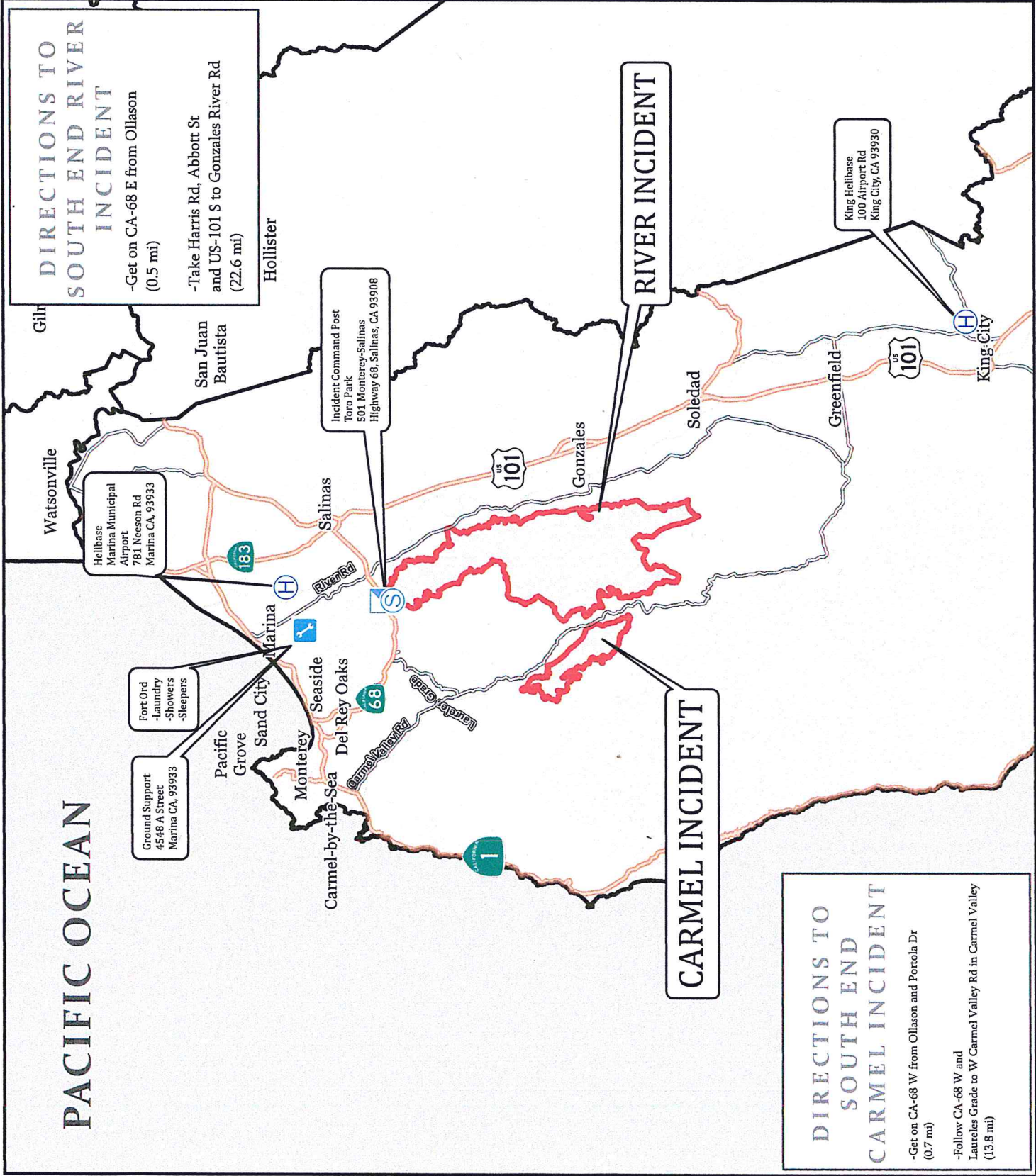
