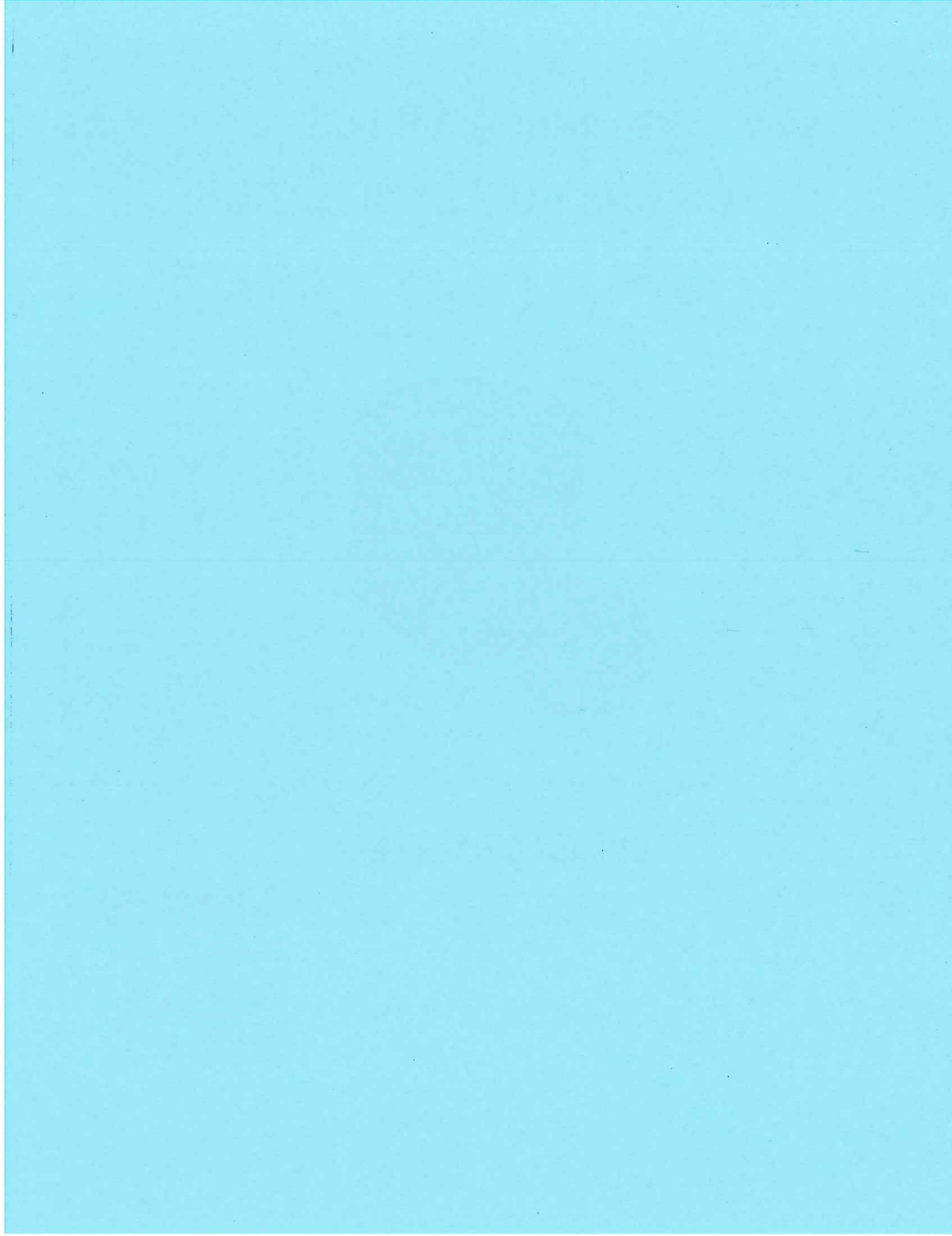



**WEATHER DISCUSSION:** Clear skies are expected through the operational period. Temperatures will be slightly warmer, generally in the mid to upper 70s. Relative humidity will bottom out in the teens and upper single digits today with poor recovery tonight and Thursday morning. Weak northeasterly winds will prevail during the night and morning hours with weak southwest/upvalley winds in the afternoon and evening hours.

For Thursday and Friday, a slight warming trend is expected with an overall slight increase in relative humidity. Weak diurnal winds will prevail. For Saturday and Sunday, offshore winds are expected to increase, peaking in strength Sunday morning. However, winds speeds with this round of offshore winds will be much less than observed at the beginning of the incident. With warm and dry conditions continuing, elevated to locally critical fire weather conditions likely Saturday and Sunday.



## INPUTS

**WEATHER SUMMARY:** Temperatures in the upper 70's with Relative Humidity in the teens and single digits. Winds 8-15 from the Northeast gusting to 25mph, then shifting afternoon to Southwest 6-12 with gusts to 20mph, then returning to Northeast after 20:00 with 5-10 gusts to 15mph. Onshore winds in the afternoon and evening hours will take place Thursday and Friday, but shifting to a weaker offshore event over the coming weekend.

**GENERAL:** The annual grasses have cured out completely and will remain extremely dry and able to sustain ignitions. The brush in the area is currently below critical levels with a the chamise at 60% and the Black Sage at 48%. The Energy Release Component (ERC) is currently well below the 90<sup>th</sup> percentile at 50, and is expected to climb above the 90<sup>th</sup> percentile by 11/1. Expect spotting when the fire enters the large dense brush fields. Roads will hold backing fires easily. Large areas east of the 2006 Sierra Fire and northeast of the 2007 Santiago Fire have not burned in over 44 years.

### SPECIFIC:

Blue Ridge...The cured grasses and light brush will carry fire throughout the shift. Be alert for canyons that run Southwest, they will be in alignment with the expected wind patterns (Telegraph and Soquel).

Silverado...The cured grasses and light brush will carry fire throughout the shift. East of El Torro Rd/Santiago Canyon Rd has large areas of dense brush with no fire history. Fire activity will be greatly increased in those areas.

**\*\*Wind shifts will test all divisions of both fires throughout the shift\*\***

**AIR OPERATIONS:** Gusty conditions will still be present over the ridgetops. Transport winds will be Northeast in the morning, switching to Southwest in the afternoon. Wind will could smoke in the valleys and drainages.

## SAFETY

- Watch your parking locations. The dry grass will be able to ignite easily against hot mufflers, and engines.
- Rolling material on hillsides will ignite material below you quickly in the fine flashy fuels.
- Have lookouts posted that can see into the bottoms of the drainages.

 Calculate Risk and Take Appropriate Actions based on predicted extreme fire behavior and available resources; have them in-place prior to executing any plan.

**Stay Engaged, Utilize Job Aids.**

## COVID-19 DAILY HEALTH CHECK SCREENING ALGORITHM

### At the beginning of each workday:

- **Temperature Check**  
Fever YES/NO? \*Fever is considered  $> 100.4^*$
- **Employee health Questionnaire**
  - Are you feeling ill/feverish?
  - Are you having chills?
  - Do you have new or worsening shortness of breath?
  - Do you have a new or worsening cough?
  - Do you have a new or prolonged sore throat?

If **No** fever and **No** to all questions:

Continue with Daily Operations

If **Yes** for any of these:

Wash hands, don mask and isolate from other employees

Notify the Company Officer and/or Strike Team Leader

Notify Medical Unit Leader

Refer employee to appropriate healthcare provider for evaluation and treatment

Disinfect "high touch" surface areas

### Reminders to All Employees

- Monitor yourself while you are on and off the line
- Maintain proper hand hygiene – Soap and water is preferred; if not available use hand sanitizer
- Do not shake hands, touch, or hug others
- Cover coughs or sneezes (if not masked)
- Cloth Masks should be exchanged and or washed daily
- Masks are required when out in the public on non-emergency business
- Disinfect high-touch surfaces daily
- Practice physical distancing ( $> 6$  feet) always

ALL	FIRING OPERATIONS	Plan out all operations, document, and assure personnel are briefed. Follow the GO/NO GO checklist; don't let pressure drive the decision. Assure all PPE is donned; shrouds down! sleeves are rolled down! gloves on!
ALL	WIND	WATCH weather for WIND REVERSAL. Caution to Erratic Winds and Funneling with Drainages and Canyons. Watch alignment and rates of spread; no frontal assaults. Park into the wind; prevent injury or damage with door control. Calculate tree fall and branch release; project down-wind falling.
ALL	STEEP TERRAIN / ROLLING DEBRIS	Watch your footing while hiking in steep terrain. Be careful of loose rolling debris. Maintain <b>Situational Awareness</b> . Know Tree Hazards in the work area. Dangerous Mountain Roads – SLOW Defensive Driving.
ALL	MOP UP, HAZARD TREES, STUMP HOLES	Identify and isolate the area to provide for the <b>safety</b> of others. Maintain all appropriate PPE for the operation and potential conditions. Do not fall trees out of your certification level. Evaluate wind and lean prior to making cuts. Monitor footing; evaluate work area and routes; tool control is essential.
ALL	DRIVING HAZARDS	<b>SLOW DOWN!</b> Do 360's before moving vehicles. Utilize Chocks. Drive with headlights and seatbelts on; drive defensively. Travel distances add additional fatigue; monitor our people. Utilize spotters and backers; when in doubt, scout it out. Assess Road Conditions; Flag hazard if you cannot mitigate, report.
ALL	HEAVY EQUIPMENT & DOZER SAFETY	Watch for rolling material; Monitor safe working distances. <b>Avoid</b> working below dozer. Utilize communication with the operator (radio or hand signals).
ALL	EXTREME FIRE BEHAVIOR	High rates of spread & frontal fire intensity. Watch for <b>alignment</b> conditions & spotting. Caution with added vertical development or wind-driven conditions. Drainages and steep terrain provide increased rates of spread.
ALL	AIRCRAFT OPERATIONS	Monitor air-to-ground frequencies; they are your eyes in the sky. Use air-to-ground frequency to communicate with aircraft. Use clear, concise statements when directing aircraft; <b>clear the line</b> . Only utilize aircraft to insert personnel on the line when necessary. Go / No Go Night Flying Check List.

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



### Media Law

The California State Penal Code Section 409.5(d) allows the news media to enter scenes of disaster, riot, or civil disturbance. Properly identified members of the news media should not be restricted from entering locations specified within the code. However, this does not include crime scenes, and does not imply that the news media may interfere with incident operations while they are in the areas of concern. If entering such a location that is hazardous, they should be advised; media access cannot be prevented for safety reasons unless their presence would impede CAL FIRE's mitigation of the incident or the disturbing of evidence. When working around the media, remember:

- Media is **not permitted** on private property without the property owner's permission.
- If approached and questioned by the media and/or the public, talk about your assignment or task at hand. Remember to wear all the appropriate PPE.
- If needed call for an incident PIO through the chain of command.
- Never speculate, give opinions or speak for others.
- There is no such thing as an "off the record" comment.

### CAL FIRE Social Media Policy (Social Media 0691)

Social Media is increasingly being used by public agencies, the media as well as the public. This form of communication continues to grow rapidly in order to supply the instant gratification needs of society. Therefore, when on a CAL FIRE incident, you will adhere to the CAL FIRE Social Media Policy, 0691. You can get further information about the CAL FIRE Social Media Policy from the incident Public Information Officer. While assigned to the incident, there will be no posting of:

- Inappropriate information or materials, no opinions, no endorsements, inappropriate pictures or videos

### Lost and Found

The Information Section will manage Lost and Found items for the incident. If you have lost an item leave your contact information and what you have lost at the Information Section. If you have found an item on the incident, bring the item to the Information Section with your contact information as well.

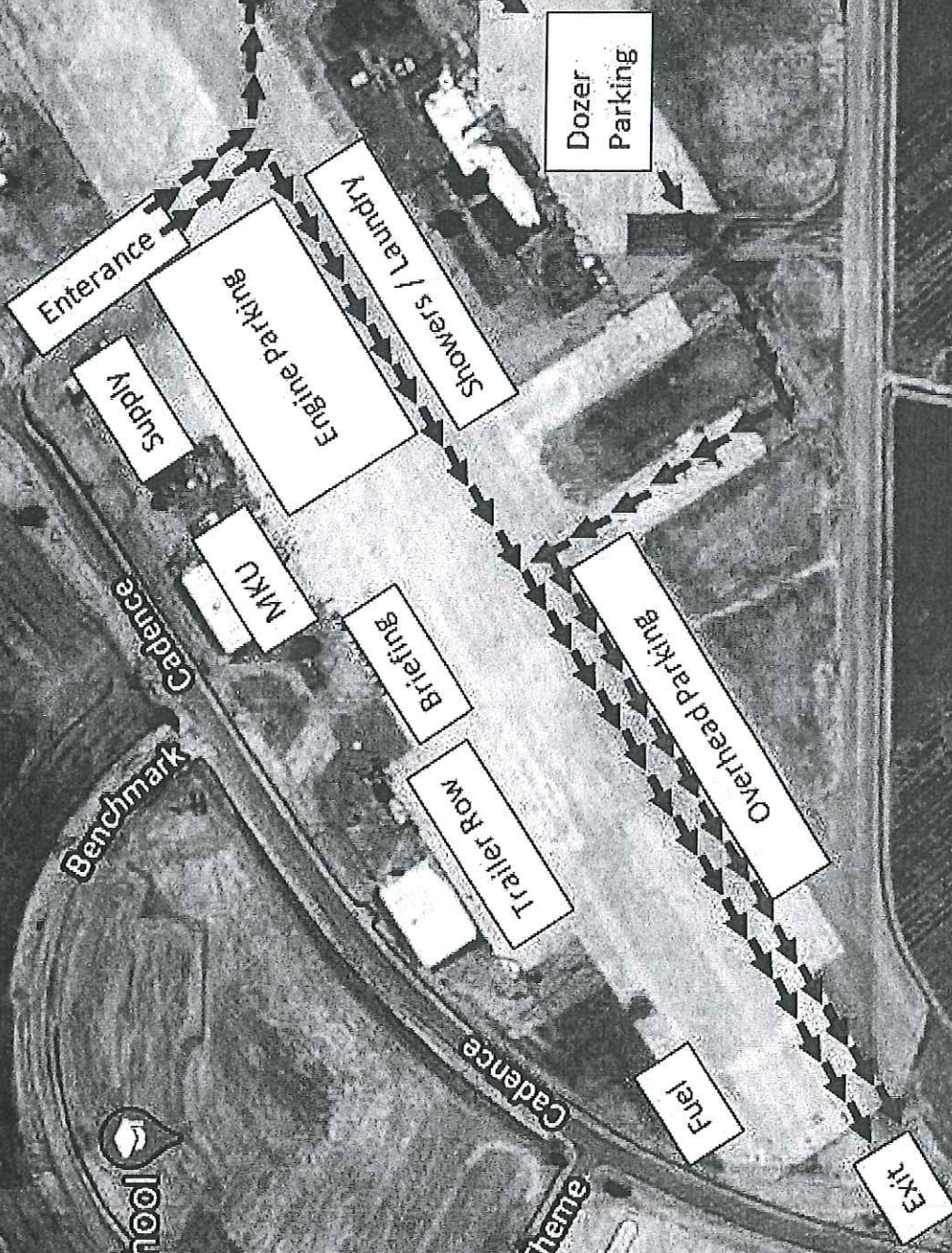
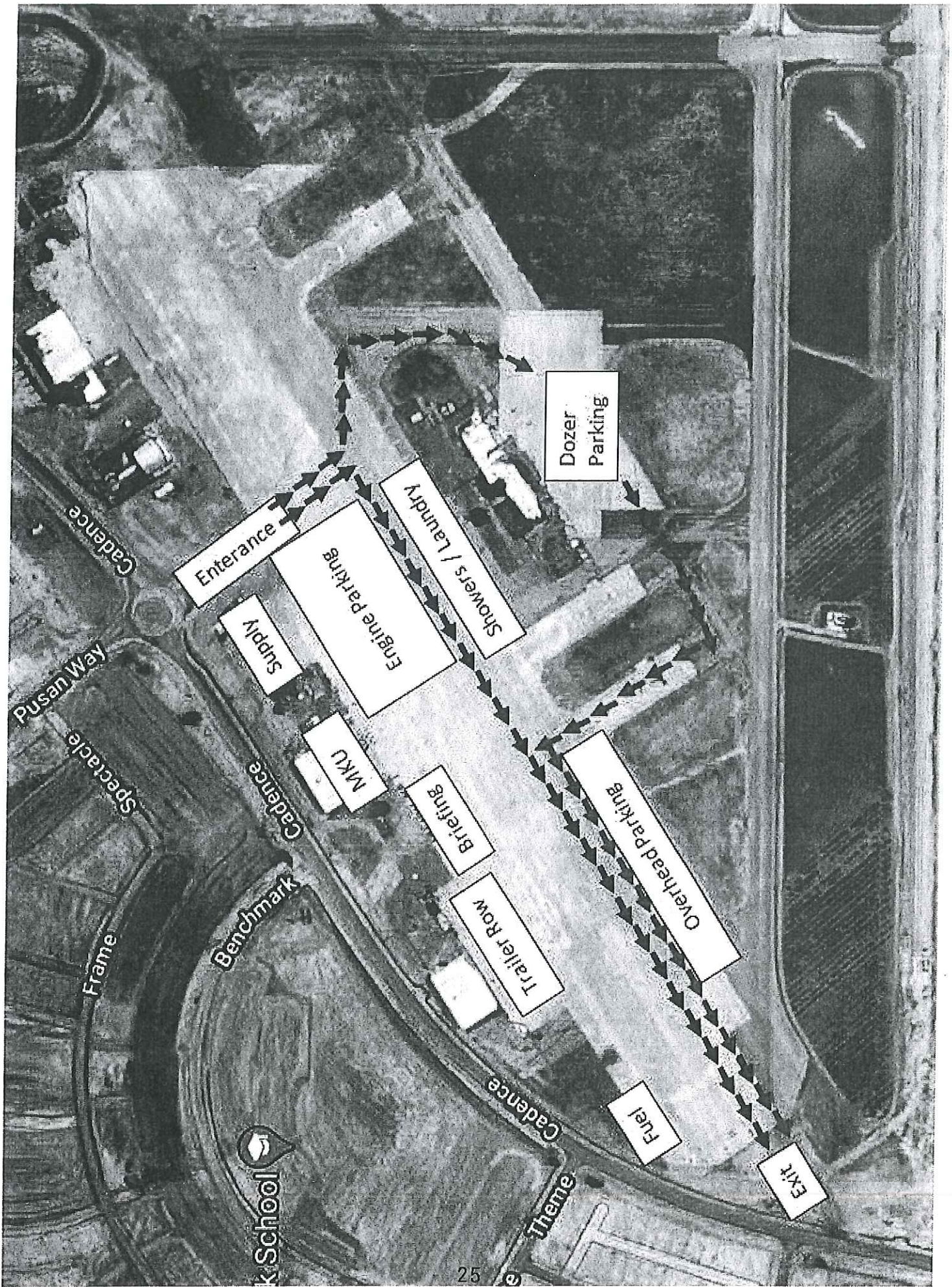
