WEATHER SUMMARY: Moisture from Tropical Storm Kay will continue to impact the area with scattered showers and thunderstorms. GENERAL: ERC's for the area have fallen rapidly due to the recent moisture. 100 and 1000 hour fuels moisture levels will retreat from critical levels over the next 5 days.

BRANCH V, DIV L, DIV H... Smoldering material will still be present. Grasses will not be able to sustain ignition.

Branch I, DIV F... Smoldering and creeping surface fire will be present. Deep seated heat in root wads and stump holes will continue to hold heat. Interior islands will have the potential to burn out if left unchecked.

Values above are accurate for all new fires 10 miles north, west, and south of the incident

SPECIFIC:

- Light flashy fuels will not carry fire until the area dries out over the next few days.
- Dense brush and heavy fuels will hide the smoldering, creeping heat. Be vigilant.

AIR OPERATIONS:

DEMOBILIZATION PLAN - SUMMARY Fairview Incident CA-RRU-129712

GENERAL INFORMATION

The Demobilization Plan is developed to facilitate the orderly removal and checkout of resources on the incident. By definition, surplus personnel are available for release if they have rested for a minimum of 8 hours, are cleaned up, outfitted and have a vehicle ready to depart to their next destination.

GENERAL GUIDELINES

- NO RESOURCES WILL LEAVE THE INCIDENT UNTIL AUTHORIZED TO DO SO BY THE DEMOB UNIT.
- o Efforts will be made to ensure that all released personnel arrive at their destination prior to 2200 hours.
- All Resources will arrive at the Demobilizations Unit at their scheduled time Only.
- All government vehicles leaving the incident will have a safety inspection. If a vehicle is within 1,000 miles of a "B" service, it is the responsibility of the resource to contact Ground Support and have an oil change prior to their scheduled demobilization time.
- All Rental Vehicles will receive a safety inspection prior to leaving the incident.
- All trainees are to keep their time up to date and report to the Training Specialist with their task books and evaluations prior to completion of the demobilization process.
- All strike team leaders are responsible to call South Ops at 1-800-237-3703 immediately upon being released from the incident

RESPONSIBILITIES

Unit Leaders will declare resources excess to their Section Chief. Section Chiefs will declare excess resources to the Planning Section Chief through the Resource Unit Leader. This should be done 36 hours in advance of anticipated release. Use the Declaration of Excess Resources sheet or General Message Form (ICS-213) to list all excess resources. Include the resource name, request number, name of person, date and time of declared excess, and time in which the resource will be eligible to leave. Send to the RESOURCE UNIT where the resource will be determined to be surplus to the incident. Surplus resources will then be able to report to the DEMOB UNIT, receive a Demobilization Checkout Form (ICS 221), get the appropriate ICS 221 signatures, and then return the completed ICS 221 to the DEMOB UNIT prior to final release or reassignment. Resources are not to contact South Ops or the expanded dispatch center unless instructed to do so by the Demobilization Unit.

RELEASE PRIORITIES

- 1. Organized fire departments
- 2. OES engines
- 3. Hired personnel and equipment
- 4. Other agencies (USFS, BLM, etc.)
- 5. Out of region CAL FIRE forces
- 6. Within Region CAL FIRE Forces
- 7. Unit CAL FIRE Forces

TRAVEL INFORMATION

All resources will meet agency specific requirements on hours of travel per day. For CAL FIRE hand crews, a full 24 hour reset period shall be adhered to before departing from the incident. After a crew's last operational period they shall begin the demobilization release procedure during their 24 hours off shift. In addition, they must use the following complete 24 hour period as reset time before they depart from the incident to meet reset requirements if needed.

Media Law

The <u>California State Penal Code Section 409.5(d)</u> allows the news media to enter scenes of disaster, riot, or civil disturbance. Properly identified members of the news media should not be restricted from entering locations specified within the code. However, this does not include crime scenes, and does not imply that the news media may interfere with incident operations while they are in the areas of concern. If entering such a location that is hazardous, they should be advised; media access cannot be prevented for safety reasons unless their presence would impede CAL FIRE's mitigation of the incident or the disturbing of evidence. When working around the media, remember:

- Media is not permitted on private property without the property owners permission.
- If approached and questioned by the media and or the public, talk about your assignment or task at hand. Remember to wear all the appropriate PPE.
- If needed call for an incident PIO through the chain of command.
- Never speculate, give opinions or speak for others.
- There is no such thing as an "off the record" comment.

CAL FIRE Social Media Policy (Social Media 0691)

Social Media is increasingly being used by public agencies, the media as well as the public. This form of communication continues to grow rapidly in order to supply the instant gratification needs of society. Therefore when on a CAL FIRE incident you will adhere to the CAL FIRE Social Media Policy, 0691. You can get further information about the CAL FIRE Social Media Policy from the incident Public Information Officer. While assigned to the incident, there will be no posting of:

- Inappropriate information or materials
- No opinions
- No endorsements
- Inappropriate pictures or videos

SRA Fire Suppression Repair Plan

September 12, 2022

Archaeological or Historic Sites (if discovered):

A variety of cultural resources are known within the Fairview Fire area. They include Native American occupation sites that consist of mortars, milling stones, stone tools, and artifact scatters, as well as a historic lookout, historic period roads, related features, and artifact scatters. Cultural resources are non-renewable resources and are protected under federal laws and regulations. If cultural sites, features, or artifacts are observed, please be respectful and do not post locational information on social media, and please report to the Lead Resource Advisor or Archaeologist assigned to the incident. Thank you for your help in protecting important cultural resources in this area.

General

- Remove and dispose of trash or litter from all fire lines, camps, parking and staging areas.
- Remove berms and barriers created by fire control access and suppression efforts.
- Report any damages or needs to the Fire Suppression Repair Branch Directors, Division Group Supervisor or FSRS. Comp Claims will be notified if the damage cannot be fixed immediately.

Staging Areas / Safety Zones

- New Construction: replace topsoil as reasonably as possible, pull berms, cross drain, remove debris resulting from use and scatter on site, and abandon (if applicable).
- Existing: Repair to original condition; cross drain, remove debris resulting from use and scatter on site (if applicable).

Roads

- Clean culverts plugged with soil and debris resulting from fire control activities.
- Breach/remove berms to facilitate drainage.

Firelines

<u>Dozer</u>

- Where excessive berms were formed, pull, and spread berms onto control line surface.
- Pull organic debris onto surface and scatter evenly over control line at designated sensitive areas.
- Construct waterbars to the standard below.

Handline

- Where excessive berms were formed, pull berms onto control line surface.
- Pull organic debris onto and scatter evenly over control line surface at designated sensitive areas.
- Construct waterbars to the same standard as dozer lines (see above)

Install waterbars on all constructed or used dozer lines, and handlines using the following criteria:

Slope	0-10	11-25	26-50	>50	
Dozer line	100'	75'	50'	50'	
Road	200'	150'	100'	75	

Waterbars

- Installed diagonally with a minimum cut of 6" into existing grade, and minimum height of 12" from the bottom of the trench to backfill top
- Installed at all approaches to watercourse crossings
- Constructed to allow for drainage at logical discharge points, into non-erodible material, and into the green where feasible
- Constructed at 30 degrees, angled downhill.

Watercourses


- All watercourse issues shall be reported to the Suppression Repair Group Supervisor immediately, before any work may begin.
- All slash, soil, and debris deposited into watercourses resulting from fire suppression activities shall be removed and stabilized.
- All loose soil must be pulled away from the watercourse and stabilized.


Slash piles


- Piles within 150' of permanent structures or public roads will be lopped and/or scattered within 18" of soil surface, chipped or masticated if feasible.
- Piles outside the 150' fire safe zone shall be retained for wildlife cover.


Specific Repair Plan for SRA/FRS
