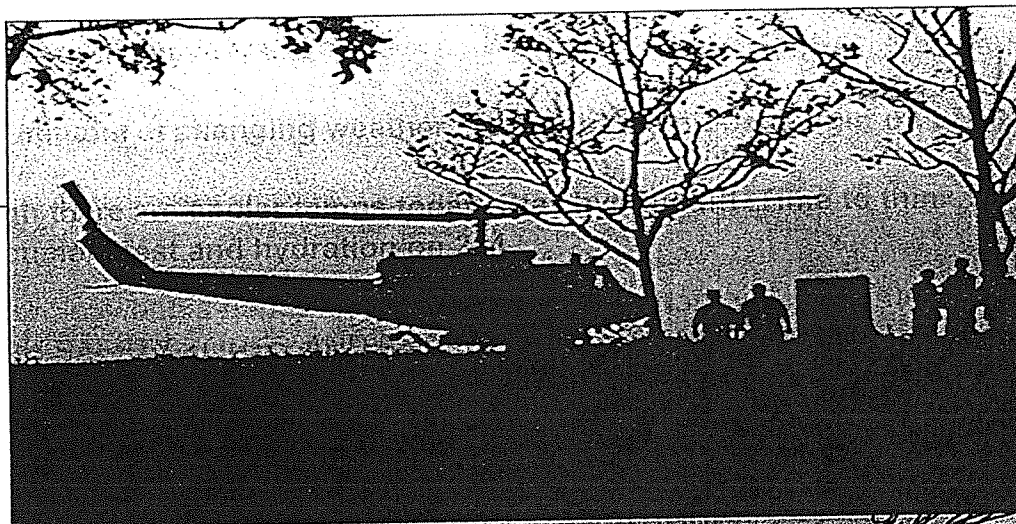
SAFETY MESSAGE

WHEN IT COMES TO SAFETY: THE ONLY THING WORSE THAN BEING OBLIVIOUS TO THE UNKNOWN IS IGNORING THE OBVIOUS...

- Exercise caution while driving on the incident and in surrounding communities. Drive slow, drive safe, watch for civilian traffic....
- Be careful around the incident base! Drive SLOW! Drive with CARE!
- Ensure radios are properly programmed and that crews are trained in communications procedures for the incident.
- Remain mindful of changing weather conditions; don't be caught off guard.
- Although there are cooler temps today- Stay hydrated!!! Time to think Water = time to drink. Document rest and hydration on 214.
- Stay aware of what is happening around you and adapt your exit strategy accordingly. ESTABLISH SAFETY ZONES AND KNOW YOUR ESCAPE ROUTE!

Watch your footing!! The entire fireline has areas of steep terrain...

WEATHER DISCUSSION: A general northwesterly flow pattern will continue across the incident through the operational period with the strongest winds expected during the morning and evening hours. Due to the northwest flow...partly to mostly cloudy skies will prevail this morning with even the possibility of some light showers...but the clouds should clear out in the afternoon and evening. Cooler temperatures are expected today.

The northwesterly winds are expected to continue through Sunday...with conditions expected to get warmer and drier day by day. On Monday...the winds will shift to the northeast which will bring ever warmer and drier conditions to the incident.

WEATHER FORECAST:
