WEATHER DISCUSSION: *A few patchy low clouds possible near ICP and the foothills early in the morning. Otherwise, northerly flow will prevail over the higher elevations today before switching to the more common southwest afternoon wind. Building high pressure over the Desert Southwest will kick of a slight warming and drying trend today. Hot and dry conditions will continue into early next week.*

WEATHER FORECAST FOR SATURDAY:

WEATHER: A few patchy morning clouds near 210 corridor. Otherwise, mostly sunny.

TEMPERATURES: Max Lower Elevations...90-95F. Ridge....81-86F. **24 HR Trend** (up 3-5 deg)

HUMIDITY: Min Lower Elevations...20-30%. Ridges...15-30% **24 HR Trend** (down 5%)

20-FOOT WIND:

SLOPE/VALLEY - Downcanyon/downslope to less than 5 mph, becoming upslope 6 to 12 mph with gusts to 15 mph in the afternoon.

RIDGETOP - North winds 5 to 10 mph with gusts to 15 mph...becoming west to southwest 5 to 10 mph with gusts to 15 mph in the afternoon.

INVERSIONS/STABILITY: Smoke lifting 1100-1300. Lingering smoke through the day.

WEATHER FORECAST FOR SATURDAY NIGHT:

WEATHER: Mostly clear.

TEMPERATURES: Min Lower Elevations...60-65F; ridges....66-69F.

HUMIDITY: Max Lower Elevation....70-85%; ridges....30-45%(early in the night).

SLOPE/VALLEY - Upslope 3 to 8 mph with gusts to 15 mph in the evening...becoming downcanyon/downslope to less than 5 mph...locally stronger N-S canyons.

RIDGETOP - Southwest 5 to 10 mph with gusts to 15 mph in the evening...becoming North to northeast 5 to 10 mph overnight.

INVERSIONS/STABILITY: Weak inversions possible, but mostly mixed lower atmosphere.



Temps 81-86, Minimum RH 15-30%, Winds upslope 6-12 gusts to 15 mph.

FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL: Alignment of slope, wind and solar heating have been necessary to produce significant runs. When one or more of those are not present the rate of spread and consumption of available fuels have been greatly reduced.

Currently there is very little movement on the majority of the fire. There are still pockets of heat that are due to the fact that this fire has burned mostly in old and decadent chaparral in complex terrain that is very difficult to access. This is especially true where there has not been complete consumption.

SPECIFIC:

Division A: Most of this division is looking real well, no spread is anticipated.

Division B: The are just north of the Forest boundary and toward the A/B break continues to harbor some persistent heat, but not significant spread is expected.

Division L: The Stone Cabin Flat area will continue to be active until sufficient access can be made. This area is susceptible to the wind but spread is slow and not expected to be a problem.

Division M&P: Static conditions will continue on the Reservoir Fire, no problems are anticipated.

Division W: The slow and steady spread to the east and south has stalled, but the open line will be susceptible to surfacing winds and could become active again.

Division Z: The spread on this division is also stalled but the fingers are difficult to access and could still be hiding enough heat to become active. No significant spread is expected.

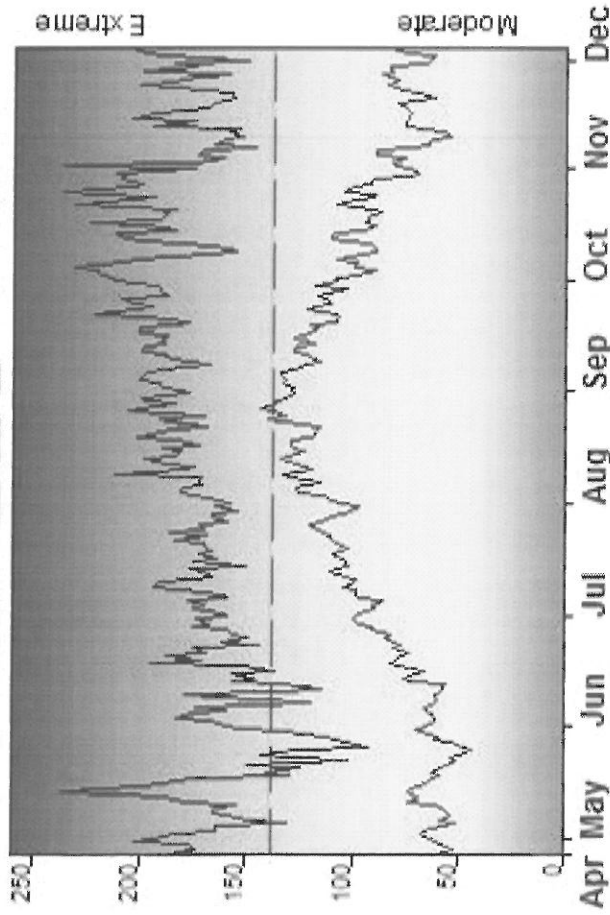
AIR OPERATIONS: Potential for visibility problems early in the shift at the lower elevations. Gusty winds will create turbulence problems in wind prone canyons.

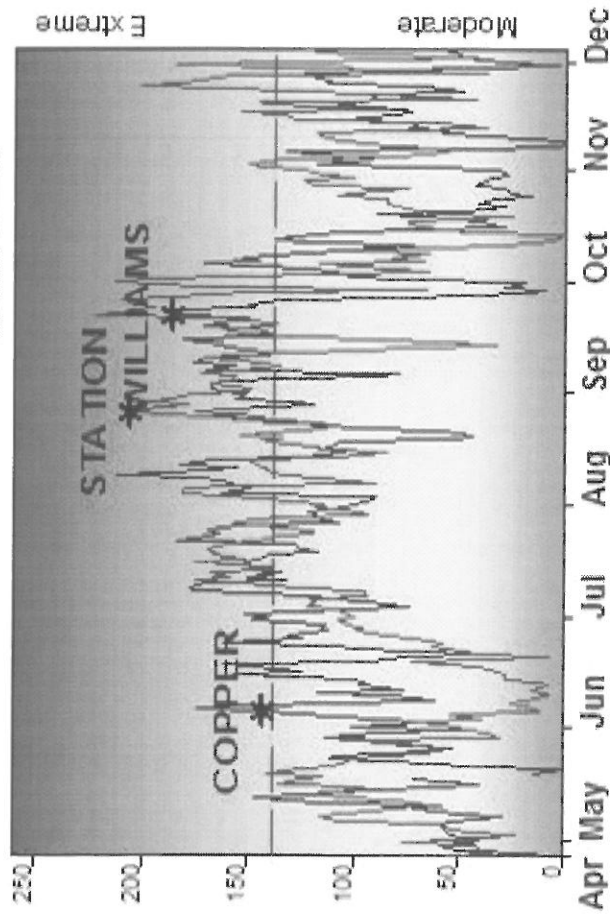

- Listen to weather forecasts -- especially WIND.

Past Experience:

Represents chaparral fuel beds below 5,000'. Large fire threshold - 300 acres. West stations: Clear Creek, Little Tujunga, Tanbark, Warm Springs, Whittaker, Santa Fe, Acton and Camp 9

Recent large fire activity has increased the amount of flashy fuel below 5,000 feet. The fuel reacts rapidly to changes in wind speed and direction. Tactics should account for effects of wind on fire intensity and spread. North-south oriented drainages channel on-shore and off-shore winds, accelerating fire spread. The ongoing drought has increased chaparral mortality across the forest increasing dead fuel loads, thereby increasing fire

potential in chaparral fuels.

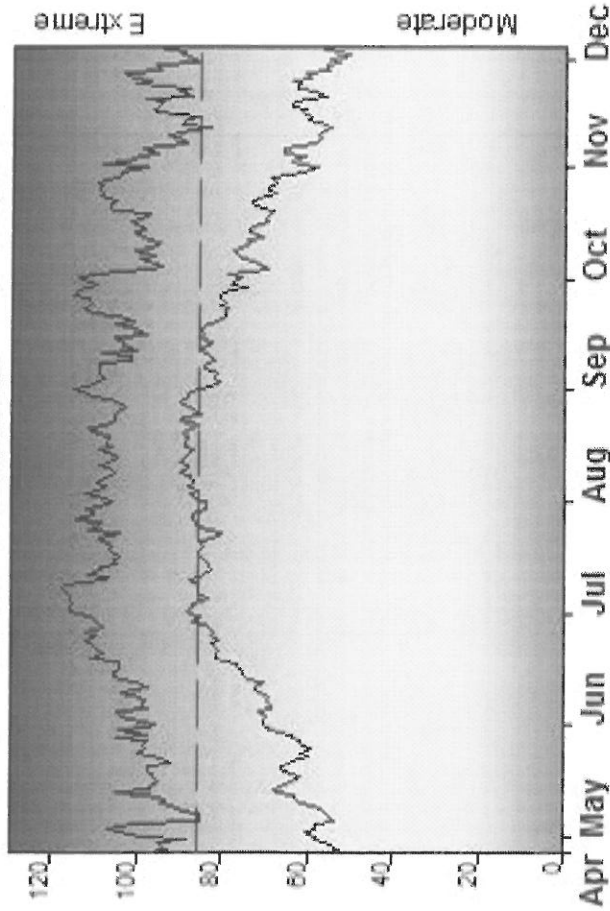

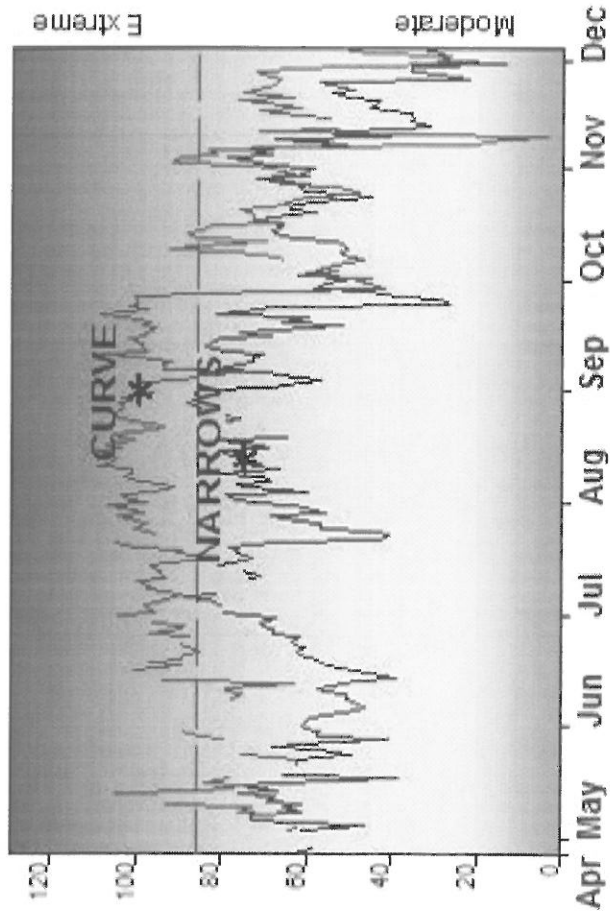


FIRE DANGER -- ANF High Country

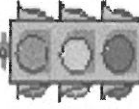


Fuel Model: G - Short-Needle (Heavy Dead)

Past Experience:

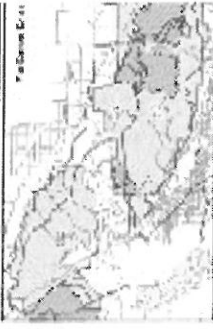
Recent drought related conifer mortality has increased fire potential in these fuels. Torching and short duration crown fires should be expected. Medium and long distance spotting is common with 20 ft. winds in excess of 15 mph. Spot fire probability of ignites increases in full sun and at dry bulb temperatures above 85°F. Large fires (greater than 100 acres) have been documented at ERCs of 54, but become more probable as ERCs reach the mid-80's.

Weather Stations: Mill Creek, Big Pines, Valjevo, Chilao. Large fire threshold 100 acre

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
