Values at risk include human safety, private property, Anderson Communication Site, National Scenic Byway (Highway 1), Fort Hunter Liggett improvements, and wilderness values. Apply tactics that offer the highest probability of success.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">MANAGEMENT OBJECTIVES</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Provide for firefighter and public safety through hazard recognition and application of the risk management process. • Reduce the threat to private property, residences and infrastructure through the application of effective suppression tactics. • Minimize risk and limit exposure to COVID-19 by daily screening, minimizing large group settings, social distancing, wearing face coverings, hand washing and practicing module of one concept. • Reduce the impacts to the Ventana Wilderness values by ensuring minimum impact suppression tactics (MIST) are applied. FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL:

The marine layer will remain at 1,500' today and fire behavior will be moderate below this elevation. As the smoke layer thins out, fire behavior will increase above the marine layer, especially when slope and wind align. This increase in fire behavior as the smoke dissipates will be tempered by relatively light winds.

Probability of ignition will be 60-70% during the day, 50-60% at night. Up to ¼ mile spotting when wind and slope are in alignment.

Local Thresholds: Combinations of any of these factors can lead to greatly increased fire behavior: 20' windspeed over 7 mph, **relative humidity <17%**, temperature over 98, **10-Hour Fuel Moisture less than 6.**

SPECIFIC:

Branch I: This branch has been relatively quiet. However, keep an eye out for increased activity with any alignment of forecasted south winds with the Arroyo Seco drainage near the Branch I/V break

Branch V: Expect active fire behavior with any break in the smoke layer, specifically in light flashy fuels not sheltered from the wind. South winds will lead to continued fire growth in Divisions O and P.

Branch VII: High humidity values associated with the persistent marine layer will result in minimal fire behavior at lower elevations. Above the marine layer, fuel conditions will support active uphill runs. With the smoke layer weakening and increased heating, be prepared for more active fire behavior than observed over the last few days.

AIR OPERATIONS:

Upper level smoke should subside some today. This will provide for improved opportunities for air operations relative to the last few days.

SAFETY:

As crews continue to work the fire's edge remember that fire weakened trees pose a significant risk to firefighter. Before assigning work in timber, scout the area for hazards and instigate mitigation measures before continuing.

TOPIC:

Driving on *this* fire.

NARRATIVE:

You've all seen safety message about driving before.

Here's why it's important to you TODAY on THIS fire.

Hwy 1- Between the smoke and marine layer, visibility on the coast hwy is extremely limited. Additionally, there have been numerous rocks slides and you can expect a lot of debris on the road.

North Coast Ridge Rd.- There is loose slough on the road surface. Erosion has caused areas of the cut bank to no longer support the weight of a vehicle. Don't let your tires get too close to the edge.

Nacimiento Ferguson Rd.- The road is now passable from the East to West side of the fire. There are many snags and fire weakened trees that pose a threat to the road. Expect scattered debris on the roadway. Call out your mile markers traveling up and down the road.

Many of the roads that lead to structures are narrow, winding roads that are one way in, one way out. Plan ahead and know what your egress is if fire behavior forces you out. Know when it's time to leave.
