FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL:

Fire will continue to burn aggressively today. More heat and smoke will be visible at lower elevations across the fire area and fuels are available. When the fire becomes established in sub-drainages expect short duration, rapid head fire runs. Spotting will be up to ¼ mile.

The burn window has increased across the entire fire area, keeping the fire active through the entire night shift. This means that you could see rapid downhill fire runs, especially where the drainages with established fire are in alignment with the general winds. Spotting distances up to ¼ mile when wind and slope are in alignment.

Probability of ignition will be 80-100% during the day, 60-75% at night.

SPECIFIC:

Branch I: No forward fire progression is expected. Hot spots along the line from DP 17 to below H2 will continue to be active. Unburned pockets of fuel along highway 1 will remain receptive to active fire spread, day and night.

Branch V and VII: Fire will continue to burn actively to the south. If the fire gets established on the south side of Hare Canyon, expect rapid rates of spread to the ridgetop where continuous fuel beds exist. Rollout is still causing the fire to burn aggressively on the east side where its stopped over the Santa Lucia Range. Short uphill runs can be expected where rollout ignites fuel below the main fire.

AIR OPERATIONS:

Clear skies expected around the fire area. Smoke will limit visibility around Limekiln State Park and Hare Canyon through the day due to active fire behavior.

SAFETY

Expect the unexpected today. Fuels across this landscape have been exposed to multiple days of intense drying and are becoming very receptive to burning actively. A little bit of wind goes a long way in these conditions. Small increases in wind speed can increase fire behavior a lot. Stay alert.
