**5. OBJECTIVES:**

**STRATEGIC FRAMEWORK**

Implement a full suppression strategy on the Dolan Fire. Values at risk include human safety, private property, Anderson Communication Site, National Scenic Byway (Highway 1) and wilderness values. Apply tactics that offer the highest probability of success.

**MANAGEMENT OBJECTIVES**

- Provide for firefighter and public safety through hazard recognition and application of the risk management process.
- Reduce the threat to private property, residences and infrastructure through the application of effective suppression tactics.
- Minimize risk and limit exposure to COVID-19 by daily screening, minimizing large group settings, social distancing, wearing face coverings, hand washing and practicing module of one concept.
- Reduce the impacts to the Ventana Wilderness values by ensuring minimum impact suppression tactics (MIST) are applied. Utilize historic fire control lines, trails, streams, ridges and natural barriers when possible for control lines.
- Coordinate suppression activities with assigned incident resource advisors to minimize impacts on natural and cultural resources.
- Distribute accurate and timely fire information to cooperators, the public, and stakeholders pertaining to fire behavior and suppression activities to enhance public awareness.
- Manage resources at a level to meet protection objectives while maintaining fiscal accountability.

**CONTROL OBJECTIVES**

To prevent the fire spread to private property, surrounding communities, and values at risk, Keep the fire:

- Hold and improve existing containment lines with assigned resources.
- Identify, establish and improve point protection for values at risk in the current and potential future fire area.
- Scout, identify, and plan for future containment lines that have a good probability of being successful given current and expected weather, fuel conditions and loading, and in a timely manor using current resources.

### FIRE BEHAVIOR

#### GENERAL:

The Marine layer is moving back into the fire area, sitting at about 1,000' today. Expect the fire behavior to moderate below this elevation and remain very active above it both day and night. Fuels remain receptive and ERCs are near 97<sup>th</sup> percentile conditions. Expect the fire to spot out to ¼ mile when wind and slope are in alignment and out a ½ mile when exposed to the ridgetop winds.

The strong southerly wind today will mean areas that had smoldered but not shown activity will be exposed to wind and become visible. Short uphill runs can be expected where rollout ignites fuel below the main fire.

Probability of ignition will be 70-80% during the day, 60-70% at night.

#### SPECIFIC:

Branch I: Hot spots will continue to surface, especially in areas that burned incompletely. Rolling material can still find unburned pockets of fuel along highway 1 and will remain receptive to active fire spread, day and night.

Branch V: Fire will burn actively with alignment. Winds are favorable for containment opportunities across the branch.

Branch VII: With wind/topographic alignment rapid rates of spread can be expected. The increased southerly winds will challenge containment opportunities throughout the branch.

#### AIR OPERATIONS:

The marine layer will limit visibility until 0900, especially below 1000 feet. Southern winds mean our own fire may create visibility impacts throughout the day.

### SAFETY

We haven't seen strong southerly pushes on the fire to date. One more day of unfamiliar conditions with potential for significant fire growth. Watch and listen for cues—strong breezes just before a gust, pockets of heat standing up and growing together as winds align. Keep basics covered and pace yourselves today.



**LCES**

**NARRATIVE:**

**Make sure you have LCES in place before you engage the fire.  
LCES needs to be continuously reassessed throughout the shift**

#### Lookouts

- Experienced, competent, trusted
- Enough lookouts at a good vantage point
- Knowledge of crew locations
- Knowledge of escape and safety locations for crew and themselves
- Knowledge of trigger points

#### Communications

- Radio frequencies confirmed
- Backup procedures and check-in times established
- Provide updates on any situation change
- Sound alarm early, not late.

#### Escape Routes

- More than one escape route
- Avoid steep uphill escape routes
- Scouted for loose soils, rocks, vegetation
- Timed considering slowest person, fatigue, and temperature factors
- Marked for day or night
- Evaluate escape time vs. rate of spread
- Vehicles parked for escape

#### Safety Zones

- Survivable without a fire shelter
- Back into clean burn
- Natural features (rock areas, water, meadows)
- Constructed sites (clear-cuts, roads, helispots)
- Scouted for size and hazards
- Upslope? Downwind? Heavy Fuels? Each means more heat impact meaning larger safety zone.


