Values at risk include human safety, private property, Anderson Communication Site, National Scenic Byway (Highway 1), Fort Hunter Liggett improvements, and wilderness values. Apply tactics that offer the highest probability of success.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">MANAGEMENT OBJECTIVES</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Provide for firefighter and public safety through hazard recognition and application of the risk management process. • Reduce the threat to private property, residences and infrastructure through the application of effective suppression tactics. • Minimize risk and limit exposure to COVID-19 by daily screening, minimizing large group settings, social distancing, wearing face coverings, hand washing and practicing module of one concept. • Reduce the impacts to the Ventana Wilderness values by ensuring minimum impact suppression tactics (MIST) are applied. FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL:

The marine layer will remain at 1,500' today and fire behavior will be moderate below this elevation. Fuels remain receptive and ERCs are near 97th percentile conditions. The fire will spot out to ¼ mile when wind and slope are in alignment and out a ½ mile when exposed to the ridgetop winds. The persistence or absence of high level smoke will be a primary driver of fire behavior. If and when the smoke lifts, expect active fire behavior above the marine layer, especially when slope and wind align.

Continued southerly winds today will mean areas that had smoldered but not shown activity will be exposed to wind and become visible. Short uphill runs can be expected where rollout ignites fuels below the main fire.

Probability of ignition will be 60-70% during the day, 50-60% at night.

SPECIFIC:

Branch I: Although lighter than yesterday, south winds will test containment lines in Divisions F and K, especially in areas that burned incompletely. Rolling material can still find unburned pockets of fuel along highway 1 and will remain receptive to active fire spread, day and night.

Branch V: Fire will burn actively with wind and topography alignment. Relative to yesterday, fire growth will moderate some due to decreased winds and the persistence of high level smoke.

Branch VII: High humidities associated with the persistent marine layer will make firing operations challenging at lower elevations. Above the marine layer, when wind and topography are in alignment, rapid rates of spread can be expected. Forecasted winds will allow for favorable burn operations in Divisions X, W and S.

AIR OPERATIONS:

The persistent marine layer combined with impacts from Dolan and the large number of fires across the west will continue to challenge visibility for air operations.

SAFETY

Be aware of fire activity that appears minimal then quickly becomes aggressive due slope reversal and/or alignment of slopes and winds.



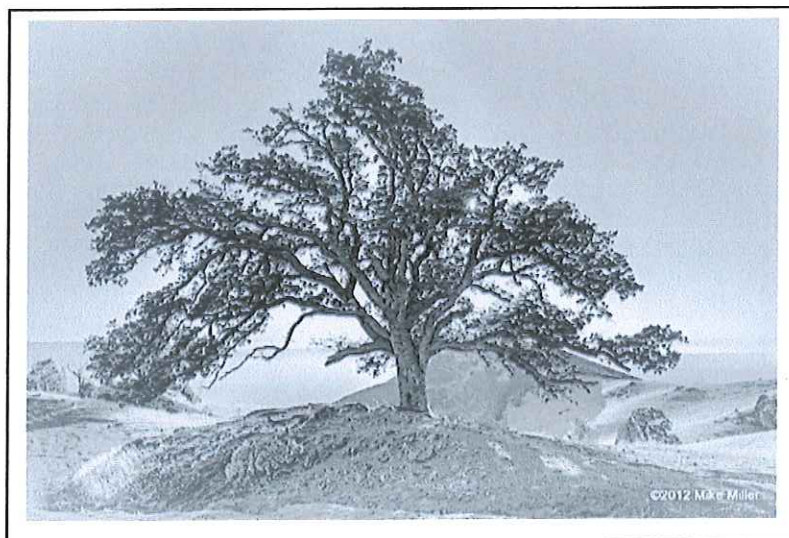
TOPIC:

Summer Branch Drop in Oaks

NARRATIVE:

At this time of the year, it is not uncommon for large branches to suddenly drop from oak trees without warning.

- Summer branch drop is not related to wind and often occurs in the afternoon on hot, calm days.
- While some limbs that drop show evidence of wounds or decay, many of these failed limbs appear to be quite sound.
- Breaks due to summer branch drop usually occurs 3 to 12 feet away from the trunk, along the length of the branch.
- Drought stress may somehow contribute to summer branch drop.
- The immediate danger is to people and vehicles parked under these trees.
- A secondary danger is limbs falling on power lines, causing outages or fires
