Apply tactics that offer the highest probability of success.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">MANAGEMENT OBJECTIVES</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Provide for firefighter and public safety through hazard recognition and application of the risk management process. • Reduce the threat to private property, residences and infrastructure through the application of effective suppression tactics. • Minimize risk and limit exposure to COVID-19 by daily screening, minimizing large group settings, social distancing, wearing face coverings, hand washing and practicing module of one concept. • Reduce the impacts to the Ventana Wilderness values by ensuring minimum impact suppression tactics (MIST) are applied. FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL:

If and when the smoke lifts, expect active fire behavior above the marine layer, especially when slope and wind align.

Probability of ignition will be 60-70% during the day, 50-60% at night. The fire will spot out to ¼ mile when wind and slope are in alignment.

Combinations of any of these factors can lead to greatly increased fire behavior: 20' windspeed over 7 mph, relative humidity <17%, temperature over 98, 10-Hour Fuel Moisture less than 6.

SPECIFIC:

Branch I: Keep an eye out for any alignment of forecasted south winds with the Arroyo Seco drainage near the Branch I/V break

Branch V: Expect active fire behavior with any break in the smoke layer, specifically in light flashy fuels not sheltered from the wind. South winds will lead to continued fire growth in Divisions O and P.

Branch VII: High humidity values associated with the persistent marine layer will result in minimal fire behavior at lower elevations. Above the marine layer, fuel conditions will support active uphill runs.

AIR OPERATIONS:

The persistent marine layer combined with smoke impacts from Dolan and the large number of fires across the west will continue to challenge visibility for air operations.

SAFETY:

With any break in the smoke layer, conditions are favorable for fire spread. Monitor and observe fire behavior and weather conditions. This is a good time to review Standard Firefighting Order(s): #1 Keep informed on fire weather conditions and forecasts. #2 Know what your fire is doing at all times. #3 Base all actions on current and expected behavior of the fire.

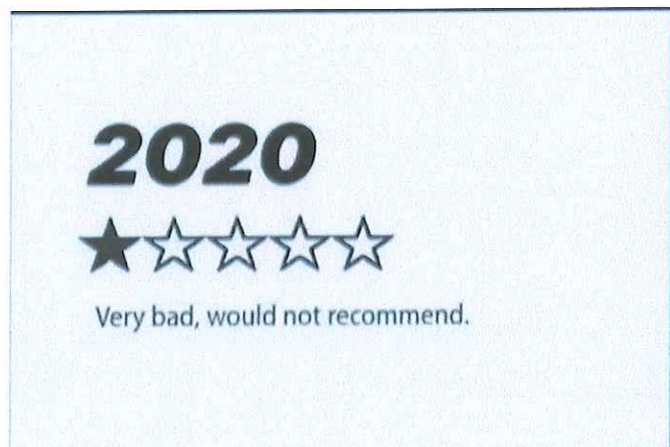
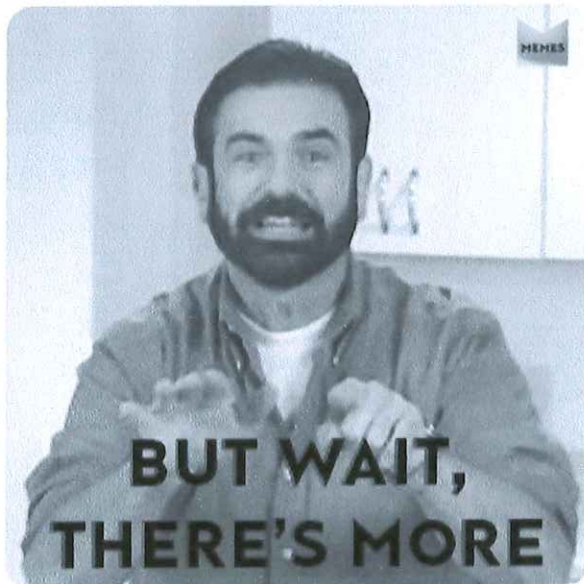

Coping with a Traumatic Experience

Trauma is the emotional reaction to an uncommon, frightening or even life-threatening event. Although traumatic events affect people differently, there are some common reactions that you may experience. These may begin immediately or within a few days or weeks even months. Remember that reactions are normal, and their intensity and duration vary. They may include insomnia, fatigue, hyper-vigilance, pain, headaches, heart palpitations, dizzy spells, change in appetite or emotional reactions.

Coping skills

- Structure your time and keep busy
- You're normal having normal reactions: don't label yourself crazy. Talk to people; talk is the most healing medicine
- Beware of numbing the pain with overuse of drugs or alcohol. You don't need to complicate this with a substance abuse problem
- Reach out; people care
- Maintain as normal a schedule as possible
- Spend time with others
- Help your co-worker as much as possible by sharing feelings and checking in on how they are doing
- Give yourself permission to feel bad and share your feelings with others
- Keep a journal; write your way through those sleepless nights
- Do things that feel good to you
- Realize those around you are under stress too
- Don't make any big life changes
- Do make as many daily decisions as possible to restore a feeling of control over your life, i.e., if someone asks you what you want to eat, answer them even if you're not sure
- Get plenty of rest
- Don't try and fight reoccurring thoughts, dreams or flashbacks – they are normal and will decrease over time and become less painful
- Eat well balanced and regular meals, even if you don't feel like it

What can family and friends do to help?

It is important for family and friends to listen well to the trauma survivor. Being understanding and empathetic is helpful, as is allowing the person to discuss the emotions that may result. Family and friends should also offer assistance if they can. Helping survivors with basic tasks/needs of living can be very comforting. Reassuring the survivor that they are safe now is always important.

Getting help

If any of your reactions persist, talking to a counselor can help process your feelings and thoughts regarding your event. These services are completely confidential. Employees and their family members are eligible for EAP services. For further assistance contact your local EAP through your unit.
