<p><b>5. OBJECTIVES:</b></p> <p style="text-align: center;"><b>STRATEGIC FRAMEWORK</b></p> <p>Implement a full suppression strategy on the Dolan Fire. Values at risk include human safety, private property, Anderson Communication Site, National Scenic Byway (Highway 1), Fort Hunter Liggett improvements, and wilderness values. Apply tactics that offer the highest probability of success.</p> <p style="text-align: center;"><b>MANAGEMENT OBJECTIVES</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Provide for firefighter and public safety through hazard recognition and application of the risk management process.</li> <li>• Reduce the threat to private property, residences and infrastructure through the application of effective suppression tactics.</li> <li>• Minimize risk and limit exposure to COVID-19 by daily screening, minimizing large group settings, social distancing, wearing face coverings, hand washing and practicing module of one concept.</li> <li>• Reduce the impacts to the Ventana Wilderness values by ensuring minimum impact suppression tactics (MIST) are applied. Under this persistent pattern, little change in temperature or humidity trends is expected with cool and damp conditions below the marine layer while much warmer and very dry weather prevails above the marine layer and well inland. Overnight recoveries will remain poor above the marine layer and well inland. Winds will be influenced by the ocean near the coast with daily afternoon sea breezes while inland terrain driven winds will dominate with afternoon southwest flow developing due to the sea breeze push inland.

### FIRE BEHAVIOR

#### GENERAL:

Expect very active fire behavior above the marine layer, especially when slope and wind align. The marine layer will be around 1,800' today and fire behavior will be moderate below this elevation. Probability of ignition up to 80-90% during the day, 60-70% at night with half mile ridgetop spotting distances in brush and grass fuel models.

Local Thresholds: Combinations of any of these factors can lead to greatly increased fire behavior: 20' windspeed over 7 mph, **relative humidity <17%**, temperature over 98, **10-Hour Fuel Moisture less than 6.**

#### SPECIFIC:

Branch I: Rolling material and fire weakened trees will continue to be a safety concern.

Branch IV: If the marine layer remains below 2000' continued spread up Arroyo Seco drainage is expected. Base your actions on >8' flame lengths and spread rates of up to 20 ch/hr in unsheltered areas and up to 30 ch/hr when slope and winds align.

Branch V: There is a high potential for spotting along any unchecked fire edge. Fuels moistures are low and any fire outside the containment line will grow rapidly (up to 30 acres within 15 minutes in light flashy fuels).

Branch VII: At lower elevations, high humidity values associated with the marine layer will result in minimal fire behavior. Above the marine layer, keep your eyes in the green; dry fuels combined with slope/wind alignment are conducive to uphill runs of up to 90 ch/h with 20' flamelengths in the brush.

Night: Poor overnight humidity recoveries are forecasted once again above the marine layer. Be prepared for active fire behavior in areas you may not have noticed heat during the previous night.

#### AIR OPERATIONS:

With smoke trapped under the marine layer, clean air is not anticipated until late morning.

#### SAFETY:

The Dolan Fire has an expansive footprint with complex topography, a variety of fuel types and numerous local weather factors that influence fire behavior. Before you engage, take time to assess the fuel, topography, weather and worst case fire behavior specific to your part of the fire.

### Major Hazards:

- **DRIVING** – Specific hazards include heavy fog along highway 1, narrow one-way ingress and egress into structures, poor road conditions on N. Coast Road, debris on interior roads including the Nacimiento-Ferguson Road.
- **HAZARD TREES** – Both dead and live trees can pose a hazard. Pay special attention to snags along the Nacimiento-Ferguson Road and other recently burned areas in all branches.
- **COMMUNICATION**- Lack of good communication in Branch V. If communications fail on the fireline, cease operations until comms is reestablished.
- **STRUCTURE PROTECTION** – Structures have special hazards including gas, propane, hazardous materials, overhead powerlines, & underground tanks. Know trigger points for disengagement when firing around structures.
- **AIR OPERATIONS** – Ensure bucket work and retardant use is in support of suppression priorities. Clear drop areas of people.

**RISK MANAGEMENT**- Identifies Hazards and evaluates Risk. This is our primary means of maintaining safe wildfire operations. Consistently evaluate your actions and adjust as environmental and human factor conditions change. Review Risk Management Process in IRPG, page 1.

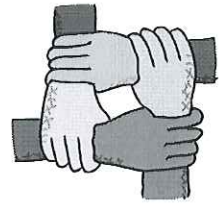
