...GUSTY SOUTHWEST WINDS AND CHANCE SHOWERS...

WEATHER DISCUSSION: Gusty southwest winds will impact higher elevations of the Creek Fire today, especially Branch XX and Branch XXV. Occasional gusts may surface to lower elevations as well. Slight chance for showers over the Creek Fire today as tropical moisture continues to stream overhead. The stronger winds have the best chance at mixing some of the smoke out. Any showers will gradually diminish through the evening hours. Some of the best humidity recoveries are expected tonight with decreasing winds.

WEATHER FORECAST FOR FRIDAY:

WEATHER: Partly cloudy with a slight chance for showers. Areas of smoke. CWR <10% LAL 1

TEMPERATURES: Max 2500-5000' 74-84 F ...above 5000' 60-70 F 24 HR Trend: Cooler 5-7.

HUMIDITY: Min 2500-5000' 35-45% ...above 5000' 45-55% 24 HR Trend: Up 5-10%.

20-FOOT WIND:

RIDGETOP - Southwest 8-15 mph with gusts 20-30 mph in the afternoon. Winds strongest over higher portions of Branch XX and XXV.

SLOPE/VALLEY - Downslope/downcanyon 2-5 mph in the morning becoming upslope/upcanyon 5-10 mph with gusts to 15 mph in the afternoon. Strongest San Joaquin River drainage and aligned canyons.

STABILITY/INVERSION: Some smoke will linger, but the increasing SW flow will help to mix it out.

WEATHER FORECAST FOR FRIDAY NIGHT:

WEATHER: Any shower ending. Smoky. Thickest in lower elevations and drainages.

TEMPERATURES: Min 2500-5000' 58-65 F ...above 5000' 40-51 F. 24 HR Trend: Down 5.

HUMIDITY: Max 2500-5000' 50-60% ...above 5000' 65-80%. 24 HR Trend: Up 10-20%.

20-FOOT WIND:

RIDGETOP - Southeast to South 5-10 mph with gusts 15-20 mph. Strongest in the evening

SLOPE/VALLEY - Downslope 3-5 mph with gusts 8 mph overnight...increasing up to 15 mph by morning.

EXTENDED FORECAST:

SATURDAY... Partly cloudy. Max temps 74-86 F. Min RH 20-30%. Southwest to west 5-10 mph with gusts 15-20 mph in the afternoon.

INPUTS

WEATHER SUMMARY:

The weather will be cooler, with temperatures 74-84 degrees below 5000 feet and 60-70 degrees above, and minimum humidity 35-45% lower elevations, and 45-55% higher elevations. Ridge winds will be southwest 8-15 mph with gust to 20-30 mph. Valleys and slopes will be downslope/canyon in the morning turning to upslope/canyon in the afternoon, 5-10 mph and gust to 15 mph. Overnight temperatures will be 40-65 degrees and relative humidity 50-80%. Winds overnight will be south to southeast 5-10 mph gust 15-20 mph, on the ridges and downslope 3-5 mph with gusts to 8 mph increasing to 15 mph by morning in the slopes and valleys.

OUTPUTS

FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL:

There is possibility of light precipitation, less than 1/10th of an inch, in the area this morning. This precipitation will slow fire progression in the light fuels, but will not be enough to affect the heavier fuels. Spotting will be reduced for the shift. Fire burning in the heavier fuels will continue to burn and will increase in activity with the increased winds, the fuels will override and moisture recovery. The fuel loading in the area is extremely high, up to 2,000 tons per acres, which will smolder and retain heat for long periods of time, weeks.

SPECIFIC:

In Divisions X and Z the heavy fuels will continue to smolder for long periods of time. Chip piles and log decks will continue to smolder for weeks, unless moped up. Pockets of unburned fuel will continue to burn and flare up, pay attention to any unburned areas near the line or structures.

Divisions V and W the weather will reduce the spread rate and spotting potential in the understory grass and leaf litter. The brush will burn actively with enough heat or when it gets into the older stands.

In Divisions R and S, the fire will continue to burn the unburned areas and be aided by the wind. The fire will continue to flank with short runs to the northeast towards the Dinkey Lakes Wilderness. It will continue to burn through the stringers of vegetation in the large rock outcroppings.

Division N and P the fire will continue to burn south along the edge of the South San Joaquin River drainage, narrowing the gap from the fire above Huntington Lake.

AIR OPERATIONS

Smoke will limit aircraft use in the morning, potentially lifting slightly in the afternoon.

SAFETY

Trees have been weakened by the fire and mortality, they will continue to fall and drop large pieces, be aware of your surroundings. Watch where you walk, the stumps and heavy fuel layer has created large ash pits and they will retain their heat.

RESOURCE ADVISOR MESSAGE

Reporting of Cultural Sites

- Do not use the radio. Looters listen to our frequencies and will note where you find things.
- Grab a GPS point, bump it up the chain of command or directly inform a Resource Advisor on the line or in camp.

Blue/Black Flagging and White Flagging Together

- READs will be using flagging for areas to avoid suppression activities.
 - The two flagging colors used are a strip of white and a strip of blue/black.
- For more information, please consult with a READ.

Food on the Line Attract Wildlife Over Time.

- Keep food off the line as much as possible. It lures in wildlife, especially on indirect and contingency lines. Food associate's wildlife to humans and could bring about a dangerous situation to others on the line.

Sensitive Areas

- Meadows are natural barriers. Tie the line to them and not through them.
- Stream and creeks should be approached with care. If needing to cross, minimize damage (i.e. on a dozer lift the blade and only track over) to prevent post-fire stability issues.

Water Drafting Sites

- Access the water source while trying your best to minimize damage to the soil and vegetation.
- If using a portable pump, make sure there is a spill kit and absorption pads to catch any accidental spills.
- Place portable pumps as far away as you can from the water source.
- Store fuel cans away from the water source and on a flat surface.
- Use screens on the intakes.

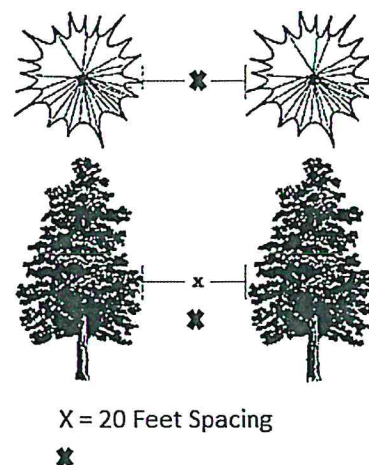
Tree Felling During Fire Line Creation

- Only cut down trees that are necessary during line construction.
 - Ask yourself, "do I really need to remove this tree? Would removal of lower hanging limbs be sufficient?"
- Avoid cutting hardwoods like black oaks when possible.

Removing Fuels in the Forest

Trees across the Sierra National Forest have a monetary value. If this can be done safely and without compromising the line, consider creating a shaded fuel break. A shaded fuel break means some trees will remain with a certain spacing as stated below:

1. Cut trees with a 20' x 20' crown spacing. This means leave one tree untouched every 20 feet with all other trees removed. The 20 feet spacing is measured from the edge of the untouched tree's branches to the next untouched tree (see image to the right). The single tree left should be undamaged and appear healthy. *Healthy = no dead tops, multi tops or obvious signs of disease*
2. Deck all trees cut over a 10" DBH. Decking is to stack the trees in a linear fashion.



Keep up the good work for cultural and natural resources by doing the following:

- Picking up trash/micro-trash.
- Removing unused flagging.
- Sharing information and working alongside READs.
- To the extent possible, when moving on to a new area leave the former better than you found it.

DISCUSSION: Smoke will continue over the fire area with more ventilation from the stronger winds expected. However, RH will also be up considerably today with a few showers possible into this evening. The gusty winds will continue to be strongest near the crest into this evening before diminishing tonight. Winds on the slopes will go downslope later tonight with good RH recovery. This weekend lighter winds are expected with the smoke inversion strengthening.

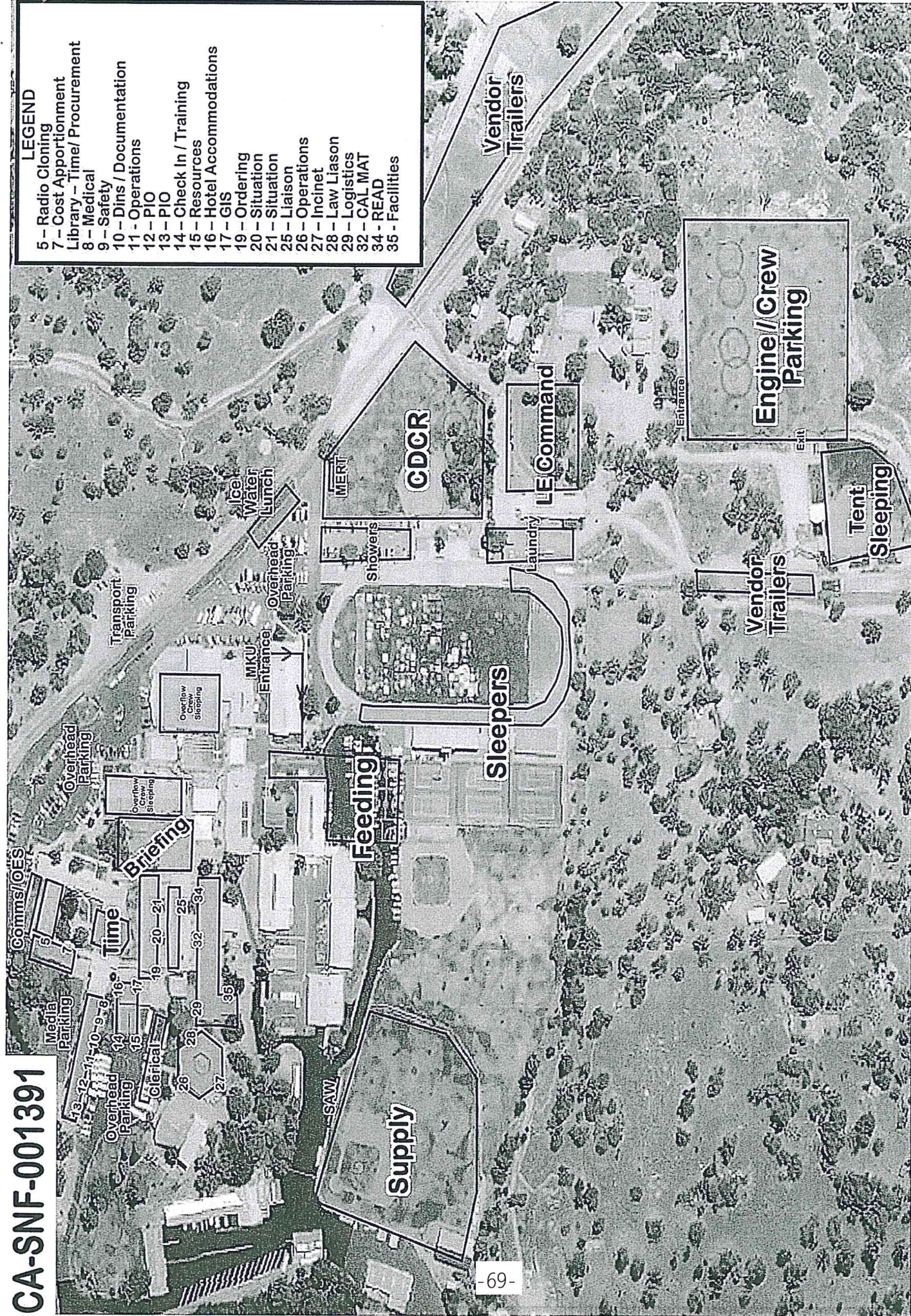

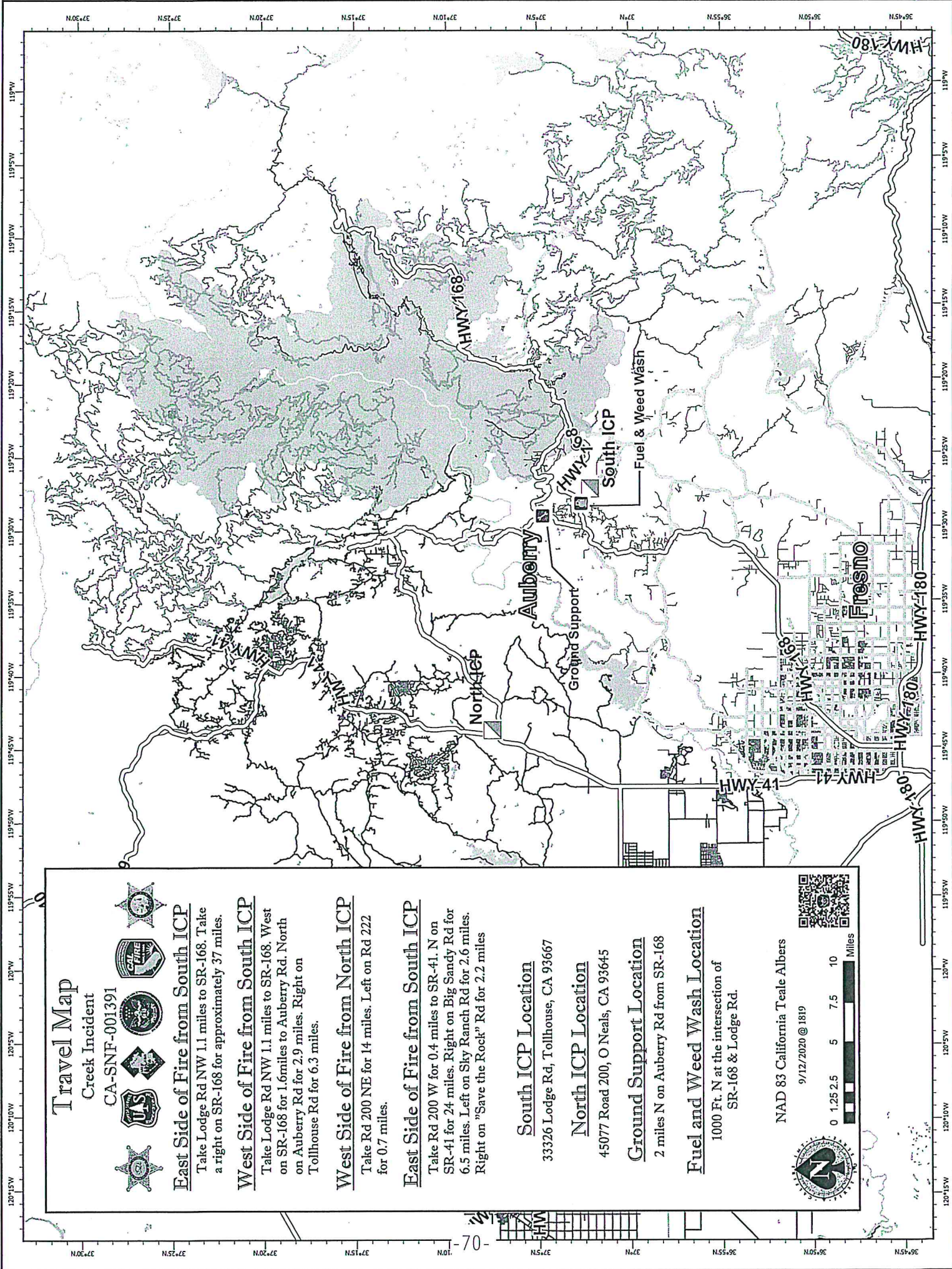
