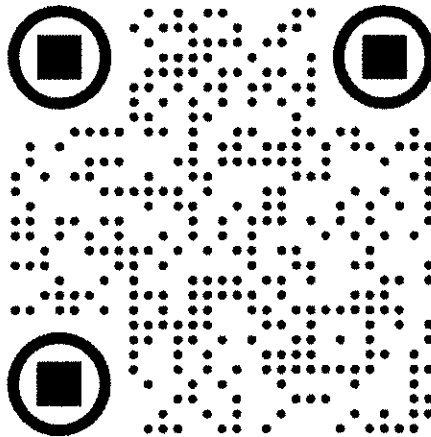

3. Objective(s): <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Provide for firefighter and public safety by assessing and mitigating risk in order to develop and implement sound tactical operations. Ensure all resources have a clear understanding of assignments and associated hazards. • Protect critical infrastructure, commercial timber, and natural and cultural resources by proactively engaging agencies and incident resource advisors. • Maintain and enhance long-term strategic plan by identifying and implementing suppression options considering probability of success, firefighter exposure, risk mitigation, seasonality, and resource prioritization and allocation. • Develop and implement a long term repair strategy in a coordinated and systematic manner considering repair priorities, seasonal access, and equipment and personnel availability. Repair area impacted by fire suppression activities to minimize potential for excessive erosion, reduce visual impacts, and protect natural and cultural resources. • Maintain and enhance relationships with agency partners, cooperators, stakeholders, and the public through timely and accurate information exchange. Ensure long-term strategies are communicated. • Follow CDC, local, state, and federal COVID-19 mitigation guidance and protocols to reduce exposure and protect firefighters and the public from virus spread. • Treat all personnel with dignity and respect by providing a harassment free, zero-tolerance work environment. • Ensure financial and documentation packages are prepared in accordance with agency requirements and agreements are closed out when no longer necessary. 																
4. Operational Period Command Emphasis: <p>Cold front will pass over the fire area today. Winds will push fire weakened timber and other aerial hazards over. Use delay strategy and safely stage personnel and equipment for this event in secure areas with re-engagement considerations in mind. Be prepared for assignment adjustments and to support IA as requested.</p>																
General Situational Awareness <p>As we move resources around for the anticipated weather, be aware of your travel routes and potential challenges along the way and in your new environment. Test communications; high winds may impact incident mountaintop repeaters.</p> <p>The weekend is here and traffic may increase. Drive defensively and know where you are going. If instructions are unclear, ask questions.</p>

STRONG WINDS & COLD FRONT PASSAGE TODAY – WINTER STORM BEGINS THIS AFTERNOON

Strong, gusty SSW winds ahead of an approaching cold front will blow down hazard trees today. The cold front will press south of the fire this afternoon, trailed by rain showers below 5kft and snow across higher elevations after 1400 today with most of the precipitation this evening. High temperatures and low humidity will occur early this morning, then humidity will increase as temperatures fall into the afternoon. A very cold air mass will continue through this weekend with another wave of higher precipitation late Saturday through Sunday.

FRIDAY 0600-1800: Increasing clouds in the morning. Mostly cloudy afternoon with precipitation chances increasing from north to south across the fire (60% chance of precipitation after 1400). Rain totals < 0.20" & Snow totals < 2" (snow level falling to 5 kft). **Stability:** Unstable - well mixed. **Transport Wind:** SSW 30-40.

TOPOGRAPHY:

- Elevation: 3,000-9,500. Higher elevations will see very cold nighttime temps. Nighttime humidity recovery poor to good (20-70%).
- Slopes: 10%-50%. Expect SSW winds near ridgetops, and terrain driven elsewhere with wind direction and speed greatest when slope and fuels align.

FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL:

- All fuel classes very dry, dead fuels are all single digit, live fuel moistures are at critical levels, entire fuel profile available
- Heavy fuels will burn readily and hold heat. Resist control. Creeping and smoldering in the duff and heavy fuels. Some individual & group tree torching contributing to spotting.
- Expect increased fire behavior where alignment of slope and winds occur, and potentially spotting ahead up to 0.10 mile (528 ft.).
- Nighttime humidity recovery (20-70%) starting to moderate fire activity and diminish overnight activity. Shorter day-lengths will continue to reduce active burn period.
- Potential for precipitation to start affecting fuels

SPECIFIC:

- Middle Fork San Joaquin: Activity continues between Middle Fork and Fish Creek, spotting and spreading intermittently through the rocks and patchy fuels. Potential for activity to push north.
- Pincushion: Activity continues with individual and group tree torching being problematic. Ground spread dependent on alignment with slope and wind.
- Cold Creek: Cold Creek area north of Edison Lake much reduced with limited heat still present. Spread dependent on terrain will primarily to the E-NE.
- Timber Knob Area – Fire activity reduced, edged in by rocks at higher elevations where fire is following green vegetation and timber stringers, some potential to move towards Lillian Lake and Lady Lake
- Remainder of Fire Area: limited heat remains. Some islands of fuel continue to consume, POTENTIAL still exists for wind and residual heat to result in spread from quiet area,

SAFETY

Snags and green trees present a hazard with long term fire in the timber. Heads up working around any standing timber. Compromised root structures and burned soil can result in loss of stability.

AK IMT COVID-19 Purpose and Intent

If you are feeling COVID like symptoms, first call Medical Unit Leader:

925-532-5564

The Alaska IMT is reminding firefighters to apply the core values of wildland fire management community of “Duty, Respect, and Integrity” to our COVID mitigations. Core values include:

- **Duty:** To provide a workforce safe from known hazards such as disease transmission, and keep us, our fellow firefighters, and the public safe, on and off the clock.
- **Respect:** To demonstrate respect to oneself and to each other by taking routine precautions as guided, such as wearing a mask and social distancing.
- **Integrity:** To do the right thing when at home, while travelling, or on assignment. Undertake the precautions to keep ourselves and the rest of the workforce healthy and able to respond. Ensure we are not the source of an outbreak within the public we are assigned to protect.

Essential Mitigations:

- **Pre-Screening and Regular Monitoring:** Individuals should measure temperature and assess symptoms each day prior to starting work. Ideally, temperature checks should happen before the individual enters the facility or interacts with others on staff or the crew.
- **Social/Physical Distance:** The employee should maintain 6 feet and practice social distancing as work duties permit in the workplace.
- **Wearing a Mask:** Employees should always wear a facemask or face covering when social distancing cannot be maintained. When facemasks cannot be worn during arduous work tasks, social distancing practices should be implemented.
- **Disinfect and Clean:** Routinely clean and disinfect all areas, particularly “high touch surfaces” such as engine compartments, bathrooms, common areas and shared electronic equipment.
- **Empower** all individuals to ask co-workers to follow social distancing guidelines.

Concept of “Module as One:”By insulating as a unit, crews and modules can limit outside viral exposure, safely complete operational tasks in closer proximity, and ride in vehicles without face coverings when working within their “**Module as One**” concept:



- As often as practical, the same team members should travel in the same vehicle, work together in the same space, and ensure module members are conscientious regarding mitigations.
- Identify select individuals on a crew or module that will interact at briefing or with the public, ensuring this person relies on social distancing, wears a cloth face covering, and practices hand hygiene during or after every interaction.
- When the “Module as One” has been established, minimize contact with public and outside community. This is to protect every crew member, their family, and the community we serve.
- Team members, crews, and other resources should use a “Module as One” approach to insulate as one unit and reduce exposure to the public and other crews. If each member within a unit is monitored, screened, and healthy, then proximity, when necessary, is not an issue.


