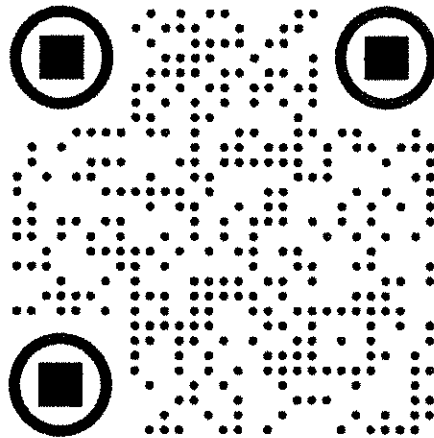

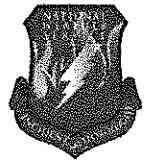

Variable Weather This Week With Dry Periods and Two Weather Systems Later In Week

Dry and cool northwest flow will prevail Tuesday and Wednesday before a weak weather system moves quickly across the fire area on Thursday. A short lived dry day will occur on Friday before another weather system brings another chance of rain and snow on Saturday. The storm track will then lift north of the fire area Sunday and Monday with dry and slightly warmer weather. Winds will remain light and terrain driven through Wednesday then periods of gusty winds will occur over the ridges as weather disturbances move through the region.

- Middle Fork San Joaquin: Limited activity, some heat remains seated in heavy fuels.
- Pincushion: Heavy fuels continue to consume. Smoke production will continue till moisture extinguishes.
- Cold Creek: Cold Creek area north of Edison Lake much reduced with limited heat still present.
- Timber Knob Area – Limited activity with heavy fuel holding some heat
- Remainder of Fire Area: limited heat remains. Some islands of fuel continue to hold heat,

SAFETY

Snags and green trees present a hazard with long term fire in the timber. Heads up working around any standing timber. Compromised root structures and burned soil can result in loss of stability.

AK IMT COVID-19 Purpose and Intent

If you are feeling COVID like symptoms, first call Medical Unit Leader:

925-532-5564

The Alaska IMT is reminding firefighters to apply the core values of wildland fire management community of “Duty, Respect, and Integrity” to our COVID mitigations. Core values include:

- **Duty:** To provide a workforce safe from known hazards such as disease transmission, and keep us, our fellow firefighters, and the public safe, on and off the clock.
- **Respect:** To demonstrate respect to oneself and to each other by taking routine precautions as guided, such as wearing a mask and social distancing.
- **Integrity:** To do the right thing when at home, while travelling, or on assignment. Undertake the precautions to keep ourselves and the rest of the workforce healthy and able to respond. Ensure we are not the source of an outbreak within the public we are assigned to protect.

Essential Mitigations:

- **Pre-Screening and Regular Monitoring:** Individuals should measure temperature and assess symptoms each day prior to starting work. Ideally, temperature checks should happen before the individual enters the facility or interacts with others on staff or the crew.
- **Social/Physical Distance:** The employee should maintain 6 feet and practice social distancing as work duties permit in the workplace.
- **Wearing a Mask:** Employees should always wear a facemask or face covering when social distancing cannot be maintained. When facemasks cannot be worn during arduous work tasks, social distancing practices should be implemented.
- **Disinfect and Clean:** Routinely clean and disinfect all areas, particularly “high touch surfaces” such as engine compartments, bathrooms, common areas and shared electronic equipment.
- **Empower** all individuals to ask co-workers to follow social distancing guidelines.

Concept of “Module as One: “By insulating as a unit, crews and modules can limit outside viral exposure, safely complete operational tasks in closer proximity, and ride in vehicles without face coverings when working within their “**Module as One**” concept:



- As often as practical, the same team members should travel in the same vehicle, work together in the same space, and ensure module members are conscientious regarding mitigations.
- Identify select individuals on a crew or module that will interact at briefing or with the public, ensuring this person relies on social distancing, wears a cloth face covering, and practices hand hygiene during or after every interaction.
- When the “Module as One” has been established, minimize contact with public and outside community. This is to protect every crew member, their family, and the community we serve.
- Team members, crews, and other resources should use a “Module as One” approach to insulate as one unit and reduce exposure to the public and other crews. If each member within a unit is monitored, screened, and healthy, then proximity, when necessary, is not an issue.

Special Instructions:

Use the weather to review the Medical Incident Report (MIR) on the back of the IAP with your entire crew.

When deciding the severity of the emergency, think about the traffic light:

Green means "Go!" - all fire suppression and communications proceed as normal and You may not hear anything additional about the medical incident.

Yellow means "Proceed with caution!"- fire suppression and communications slow down but resources should limit radio communications.

Red means "Stop!"- All operations stop except those essential for fire suppression. Radio communications are held to "Priority Traffic"!

Medical Emergency Procedures:

Follow the Medical Incident Report (MIR) on the back of the IAP

Fireline/ Spike Camp Medical Transports and Emergencies:

Green - Provide immediate patient care, Notify Division Medic or EMT on Tac. Medic or EMT will contact MEDL by phone at earliest convenience. Minimize, non-critical, operational radio traffic on Command and maintain situational awareness.

Yellow/Red- Contact Communications on Command with a Medical Incident Report.

ICP- Call 911 and contact MEDL as soon as possible.

Spike Camps after hours- Call phone number posted in the Medical Unit or phone

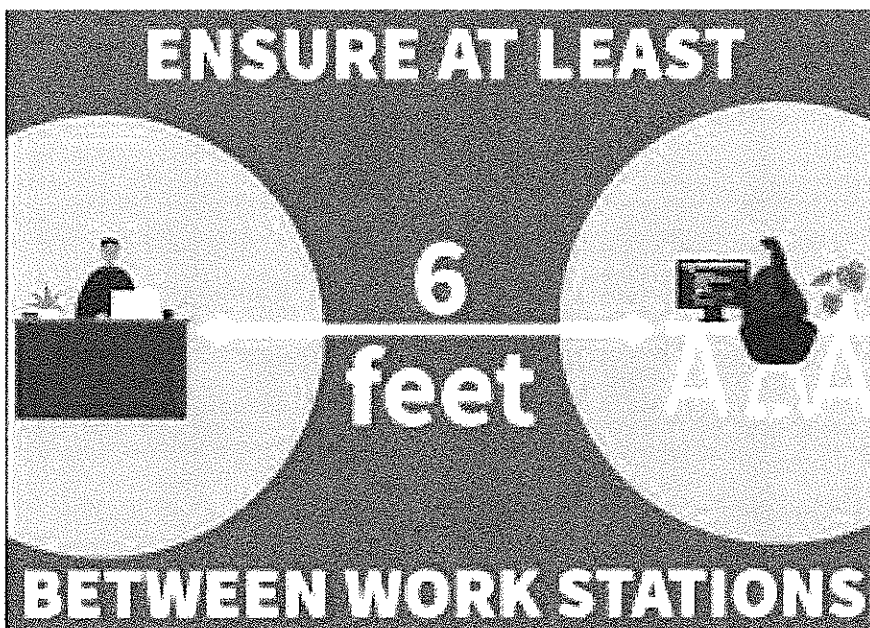
