WEATHER DISCUSSION: Strong high pressure will build over the interior of California this week leading to hot and dry conditions along with overall lighter winds across the fire. With the high overhead this will also lead to more stable conditions and is likely to keep smoky conditions throughout the day and keeping visibilities lower. RH recoveries will be poor overnight with afternoon min RH dropping into the teens. Temperatures will be in the 80s to mid-90s, but may be held lower due to additional smoke cover. Winds are still expected to be southeast to south in the morning, turning more to the southwest to west after 1400. Winds will continue to be heavily impacted by local terrain.

SKY/WEATHER TODAY (MONDAY): Hot and dry. Valley inversions lifting early afternoon, but smoky conditions are expected to last through much of the day. Morning downlope/downvalley winds will turn southeast to south after 1000 with speeds 3 to 5 mph with occasional gusts to 8 mph. A west wind push is expected in the afternoon after 1500 with winds 3 to 6 mph and gusts to 10 mph which will mainly impact DIVs A, Y, Z, and X. However, winds will be heavily affected by the local terrain.

#### MAX TEMPERATURES / MIN RELATIVE HUMIDITY:

87 to 92 degrees (Little Change) / 18 to 23% (Down 2-3%)

7000 FT:

**EYE LEVEL WINDS:**

North to northeast drainage winds up to 4 mph through 1000 with winds following the Little Kern and Kern Rivers. Winds will gradually shift to the south after 1100 with speeds

4 to 7 mph gusting to 10 mph. However, southeast winds are possible in DIV Y due to

local terrain. Winds shifting to the west with gusts up to 12 mph after 1500.

Ridges:

South 4 to 7 mph occasional gusts to 12 mph in the afternoon.

#### **WEATHER SUMMARY**

Hot and dry. Valley inversions lifting early afternoon, but smoky conditions are expected to last through much of the day. Morning downslope/down valley winds will turn southeast to south after 1000 with speeds 3 to 5 mph with occasional gusts to 8 mph.

# FIRE BEHAVIOR

### **GENERAL**

<u>Fuels-</u> Fuels involved in the Castle Fire are primarily Fire Behavior Fuel Models (FBFM) timber litter and understory (TU5) in areas without recent fire history, and a mix of grass (GR2) and brush (GS2) in burn scars less than 20 years old. The Shotgun Fire is higher elevation and does not have recent fire history in its current footprint, and is more represented by a grass shrub (GS2) moderate timber litter (TL6).

<u>Topography-</u> Topography in the fire area is dominated by the Kern River. This river drainage runs north/south and is steep and narrow, roughly bisecting the fire area down the middle. Terrain has played a central role in fire spread, taking the predominantly SW flow and directing it in every way imaginable across the fire area.

<u>Weather A</u> west wind push is expected in the afternoon after 1500 with winds 3 to 6 mph and gusts to 10 mph which will mainly impact DIVs A, Y, Z, and X. However, winds will be heavily affected by the local terrain.

#### **SPECIFIC**

With predicted Haines of 6, there is an increased change of column development with increased fire activity. Increased fire behavior expected with the low humidity's and poor recovery.

Div. A/B Active backing/ flanking fire into the afternoon winds.

Div. C Active backing/flanking fire into the afternoon winds but progressions will slow in the 2017 Lions Fire. Div. G Fire continues to move to the NE towards Kern Peak and Overlook Peak. The fire spotted across the

Kern in the Kern Flat area and is moving with terrain and wind alignment towards the east and Osa Meadows.

**Div.** X Down canyon winds after 2100 will continue to push the fire to the south through alignment with the terrain. The fire is finding its way through the Schaeffer fire scar through available fuels to the east.

**Div. Y/Z** Periods of morning terrain influenced SE flow offer opportunities for slope/wind/aspect aligned runs towards values at risk west of the fire. Increased fire behavior expected with the low humidity's and poor recovery.

**Shotgun Fire** The fire continues to progress to the drainages and find available fuel. If slope reversal happens, short terrain/ wind aligned runs may occur.

#### **AIR OPERATIONS**

Smoke should lift between 1000-1100 to support air missions.

#### SAFETY

Maintain situational awareness when the smoke inversion lifts and fire behavior increases.

# Major Hazards and Risks:

- Fire Behavior –Steep Topography and Canyon Systems, monitor fire weather and indicators of extreme fire behavior. Anticipate changes in weather condition.
- Adhere to the Ten Standard Fire Orders and mitigate any of the 18 Watch Out Situations. Use all LCES options available to you.
- Use extra caution when driving due to the extreme congestion and narrow roads. Expect heavy traffic. Keep speed down when driving to & from division assignments and Spike Camp. Wear seatbelts at all times. Adhere to recommended work/rest cycles, especially for drivers.
- Plan on rolling material and spot fires compromising fireline safety and impacting the work site. Post a lookout during the entire shift watching for spot fires and rolling material.

# **Operational Leadership**

In confusing and uncertain situations, a good operational leader will:

- TAKE CHARGE of assigned resources.
- MOTIVATE firefighters with a "can do safety" attitude.
- **DEMONSTRATE INITIATIVE** by taking action in the absence orders.
- COMMUNICATE by giving specific instructions and asking for feedback.



#### Using your radio with preprogrammed tones

NIFC requires all frequencies used on incidents to be tone guarded on the Receive and Transmit Side. To make radio use as intuitive as possible we have programmed the correct transmit and receive tones on all frequencies in the incident clone.

There are a few things to remember to make this work properly:

- 1. YOU DO NOT NEED TO SELECT TONES ON THE KEYPAD.
- 2. Pressing the number zero key will allow the radio to use the preprogrammed tone frequencies.
- 3. If you are using the old "brick" style radios (dph, gph) your radio squelch knob needs to be turned all the way counterclockwise into the Channel Guard or CG position like in the picture below. There is no change needed for any KNG model radios.



**REMEMBER**- If you are unsure about your current tone selection just press zero, this will have the correct tone for every channel. You can lock your keypad by holding the function or FCN button, this will help prevent accidental keypresses or tone changes.

#### Using a linked NIFC repeater system

Our current repeater configuration is known as a "linked" system. Here are a few reminders on the correct use of a linked repeater network.

- 1. When selecting a command repeater to talk on, use the one that gives you the clearest kick back (squelch tail, kerchunk).
- 2. THERE IS NO NEED TO ANNOUNCE THE SPECIFIC COMMAND NUMBER YOU ARE USING. In a linked system each repeater will retransmit any traffic from all other repeaters in the network.

#### Medical Incident Report

FOR A NON-EMERGENCY INCIDENT, WORK THROUGH CHAIN OF COMMAND TO REPORT AND TRANSPORT INJURED PERSONNEL AS NECESSARY.

FOR A MEDICAL EMERGENCY: IDENTIFY ON SCENE INCIDENT COMMANDER BY NAME AND POSITION AND ANNOUNCE "MEDICAL EMERGENCY" TO INITIATE RESPONSE FROM IMT COMMUNICATIONS/DISPATCH.

Use the following Items to communicate situation to communications/dispatch.

- 1. CONTACT COMMUNICATIONS / DISPATCH (Verify correct frequency prior to starting report)
  - Ex: "Communications, Div. Alpha. Stand-by for Emergency Traffic."
- 2. INCIDENT STATUS: Provide incident summary (including number of patients) and command structure.

Ex: "Communications, I have a Red priority patient, unconscious, struck by a falling tree. Requesting air embulance to Forest Road 1 at (Lat./Long.) This will be the

# Freeman Creek Grove Facts

Freeman Creek Grove (4,192 acres), also known as Lloyd Meadow Grove, is the largest unlogged grove outside of a National Park. This grove is the easternmost grove of giant sequoias and is considered to be among the most recently established. The sequoias are mainly south of Freeman Creek with approximately 800 large trees (10 feet in diameter or more). There are several large sequoias to see in this grove. Foremost among these is the President George H.W. Bush Tree. President Bush delivered his presidential proclamation in 1992, setting aside giant sequoia groves on National Forest System lands for protection, preservation and restoration while standing beside a large giant sequoia at the bottom of the grove.

This is the eastern-most grove of Sequoias. There are a couple of trees with 20-foot diameters, more than 100 trees with 15-foot diameters, and over 800 with 10-foot diameters. Note that the trees are almost all very young - perhaps less than 1,000 years old - and there are no failen giants. Also there are many immature trees around -they are the ones with the feathery, pointy tops which look like inverted icicles. These are the signs of young giant sequoias - unlike the groves in the north.

# Tree Identification – Giant Sequoia vs Incense Cedar



Giant Sequoia — The namesake of the forest and the largest tree on Earth, the giant sequoia is an impressive tree. It does not have a very large cone. It is about the size and shape of a chicken egg. Its needles are similar to a incense cedar but are rounded and prickly to the touch. Sequoia bark is red and is soft and shreds easily.



Incense Cedar — Many mistake incense cedar trees for small giant sequoia trees. They, however, do not produce a traditional shaped cone. Instead their seeds are on six cone scales that form a pod-like cone that splits when it dries. Their needles, though scale-like, are flattened and not prickly. Their bark, though red like a sequoia, is hard and doesn't shred.





# Symptomatic individual guidance

Signs and symptoms of illnesses associated with wildland firefighting mimic COVID. Due to the remoteness of the fire and spike camps, guidance has been provided on dealing with symptomatic individuals.

A COVID evaluation process has been published as an attachment. Division Chiefs will be responsible for screening resources daily with module supervisors for COVID.

Personnel must wear masks when in camp and social distancing is not possible. Masks will help to limit the spread of COVID virus. A COVID outbreak in camp will shut down the fire suppression efforts, place colleagues at risk, and potentially have personnel pulled off the fire.



# Fire and COVID-19 Briefing Checklist

# Self-Awareness / Screening

- Notify supervisor if you or others experience:
  - o Cough, more than expected
  - o Difficulty breathing
  - o Loss of taste or smell
  - o Fever
  - o Chills
  - o Sore throat
  - o Muscle pain
- Immediately separate yourself from others.
- Follow crew and division plans to isolate, triage, and transport symptomatic personnel.

# Hygiene on the Fireline

- Properly wash or sanitize your hands often
- Avoid handshakes and communal use items
- Inform supervisor of needed resupply.
- Disinfect high touch surfaces often

# Social distancing and protective equipment

- Practice social distancing
- Conduct briefings in conversations outdoors and at least SIX feet apart
- Utilize face coverings
- Clean or replace dirty face coverings, equipment, and PPE

The SQF Complex is 27,549 acres in size, an increase in 2,809 acres. Active fire behavior with isolated torching, wind-driven runs and short-range spotting is occurring in grass, brush, and timber fuels over complex wilderness terrain. For more information visit inciweb.nwcg.gov/incident/7048.

#### Smoke

Impaired air quality continues today along the Kern River and elevates in much of the outlook area. Kernville and Johnsondale will see Unhealthy to Hazardous conditions from very early morning until the smoke clears mid-afternoon. Kennedy Meadows and Lone Pine will be Unhealthy most of the day. Smoke from this complex and other fires to the north and west impact the west slope of the Sierras.




