<u>WEATHER DISCUSSION:</u> High pressure building overhead will lead to hot, dry and more stable conditions over the next few days. With the more stable conditions smoke may remain in the valleys through much of the day. North to northeast drainage winds before 1000 with speeds 2 to 5 mph will become southeast to south and increase in the afternoon to around 4 to 9 gusts to 15 mph. After 1500 look for winds to shift to the southwest to west with speeds 4 to 7 gusts to 14 mph. Winds will continue to be heavily impacted by local terrain. Temperatures will be in the 80s to mid-90s, but may be held lower due to additional smoke cover. Winds will continue to be heavily impacted by local terrain.

**SKY/WEATHER TODAY (TUESDAY):** Hot and dry. Valley inversions lifting by mid-afternoon, but smoky conditions are expected to last through much of the day. Morning downslope/downvalley winds will turn southeast to south after 1000 with speeds 5 to 8 mph with occasional gusts to 15 mph. A southwest to west wind push is expected in the afternoon after 1500 with winds 4 to 9 gusts to 15 mph. However, winds will be heavily affected by the local terrain.

#### FIRE BEHAVIOR

## **GENERAL**

<u>Fuels-</u> Fuels involved in the Castle Fire are primarily Fire Behavior Fuel Models (FBFM) timber litter and understory (TU5) in areas without recent fire history, and a mix of grass (GR2) and brush (GS2) in burn scars less than 20 years old. The Shotgun Fire is higher elevation and does not have recent fire history in its current footprint, and is more represented by a grass shrub (GS2) moderate timber litter (TL6).

<u>Topography-</u> Topography in the fire area is dominated by the Kern River. This river drainage runs north/south and is steep and narrow, roughly bisecting the fire area down the middle. Terrain has played a central role in fire spread, taking the predominantly SW flow and directing it in every way imaginable across the fire area.

<u>Weather</u> A southwest to west wind push is expected in the afternoon after 1500 with winds 4 to 9 gusts to 15 mph. However, winds will be heavily affected by the local terrain. Haines of 4 today.

# SPECIFIC

#### Branch I

- Div. A/B/Z- When smoke cover clears, the fire will continue to actively chomp into the afternoon winds where rollout and terrain presents opportunity. West winds will follow terrain which could present as NW and SW winds on the fireline.
- *Div. C/G-* The 2017 Lion fire continues to slow the fire progression but the fire is working its way around to the north side toward the Sequoia National Park.
- **Div. Y-** Periods of morning terrain influenced SE flow offer opportunities for slope/wind/aspect aligned runs towards values at risk west of the fire. As west wind follows terrain in the afternoon, possible W/NW winds may present on the fireline.

#### Branch V

**Div. I/L/N/U-** Fire continues to move to the NE towards Kern Peak and Overlook Peak. Westerly winds along with terrain pushes the fire towards the east to Soda Flat, Long Canyon, Osa Meadows, and Lion Meadow. **Div. X-** Down canyon winds after 2100 will continue to push the fire to the south through alignment with the terrain. The fire worked its way through the Schaeffer fire scar through available fuels to the east.

**Shotgun Fire** The fire slowly continues to progress to the drainages and find available fuel. If slope reversal happens, short terrain/ wind aligned runs may occur.

#### **AIR OPERATIONS**

Smoke should lift between 1200-1300 to support air missions.

#### **SAFETY**

Maintain situational awareness when the smoke inversion lifts and fire behavior increases. Predicted wind directions may present different on the ground due to terrain influence.

## RISKS & HAZARDS

<u>Helicopter Extraction Operations:</u> The intent of a helicopter extraction operation is to insert qualified personnel into inaccessible areas to extract a patient for transport to the nearest medical facility. These operations are not meant to be a medical transport resource but a way to move the patient off the fireline and bring to a waiting air or ground ambulance for direct transport to a medical facility.

#### Some considerations:

- Establish communications with aircrew. Provide information regarding known hazards (on approach path or in LZ), terrain, wind speed & direction and patient updates.
- Choose the extraction site away from the fireline or black edge.
- Ensure the area is clear of debris and nonessential equipment or personnel.
- Rotor wash may affect overhead hazards and blowing dust can create "brown out" conditions. Protect the patient from blowing dust.
- Aerial supervision is a valuable for coordinating aviation medevac missions.
- The aircrew makes the final decision regarding the safety of the mission. Always have a contingency plan in case the helicopter cannot be used.
- Don't get caught up in the urgency of the situation and disregard basic fireline and aviation safety procedures.

Night Operations: Many unseen hazards await the night shift. Besides darkness; dust, smoke and headlight glare can further reduce visibility. Attempt to drive and scout out your work area in daylight. Use flagging and chemsticks to identify travel routes and hazards. Manage firefighter fatigue by taking short naps if possible. Post lookouts. Use appropriate lighting on your vehicles, especially when working along roadsides.



## Using your radio with preprogrammed tones

NIFC requires all frequencies used on incidents to be tone guarded on the Receive and Transmit Side. To make radio use as intuitive as possible we have programmed the correct transmit and receive tones on all frequencies in the incident clone.

There are a few things to remember to make this work properly:

- 1. YOU DO NOT NEED TO SELECT TONES ON THE KEYPAD.
- 2. Pressing the number zero key will allow the radio to use the preprogrammed tone frequencies.
- 3. If you are using the old "brick" style radios (dph, gph) your radio squelch knob needs to be turned all the way counterclockwise into the Channel Guard or CG position like in the picture below. There is no change needed for any KNG model radios.



**REMEMBER-** If you are unsure about your current tone selection just press zero, this will have the correct tone for every channel. You can lock your keypad by holding the function or FCN button, this will help prevent accidental keypresses or tone changes.

# Using a linked NIFC repeater system

Our current repeater configuration is known as a "linked" system. Here are a few reminders on the correct use of a linked repeater network.

- 1. When selecting a command repeater to talk on, use the one that gives you the clearest kick back (squelch tail, kerchunk).
- 2. THERE IS NO NEED TO ANNOUNCE THE SPECIFIC COMMAND NUMBER YOU ARE USING. In a linked system each repeater will retransmit any traffic from all other repeaters in the network.

Subject: SQF Complex - Use of Dozers in Giant Sequoia Groves

To: Acting District Ranger, Western Divide

The SQF Complex, burning in the Western Divide Ranger District, is advancing toward the Freeman Creek Grove, which sites between the fire and the community of Ponderosa, and is the home of the Bush Tree. I am approving the use of bulldozers to construct fire lines when building hand lines is no longer effective within the giant sequoia groves in the path of the SQF Complex. This approval includes the zones of influences for the groves as well. The use of bulldozers in groves has to have the approval of the Incident Commander and the Agency Administrator.

I expect the following management requirements to be adhered to:

- A Resource Advisor will be on site during all fire line construction when heavy equipment is used, and notified immediately when it is determined that felling any giant sequoia tree is necessary.
- 2. The Giant Sequoia National Monument Plan (Monument Plan) limits cutting sequoias larger than 12" dbh except in clear cases of threats to human safety.
- Keep the dozer line at least 10 feet from the drip line of giant sequoia trees greater than 12" dbh in order to avoid damaging the root systems.
- There may come a point where avoiding the drip line may make the fire line ineffective. If possible build hand lines in these situations.
- 5. Where there are areas of very dense giant sequoia trees that are impossible to avoid, whether building line by hand or dozer, giant sequoias may be felled with the approval of the Resource Advisor.
- Tree felling criteria (Monument Plan, pp. 81-82) have been evaluated. The following criterion is applicable for this project.
  - F4. Public Safety: If maintaining one or more standing trees on site would create a public safety hazard. Forest Service policy is to eliminate safety hazards from recreation sites, administrative sites, and the public transportation system of roads and trails, including trees or tree limbs identified as hazardous (FSM 2330.6a).
  - The trees to be felled have been identified as hazards because leaving them standing would create a safety hazard for firefighters; both as potential falling hazards and by reducing the effectiveness of constructed fire lines. No giant sequoias over 12" dbh would be cut without prior approval.

## **Campsite Considerations**

#### **Site Location**

- Coordinate with the Resource Advisor in choosing a site with the most reasonable qualities of resource protection and safety concerns.
- Good campsites are found, not made. If existing campsites are not available, select campsites not likely to be observed by visitors
- Evaluate short-term low impact camps such as coyote or spike versus use of longer-term higher impact camps.
  - > When there are small groups try to disperse use.
  - > In the case of larger camps: concentrate, mitigate, and rehabilitate.
- New site locations should be on impact resistant and naturally draining areas such as rocky or sandy soils, or
  openings with heavy timber.
- Avoid camps in meadows, along streams or on lakeshores. Locate at least 200 feet from lakes, streams, trails, or
  other sensitive areas.
- Consider impacts on both present and future users.

## **Camp Layout**

- Use "leave no trace" camping techniques.
- Lay out the camp components carefully from the start. Define cooking, sleeping, latrine, and water supply.
- Consider fabric ground cloth for protection in high use areas such as around cooking facilities.
- Constantly evaluate the impacts which will occur, both short and long term.
- Do not use nails in trees.
- Prepare bedding and campfire sites with minimal disturbance to vegetation and ground.
  - > Do not clear vegetation or trench to create bedding sites.
- Minimize the number of trails and ensure adequate marking.
- Monitor travel routes for damage and mitigate by:
  - > Dispersing on alternate routes or concentrating travel on one route and rehabilitate at end of use.

#### **Personal Sanitation:**

- Carry water and bathe away from lakes and streams. Personnel must not introduce soaps, shampoos or other personal grooming chemicals into waterways.
  - > Designate a common area for personnel to wash up. Provide fresh water and biodegradable soap.
  - > Do not introduce soap, shampoo or other chemicals into waterways.
  - > Dispose of wastewater at least 200 feet from water sources.
- Toilet facilities
  - > Use commercial portable toilet facilities where available. If these cannot be used a latrine hole should be utilized.
  - > Toilet sites should be located a minimum of 200 feet from water sources.
  - ➤ Holes should be dug 6-8 inches deep.
  - > If more than 1 crew is camped at a site strongly consider portable toilets and remove waste.

## Food Storage

- Place all food in bear proof containers and/or have a camp manager monitoring food at all times.
- Store food so that it is not accessible to wildlife, away from camp and in animal resistant containers.
- Do not let garbage and food scraps accumulate in camp.
- Keep a clean camp and store food and garbage so it is unavailable to bears. Ensure items such as empty food
  containers are clean and odor free, never bury them.
- Don't burn plastics or aluminum "pack it out" with other garbage.

#### **Campfires**

- Use stoves for cooking, when possible.
- If a campfire is built, leave no trace of it and avoid using rock rings. Built either a "pit" or "mound" type.
- If a campfire is used limit to one site and keep it as small as reasonable. Use dead and down wood for the fire and scatter any unused firewood.
- Do not burn plastics or metal.



# Symptomatic individual guidance

Signs and symptoms of illnesses associated with wildland firefighting mimic COVID. Due to the remoteness of the fire and spike camps, guidance has been provided on dealing with symptomatic individuals.

A COVID evaluation process has been published as an attachment. Division Chiefs will be responsible for screening resources daily with module supervisors for COVID.

Personnel must wear masks when in camp and social distancing is not possible. Masks will help to limit the spread of COVID virus. A COVID outbreak in camp will shut down the fire suppression efforts, place colleagues at risk, and potentially have personnel pulled off the fire.



# Fire and COVID-19 Briefing Checklist

## Self-Awareness / Screening

- Notify supervisor if you or others experience:
  - o Cough, more than expected
  - o Difficulty breathing
  - o Loss of taste or smell
  - o Fever
  - o Chills
  - o Sore throat
  - o Muscle pain
- · Immediately separate yourself from others.
- Follow crew and division plans to isolate, triage, and transport symptomatic personnel.

## **Hygiene on the Fireline**

- · Properly wash or sanitize your hands often
- · Avoid handshakes and communal use items
- · Inform supervisor of needed resupply.
- · Disinfect high touch surfaces often

## Social distancing and protective equipment

- · Practice social distancing
- Conduct briefings in conversations outdoors and at least SIX feet apart
- · Utilize face coverings
- Clean or replace dirty face coverings, equipment, and PPE

## Communications

- Ensure effective sender/receiver messaging.
- Protect yourself, your crew, and your camp!

#### Fire

The SQF Complex is 35,674 acres in size, an increase in 8,125 acres. Active fire behavior with isolated torching, backing and flanking is occurring in grass, brush, and timber fuels over complex wilderness terrain. For more information visit inciweb.nwcg.gov/incident/7048.

#### Smoke

Unhealthy air quality continues today along the Kern River and Kennedy Meadows. Kernville and Johnsondale will see Unhealthy to Hazardous conditions from early morning until late afternoon. Kennedy Meadows will be Unhealthy most of the day. The best time to be outside will be from early evening until midnight. Keeler and Lone Pine will see Unhealthy conditions during the day. Smoke from fires to the north will begin to impact the outlook area today degrading the remaining monitor locations to USG.

#### Notes

This outlook addresses and is based on PM2.5 concentrations due to wildfire smoke only. Missing data at Kernville may result in incorrect display of previous day's AQI.


