Subject:

Tactical Pause—Focus on Risk Management

We are in the height of the 2020 Western fire season and we have been reminded that the wildland fire environment is dangerous whether you are on the ground or in the air. Along with the increase in fire activity, there has been an increase in close calls, serious accidents, injuries, and fatalities. Please honor those that have fallen, most recently our aviators, by actively managing risk. It is now late August and long-term fatigue is setting in, which exacerbates the complexity of a fire season made even more difficult by COVID-19.

We ask you to take a tactical pause at some point on Wednesday, September 2ND to discuss current risks to which you are exposed. The timing and length of this tactical pause is at your discretion. During this time stop, think, and talk about how you assess and mitigate risk. Ask yourself, your coworkers, or your crew what, if anything, is different from your previous experience and how are you dealing with it? What is concerning you specifically when it comes to your safety and those you work with or lead? What might you be missing? It is all too easy to be task oriented so take this opportunity to discuss some simple reminders or measures you can take to reduce your exposure to the inherent hazards of our occupation or COVID-19, which can reduce the probability of the next accident or illness.

Use references such as the Incident Response Pocket Guide (IRPG) to aid you in your discussions. The latest interagency wildland fire COVID-19 information can be found on the <u>Medical and Public Health Advisory Team (MPHAT) webpage</u>. The value of this tactical pause will be in the discussions you engage in so make it count.

We also recommend that you review and discuss *Planning for Medical Emergencies* (page #2) and the *Medical Incident Report* (page #118-119), also referred to as the "8-Line", in your IRPG. Reviewing and discussing these job aids will better prepare you to respond to an accident or medical emergency if one does occur.

Finally, NMAC wants to be clear that we care about the health and welfare of our responders. We are asking you to take this time to discuss risk management and do everything possible to ensure you return home safely at the end of each shift and each fire assignment.

WEATHER DISCUSSION: High pressure overhead will lead to hot, dry and more stable conditions over the next few days. With the more stable conditions smoke may remain in the valleys through much of the day keeping lower visibility in place. North to northeast drainage winds before 1000 with speeds 2 to 5 mph will become southeast to south and increase to around 4 to 9 gusts to 15 mph. After 1500, look for winds to shift to the southwest to west with speeds 4 to 7 gusts to 15 mph. Winds will continue to be heavily impacted by local terrain. Temperatures will be in the 80s to mid-90s, but may be held lower due to additional smoke cover. Poor overnight RH recoveries above the inversion.

SKY/WEATHER TODAY (WEDNESDAY): Hot and dry. Valley inversions lifting by early afternoon, but smoky conditions are expected to last through much of the day keeping lower visibilities. Morning downslope/downvalley winds will turn southeast to south after 1000 with speeds 4 to 9 mph with occasional gusts to 15 mph. A southwest to west wind push is expected in the afternoon after 1500 with winds 4 to 9 gusts to 15 mph. However, winds will be heavily affected by the local terrain.

MAX TEMPERATURES / MIN RELATIVE HUMIDITY:

5000 FT:

89 to 94 degrees (Up 1-2 Degrees) / 11 to 16% (Down 1-3%)

7000 FT:

79 to 84 degrees (Up 1-2 Degrees) / 13 to 18% (Little Change)

Slope/Valley:

North to northeast drainage winds up to 4 mph through 1000. Winds will gradually shift to the southeast to south after 1000 with speeds 4 to 9 mph gusting to 15 mph. Winds shifting to the west with gusts up to 15 mph after 1500. Winds will continue to be heavily

impacted by local terrain.

Ridges:

Southwest 4 to 7 mph occasional gusts to 12 mph in the afternoon.

MIXING HEIGHT...8,000 AGL VENTILATION...Poor morning, fair in the afternoon.

TRANSPORT WIND...Northeast around 5 mph in the morning, shifting to the west in the afternoon 5 to 10 mph.

FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL

<u>Fuels-</u> Fuels involved in the Castle Fire are primarily Fire Behavior Fuel Models (FBFM) timber litter and understory (TU5) in areas without recent fire history, and a mix of grass (GR2) and brush (GS2) in burn scars less than 20 years old. The Shotgun Fire is higher elevation and does not have recent fire history in its current footprint, and is more represented by a grass shrub (GS2) moderate timber litter (TL6).

Topography- Topography in the fire area is dominated by the Kern River. This river drainage runs north/south and is steep and narrow, roughly bisecting the fire area down the middle. Terrain has played a central role in fire spread, taking the predominantly SW flow and directing it in every way imaginable across the fire area.

<u>Weather</u> Hot and dry. Valley inversions lifting by early afternoon, but smoky conditions are expected to last through much of the day keeping lower visibilities. Haines is predicted to be a 4.

Branch I

Div. A/B/Z- When smoke cover clears, the fire will continue to actively chomp into the afternoon winds where rollout and terrain presents opportunity. West winds will follow terrain which could present as NW and SW winds on the fireline.

Div. C/G- The 2017 Lion fire continues to slow the fire progression but the fire is working its way around on both sides to the north up Leggett and Grasshopper Creek.

Div. Y- Periods of morning terrain influenced SE flow offer opportunities for slope/wind/aspect aligned runs towards values at risk west of the fire. As west wind follows terrain in the afternoon, possible W/NW winds may present on the fireline.

Branch V

Div. I/L/N/U- Fire continues to move to the NE towards Kern Peak and Overlook Peak thru Chinquapin Basin. Westerly winds along with terrain pushes the fire towards the east to Soda Flat, Long Canyon, Osa Meadows, and Lion Meadow.

Div. X- Down canyon winds after 2100 will continue to push the fire to the south through alignment with the terrain. The fire worked its way through the Schaeffer fire scar through available fuels to the east.

Shotgun Fire The fire slowly continues to progress to the drainages and find available fuel. If the fire finds its way across the creek bottom, expect a slope reversal and short terrain/ wind aligned runs.

AIR OPERATIONS

Smoke should lift between 1200-1300 to support air missions.

SAFETY

Maintain situational awareness when the smoke inversion lifts and fire behavior increases. Predicted wind directions may present different on the ground due to terrain influence.

RISKS & HAZARDS

<u>Smoke Exposure:</u> Line personnel that are involved in direct attack, line holding and mop up have the highest smoke exposures. Symptoms of over-exposure start with head aches & visual impairment, then impaired decision making, altered levels of consciousness and in extreme exposure cases, death from carbon monoxide poisoning. Consider rotating resources in and out of smoky areas & consider exposure time when developing mop up standards.

Ash Pit Hazards: Stump holes are abundant in the fire area. Use caution when using water to mop up and avoid straight streaming directly into the ash pit as scalding steam can suddenly erupt from the hole and burn you. Things to LOOK OUT for:

- Extensive root systems of trees and shrubs.
- Deep duff or peat, the organic layer covering mineral soil.
- Landscapes that have once been cultivated or manipulated by heavy equipment, old dozer piles, sawmills, timber sale yards, or decking areas.
- Small rodent holes that have become filled with decadent, combustible debris, beaver holes near dams and stream beds, badger and coyote dens.
- White ash is sometimes an indicator of ash pits as are swarms of hovering insects.
- With the sun behind the suspected ash pit, look for small nearly translucent smokes that dissipate quickly above the ground.
- Ash pits often give off the smell of incomplete combustion or of creosote burning.




Symptomatic individual guidance

Signs and symptoms of illnesses associated with wildland firefighting mimic COVID. Due to the remoteness of the fire and spike camps, guidance has been provided on dealing with symptomatic individuals.

A COVID evaluation process has been published as an attachment. Division Chiefs will be responsible for screening resources daily with module supervisors for COVID.

Personnel must wear masks when in camp and social distancing is not possible. Masks will help to limit the spread of COVID virus. A COVID outbreak in camp will shut down the fire suppression efforts, place colleagues at risk, and potentially have personnel pulled off the fire.



Fire and COVID-19 Briefing Checklist

Self-Awareness / Screening

- Notify supervisor if you or others experience:
 - o Cough, more than expected
 - o Difficulty breathing
 - o Loss of taste or smell
 - o Fever
 - o Chills
 - o Sore throat
 - o Muscle pain
- · Immediately separate yourself from others.
- Follow crew and division plans to isolate, triage, and transport symptomatic personnel.

Hygiene on the Fireline

- · Properly wash or sanitize your hands often
- · Avoid handshakes and communal use items
- · Inform supervisor of needed resupply.
- · Disinfect high touch surfaces often

Social distancing and protective equipment

- · Practice social distancing




