

<b>SEQUOIA COMPLEX - EAST ZONE INCIDENT OBJECTIVES</b>			
<b><u>Strategic Framework</u></b>			
Implement a full suppression strategy on the Castle and Shotgun Fires. Values at risk include human safety, private property and residences, infrastructure, utilities, developed sites, facilities, Giant Sequoia groves and archaeological and cultural sites. Apply tactics that offer the highest probability of success.			
<b><u>Leaders Intent</u></b>			
Provide the highest level of customer service to all involved with, or impacted by, the Castle and Shotgun Fires. Ensure transparent, timely and accurate communication at all levels of the incident. All incident assigned personnel should be prepared to take the appropriate actions regarding:			
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Professional behavior, conduct and timely/effective communications.</li> <li>• Personal safety and the safety of others, includes driving slowly, safely and defensively.</li> <li>• Fatigue management by taking breaks and maintaining work/rest cycles.</li> <li>• Minimize risk and limit exposure to COVID-19 by daily screening, minimizing large group settings, social distancing, wearing face coverings, hand washing and practicing module of one concept.</li> <li>• Effective management of incident costs by planning strategies and tactics toward a high probability of success in meeting incident objectives.</li> </ul>			
<b><u>Management Objectives</u></b>			
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Provide for firefighter and public safety through hazard recognition and application of the risk management process.</li> <li>• Reduce the threat to private property, residences and infrastructure through the application of effective suppression tactics.</li> <li>• Reduce the impacts to the Golden Trout Wilderness values by ensuring minimum impact suppression tactics (MIST) are applied. Utilize historic fire control lines, trails, streams, ridges and natural barriers when possible for control lines.</li> <li>• Coordinate suppression activities with assigned incident resource advisors to minimize adverse effects to natural and cultural resources, on riparian areas, watersheds, Spotted Owl and Goshawk PACs, Fisher, Little Kern Golden Trout, Mountain Yellow Legged Frog, and Sierra Nevada Bighorn Sheep Habitats.</li> <li>• Mop up as safety allows to reduce the threat of fire spread outside of containment lines.</li> <li>• Conduct suppression repair activities to prevent long term damage to resources.</li> </ul>

To prevent the fires from spreading to private property, surrounding communities, and values at risk, keep the fire:			
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• North of Durrwood Camp to protect communities and infrastructure along the Kern River.</li> <li>• West of Toowa Range to Kingfisher Ridge to 22S05 Road to protect recreational and administrative infrastructure.</li> <li>• South of East Castle Fire containment lines to limit fire growth to the north.</li> <li>• East of Tule River Reservation.</li> <li>• Within perimeter of Shotgun fire to limit fire growth.</li> </ul>

**WEATHER DISCUSSION:**

**\*\*\*Above Normal Temperatures\*\*\***

Today starts a multi-day stretch of warming with the return of above normal temperatures. Expect ridgetop winds to favor an easterly direction, the wind flow coming from the desert side of the Sierra Nevada Mountains. Humidity minimums are expected to return to the teens with poor humidity recovery at night. The visibility is also expected to improve during the afternoon due to deeper mixing, but smoke may still settle back into the valleys and canyons at night.

**SKY/WEATHER TODAY (SUNDAY):** Mostly Sunny much warmer and drier. Inversion lifting between 1000-Noon. Better afternoon ventilation with visibilities improving from the east.

**5000 FT:** 82 to 88 degrees (Up 7) / 14 to 18 (Down 10)

## FIRE BEHAVIOR

**GENERAL:** With warmer dryer conditions and a wind direction change, expect more active smoldering and visible flames on heavier fuels. No forward fire progression is expected and any spot fires should be easily handled by direct attack. Most of the fire continues to be in a backing alignment. All fuels are available to burn and will be receptive to spotting. Spots from roll out will continue to be problematic. Expect single and group tree torching in the denser stands of timber and brush fields. Spotting distances will be short range up to 200 to 400 feet. Rates of spread on slopes will be 4-8 chains per hour with 2-4 foot flame lengths in the timber.

**Division Y/W:** No forward fire progression expected above Coy Creek. From DP7 west towards the Little Kern drainage (Slate Mt.) expect mainly smoldering and creeping. Interior pockets of heat and snags have the potential to throw spots over established lines. With the wind direction change both Divisions could hold smoke longer.

**Division Z:** No forward fire progression is expected. Burning snags will be a source for spotting. If fire becomes established across your lines it should have a slow rate of spread.

**Division L:** No forward fire progression is expected. Keep a heads up for sources of spotting near the lines. Most of the Division will start to clear out of the smoke with the wind direction change. Small interior islands will continue to burn out but none are expected to impact current lines.

**Night:** Expect the fire to remain active in thermal belts or until the RH recovers above 25-30%. No forward fire progression expected on any division.

## AIR OPERATIONS


Inversion layer with smoke will be present until at least the 1000-1200hr time period  
Do not base your plan on air they might not be able to get there.

## SAFETY

\*\*\*Fire will become active at RH% below 25% and clear skies. Slope and heavy fuels will enhance fire intensity.\*\*\*

Remember tragedies often occur on quite sections of line.

  - Can I survive in my current safety zone given the current weather conditions or should I reestablish another safety zone?
- Continue to take spot weather for updated local weather conditions. Your input will help validate and update the forecast and fire behavior.
- Will your speed allow you to slow down or stop if you encounter a another vehicle or animal around the next curve?

**Step 4:** Once you have completed the steps above, **ALL** resources must go to Porterville-ICP to complete weed wash and close your financial package.

**Step 5:** When you have completed weed wash and your finance package is finished, scan the QR Code to enter your DEMOB travel information.

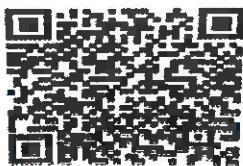

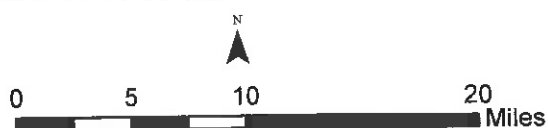
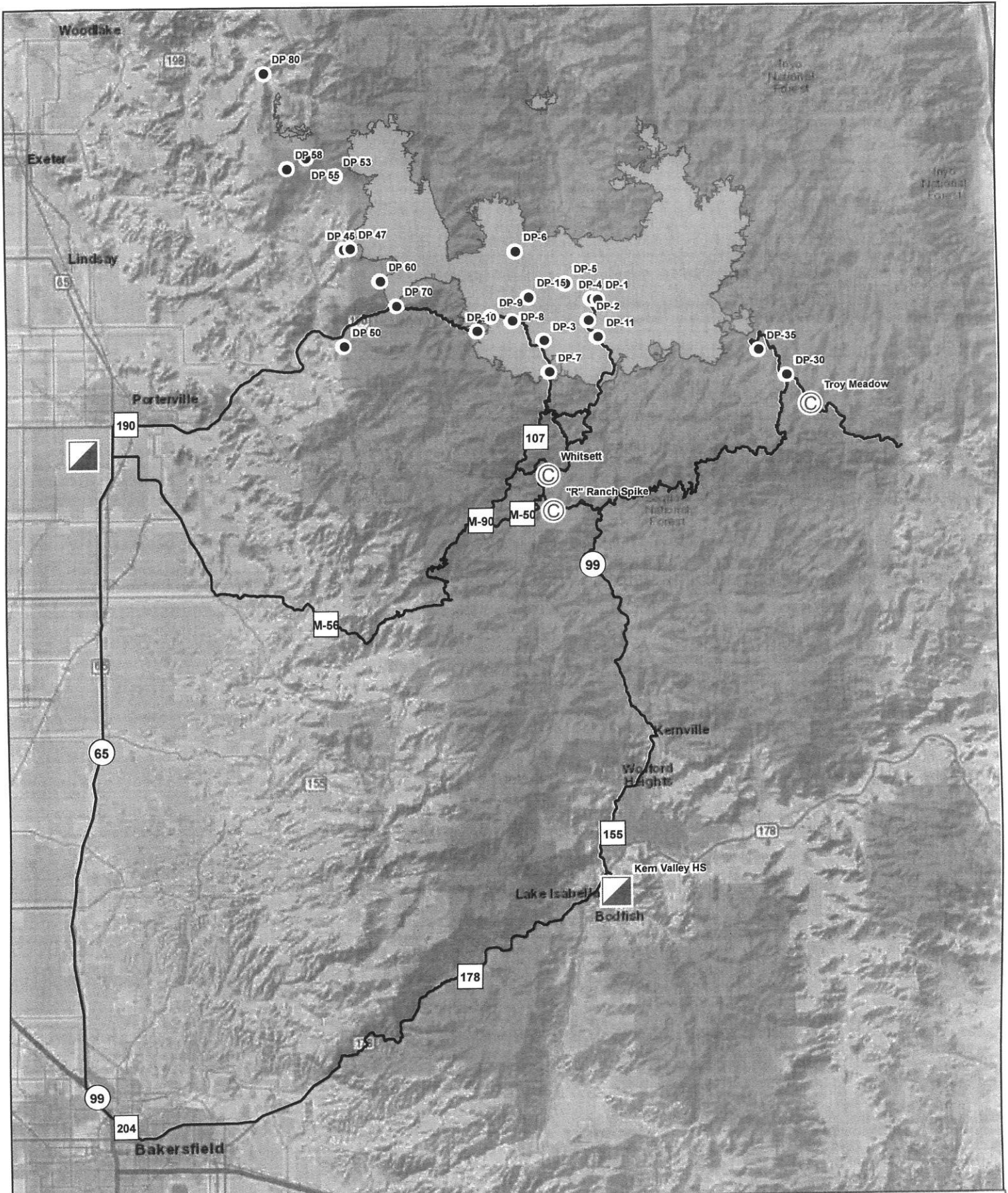
