- Management Objectives**
- Provide for the safety of firefighters and the public through utilization of strategic and deliberate risk assessment processes. Ensure incident within an incident protocols are established.
 - Develop and implement operational objectives based on identified values at risk and highest probability of success limiting fire spread.
 - Follow established guidelines and mitigations regarding COVID and other infectious diseases.
 - Enhance relationships through timely communication and active involvement with the public, stakeholders, and cooperators.
 - Coordinate with the READ's to ensure natural, cultural, and historical values are protected.
 - Maintain fiscal responsibility keeping cost commensurate with the values at risk.
 - Provide initial attack response to new fire starts within the TFR boundary. Assist with initial attack efforts outside the boundary as requested.

- Control Objectives**
- Keep the fire North of Keysville while providing for structure defense where appropriate.
 - Provide structure defense to the communities of Alta Sierra, Wofford Heights, and other mountain communities while keeping the fire south of the Tulare County line.
 - Keep the fire East of Granite Road while providing for structure defense where appropriate.
 - Provide structure defense to the communities of Kernville, River Kern and other mountain communities while keeping the fire west of Highway 155, Burlando Rd. and Sierra Way Mountain Highway 99.

General Situational Awareness:

Steep and rugged terrain, critically dry and receptive fuel beds, active area for fire history and drought stressed trees with historic mining in the area.

All persons must wear a mask indoors at all times regardless of vaccinated status, as well as outdoors when physical distancing cannot be maintained.

Maintain a module as one, wash your hands, and sanitize surfaces.

Weather Discussion: For today, expect another round of warm and very dry conditions at all elevations. Winds within the State Highway 155 corridor will shift from light up canyon to down canyon during the afternoon, with a few gusts over 20 mph possible. In addition, dry and unstable conditions will lead to a Haines of 5. Very dry conditions will persist through the overnight hours. Humidity may remain below 20% in the Alta Sierra area through the night, with humidity struggling to rise above 30% near Wofford Heights. Winds will lighten up after 2000. Hot and dry conditions are forecast from Friday into the weekend, with high temperatures at or above 100 degrees at the lower elevations. In addition, a Haines of 5 is forecast each afternoon.

FUELS:

Fire areas include a range of conifer systems in the upper elevations above 5000', transitioning into scrub oak, sage, and annual grasses on the eastern slope down to Lake Isabella. Areas to the West of the fire transition from timber up top to a mix of Oak and annual grass understory. Anticipate heavy fuel loading, drought stress, bug kill, and a lack of fire history to the west of the fire, with a mix of Ponderosa Pine, White Fir, and Incense Cedar.

The area is currently classified as 'Exceptional' drought by the US Drought Monitor, with Energy Release Components exceeding the 90th percentile, not far off all time high levels. Heavy dead and down fuels will likely burn completely, holding heat and actively consuming through all hours of the day. Fine dead fuel moisture is calculated at 3% or less.

Specific

Div. A/E/Alta Sierra Structure Group Persistent weather inputs, persistent fire behavior outputs. Gusty, very dry winds and good atmospheric lift will aid more backing and rollout which will elevate into slope reversals and wind aligned runs with long range spotting within the WUI and north into the Cedar Fire scar. There is potential for these spots within the scar to continue their march NE to the north end and outside of this 2016 burn area.

Div. M/N Potential for both short and long range spotting from A/E for more high severity runs in closed timber and pushes into the Cedar Fire scar. Limited RH recover and drought stress will keep ground fire active, spots will burn down and move until they find ladder fuels into the canopies to support more torching, more spotting. Within the Shirley Fire scar anticipate more dry gusty winds trying their best to scour out heat sources and spot across control lines along the 02/Old State Roads.

O/R Lots of good work on the ground has halted fire spread; be heads up for interior spotting lofting embers across lines as well as fire weakened trees in work areas.

Div. Y This area had very large spread potential and threat to values at risk to the east; for several days gusty afternoon winds kept pushing the fire aggressively. Continue to hold all that good work in place, watching for flare ups or spots over containment lines.

Div. Z Active backing supported by the clean, dry, gusty winds from the West. Watch for fires to find sideways alignment that could spot moderate distances over containment lines.

Night Divisions: Expect another hot handoff from Day Shift and limited moderation of fire activity given the poor overnight RH. Winds may back off a bit but they'll still be enough to push the fire downslope.

AIR OPERATIONS:

Anticipate smoke to clear enough to support air missions by 1300

SAFETY:

Very active to extreme fire behavior is becoming standard ops for the Fire service. Don't forget the basics, post lookouts that can see the fire and your location and know where to go if the fire stands up and exceeds suppression capabilities.

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Hazards & Risks

ATV/UTV Safety: UTV's & ATV's are great fireline tools to expedite equipment and personnel movement around more remote areas of the fire, HOWEVER there are regulations that govern the operation and safety of the vehicles. Operators (drivers) must have had the appropriate level of training by their agency. Also, per Forest Service:

FS – UTV Helmet (for fire use) – must meet the policy within the Safety Handbook (6709.11), Chapter 70, 71.12; Exhibit 01 states “Specialized Equipment, such as ATVs, UTVs, Dirt Bikes, Snowmobiles (Department of Transportation-approved helmet).”
Wearing hardhats while driving or riding on a UTV is not allowed. Forest Service policy provides no exception to the helmet requirement for low speeds, smooth travel surfaces, or administrative use. UTV Helmet (for fire use) requirements are the same as ATV use. Helmets must meet Snell, or DOT ANSI certification. A 3/4 face model meeting Snell or DOT certification is acceptable for use. Use of half “shorty” helmets requires a JHA/RA for fireline use approved by the Incident Commander or relevant Line Officer and must include justification for its use.



