**3. Objective(s):**

- Management Objectives**
- Provide for the safety of firefighters and the public through utilization of strategic and deliberate risk assessment processes. Ensure incident within an incident protocols are established.
  - Develop and implement operational objectives based on identified values at risk and highest probability of success limiting fire spread.
  - Follow established guidelines and mitigations regarding COVID and other infectious diseases.
  - Enhance relationships through timely communication and active involvement with the public, stakeholders, and cooperators.
  - Coordinate with the READ's to ensure natural, cultural, and historical values are protected.
  - Maintain fiscal responsibility keeping cost commensurate with the values at risk.
  - Provide initial attack response to new fire starts within the TFR boundary. Assist with initial attack efforts outside the boundary as requested.

- Control Objectives**
- Keep the fire North of Keysville while providing for structure defense where appropriate.
  - Provide structure defense to the communities of Alta Sierra, Wofford Heights, and other mountain communities while keeping the fire south of the Tulare County line.
  - Keep the fire East of Granite Road while providing for structure defense where appropriate.
  - Provide structure defense to the communities of Kernville, River Kern and other mountain communities while keeping the fire west of Highway 155, Burlando Rd. and Sierra Way Mountain Highway 99.

**General Situational Awareness:**

Steep and rugged terrain, critically dry and receptive fuel beds, active area for fire history and drought stressed trees with historic mining in the area.

All persons must wear a mask indoors at all times regardless of vaccinated status, as well as outdoors when physical distancing cannot be maintained.

Maintain a module as one, wash your hands, and sanitize surfaces.

**Weather Discussion:** For today, strong high pressure will bring near triple digit heat to the lower elevations of the fire with afternoon humidity near 10%. These hot and dry conditions will combine with instability to produce a Haines of 5. Southwest ridgetop winds in the morning will become more westerly in the afternoon with a few gusts above 20 mph possible. Winds will decrease after 2000, but poor humidity recoveries are forecast for tonight. Hot and dry weather will continue on Sunday and Monday.

### FUELS:

Fire areas include a range of conifer systems in the upper elevations above 5000', transitioning into scrub oak, sage, and annual grasses on the eastern slope down to Lake Isabella. Areas to the West of the fire transition from timber up top to a mix of Oak and annual grass understory. Anticipate heavy fuel loading, drought stress, bug kill, and a lack of fire history to the west of the fire, with a mix of Ponderosa Pine, White Fir, and Incense Cedar.

The area is currently classified as 'Exceptional' drought by the US Drought Monitor, with Energy Release Components exceeding the 90<sup>th</sup> percentile, not far off all time high levels. Heavy dead and down fuels will likely burn completely, holding heat and actively consuming through all hours of the day. Fine dead fuel moisture is calculated at 3% or less.

**\*\*More testing lines for all areas of the Fire with higher temperatures, single digit RH, and persistent winds from the West.**

**Div. E/H/K/Alta Sierra Structure Group** Gusty, very dry winds and good atmospheric lift will aid more backing and rollout which will elevate into slope reversals and wind aligned runs with long range spotting within the WUI and north into the Cedar and Way Fire scars. There is potential for these spots within the scar to continue their march NE to the north end and outside of this 2016 burn area.

**Div. M/N** Any spotting across lines may find open space islands within the Wofford Heights community and produce rapid spread rates. Within the Shirley Fire scar anticipate more dry gusty winds trying their best to scour out heat sources and spot across control lines along the 02/Old State Roads.

**O/R** Lots of good work on the ground has halted fire spread; be heads up for interior spotting lofting embers across lines as well as fire weakened trees in work areas.

**Div. Y** This area had very large spread potential and threat to values at risk to the east; for several days gusty afternoon winds kept pushing the fire aggressively. Continue to hold all that good work in place, watching for flare ups or spots over containment lines. There is potential for spotting near the Y/Z break or within Zulu proper to create problematic fire spread that flanks current containment lines to the south and east.

**Div. Z** Active backing supported by the clean, dry, gusty winds from the West. Watch for fires to find sideways alignment that could spot moderate distances over containment lines and push towards Division Yankee.

**Night Divisions:** Expect another hot handoff from Day Shift and limited moderation of fire activity given the poor overnight RH. Winds may back off a bit but they'll still be enough to push the fire downslope.

#### AIR OPERATIONS:

Anticipate smoke to clear enough to support air missions by 1300

#### SAFETY:

By now we're becoming used to triple digit temperatures, single digit RH, and gusty late afternoon winds. Critical fire weather conditions that will result in rapid changes in fire behavior with a right place, right time spot fire or interior flare up. Don't let your guard down.

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### **Hazards & Risks**

**Look Up, Down & Around:** Fire weather and behavior trends are reflecting fire environment factors that should cause us to take a pause in our fire line tactics and take time to look up, down, around. Factors include a weather pattern that is getting hotter and dryer; fuel bed characteristics that are receptive to easy ignition and rapid fire spread (PIG ~90%); steep topography that is conducive to rapid uphill spread; and rapidly changing fire behavior. Take some time to review the factors and indicators outlined in the IRPG (pg. 3 & 4). Make it a point during each shift to stop and **Look UP, Down & Around.**

**Steep Terrain and Rolling Stuff!** : With very steep terrain in all Divisions comes rolling rocks, logs, and humans. Watch your footing and avoid working below other personnel and equipment working above you. Stagger yourselves as you hike up and down the fireline and watch your spacing.

**Lookouts:** Posting Lookouts is an invaluable tool for gathering information on fire behavior & weather and its potential impacts to crews working on the fireline. Lookouts should be experienced, competent & trusted. They should have knowledge of crew locations, escape routes, safety zones, trigger points and possess a map, weather kit, watch & IAP. Good communications with crews are essential!



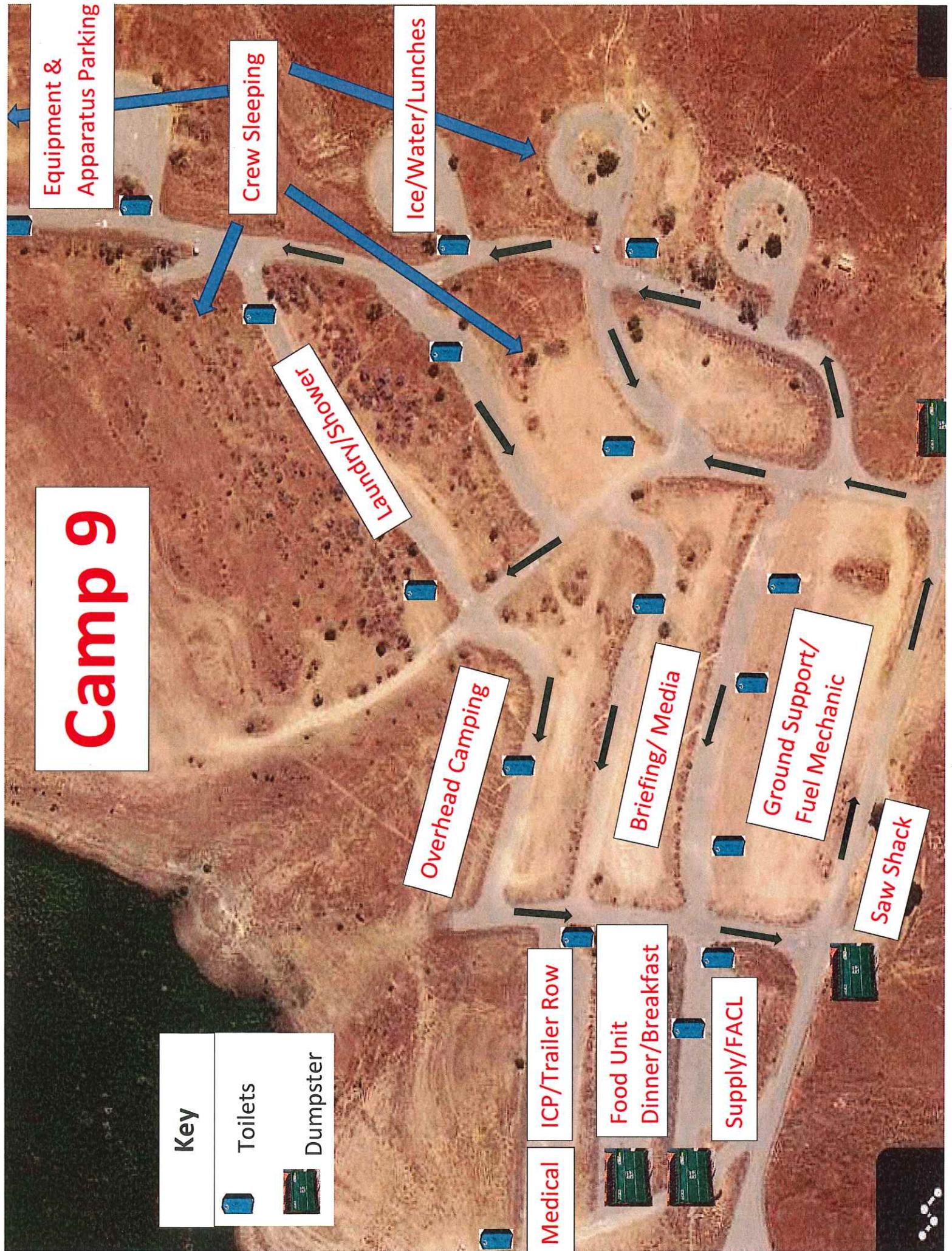
