<u>Weather Discussion</u>: For today, subtropical moisture will slide into the area associated with the remnants of what was Tropical System Nora. This moisture will bring increasing cloud cover and a 20% chance of VERY light rain showers to the area. Despite that, strong west to northwest winds and afternoon humidity near 15% will bring a round of near critical fire weather conditions to the fire during the afternoon and early evening. Winds will be a bit stronger than yesterday, with some gusts above 30 mph possible. Although it's very unlikely, if a stray shower does move over the fire, gusty winds from erratic directions is possible. There is no chance for lightning or wetting rainfall.

### WEATHER SUMMARY: See detailed Fire Weather Forecast in IAP

### **FUELS:**

Fire areas include a range of conifer systems in the upper elevations above 5000', transitioning into scrub oak, sage, and annual grasses on the eastern slope down to Lake Isabella. Areas to the West of the fire transition from timber up top to a mix of chaparral, Oak and annual grass understory. Anticipate heavy fuel loading, drought stress, bug kill, and a lack of fire history throughout the fire area, with some grazing to the West of the Forest boundary.

The area is currently classified as 'Exceptional' drought by the US Drought Monitor, with Energy Release Components exceeding the 90<sup>th</sup> percentile, not far off all time high levels. Heavy dead and down fuels will likely burn completely, holding heat and actively consuming through all hours of the day. Fine dead fuel moisture is calculated at 3% or less.

**Div.A/E** As the fire backs down from timber into a heavy brush fuel model, in places its only burning the understory and has potential to reburn as a slope driven run in the canopies. Terrain heavily influences direction of travel for these upslope runs. Afternoon winds are primarily upslope/SW but expect squirrelly winds along the bottom of the drainage.

**H/K** Gusty winds and low RH will put these areas to the test yet again, but great job in this very rough terrain with extensive snag challenges.

Alta Sierra/Wofford Structure Groups Drought stressed vegetation and soils will create long term smoldering and creeping with the occasional torching/spotting event within the communities.

**Div. M/N** Limited spread potential remains with all the good work securing these divisions, but gusty afternoon winds could support rapid spread rates outside containment lines.

**O/R** Lots of good work on the ground has halted fire spread; be heads up for interior spotting lofting embers across lines as well as fire weakened trees in work areas.

**Div. Y** Critical holding piece is holding due to the strong work and good decision making of Night/Day resources. Long duration burn down of fuels will keep the threat of SE movement up if gusty NW winds surface today.

**Div. Z** Active backing supported by the clean, dry, gusty winds from the West. Watch for fires to find sideways alignment that could spot moderate distances over containment lines and push towards and below Divisions Alpha and Yankee.

**Night Divisions:** Focus area will likely again be the SW portion of the fire with daytime spread rates and spotting distances until the winds let up or RH recovers.

### **AIR OPERATIONS:**

Anticipate smoke to clear enough to support air missions by 1000 or earlier

### **SAFETY:**

We have a wildcard in the mix today with tropical moisture bringing the threat of erratic outflow winds. We know what the fire wants to do with West winds but game out wind scenarios from different directions today.

What do you look for in a fireline parking spot? Look up, look down, look all around.

- Look for cold black, bare soil, sparsely vegetated areas, plowed fields, or other natural or humanmade barriers. Be careful to not get stuck in soft soils.
- Complete a walk around looking for ash pits, penetrating stobs, unburned adjacent fuel, snags, or other hazards that may damage the apparatus.
- Do not block the access or egress of others. Be careful to not block dozer lines, safety zones, or helispots. Back in and face your danger when turning around. Chock your tires.

<u>Safety Zones:</u> A safety zone is an area where a firefighter can survive without a fire shelter. The separation distance between firefighter and flames should be at least 4X the maximum flame height. This is based on flat terrain and no wind conditions. Safety Zones that are downwind and/or upslope from the fire will require larger separation distances. Reference your IRPG for detailed safety zone size calculations. Ensure your escape route is clear of hazards and known to all.




