- Provide for the safety of firefighters and the public through utilization of strategic and deliberate risk assessment processes. Ensure incident within an incident protocols are established.
 - Develop and implement operational objectives based on identified values at risk and highest probability of success limiting fire spread.
 - Follow established guidelines and mitigations regarding COVID and other infectious diseases.
 - Enhance relationships through timely communication and active involvement with the public, stakeholders, and cooperators.
 - Coordinate with the READ's to ensure natural, cultural, and historical values are protected.
 - Maintain fiscal responsibility keeping cost commensurate with the values at risk.
 - Provide initial attack response to new fire starts within the TFR boundary. Assist with initial attack efforts outside the boundary as requested.

- Control Objectives**
- Keep the fire North of Keysville while providing for structure defense where appropriate.
 - Keep the fire out of the communities of Alta Sierra and Wofford Heights and south of Highway 155.
 - Keep the fire East of the forest boundary.
 - Keep the fire West of Wofford Blvd (Highway 155) while providing for structure defense where appropriate.

General Situational Awareness:

Steep and rugged terrain, critically dry and receptive fuel beds, active area for fire history and drought stressed trees with historic mining in the area.

All persons must wear a mask indoors at all times regardless of vaccinated status, as well as outdoors when physical distancing cannot be maintained.

Maintain a module of one, wash your hands, and sanitize surfaces.

.DISCUSSION...

Dry with seasonal temperatures expected through the weekend. Winds will remain mostly southerly and terrain driven. The shift in weather disturbances aloft will change the direction of transport (and ridge) winds to a more southwesterly, and occasional westerly, component through the weekend. Clearing over the burn site from the west will begin around sunset on Saturday and continue throughout the night. Dry weather will persist through at least the latter part of next week.

FUELS:

Fire areas include a range of conifer systems in the upper elevations above 5000', transitioning into scrub oak, sage, and annual grasses on the eastern slope down to Lake Isabella. Anticipate heavy fuel loading, drought stress, bug kill, and a lack of fire history to the west of the fire, with a mix of Ponderosa Pine, White Fir, and Incense Cedar.

The area is currently classified as 'Exceptional' drought by the US Drought Monitor, with Energy Release Components exceeding the 90th percentile, not far off all time high levels. Heavy dead and down fuels will likely burn completely, holding heat and actively consuming through all hours of the day. Fine dead fuel moisture is calculated at 3% or less.

GENERAL/Potential:

DAY: Another active fire growth day is possible with increased winds from the Southwest and West. Fire is well established in a broad area of upper elevation, dense timber that will hold heat for extended periods of time with ladder fuels to elevate fire into the crowns. Terrain will enhance, redirect, and block winds so spread rates and intensities will vary widely across the fire area.

SPECIFIC

Division A: Be heads up for fire that has moved into Alder Creek as winds from the W/SW may support slope aligned runs up towards Alta Sierra.

Division M: Shirley Creek has the potential to line up with these W/SW winds as well, posing threat of spread down towards Highway 155 and Wofford Heights. Fire seems to be holding within the Shirley Fire scar, but be aware of long range spotting that could find ways through the lesser fuels.

Division Y: Increased winds from the West will scour any heat sources and may push embers outside of existing perimeter lines to the East. Anticipate rapid rates of spread where wind can push fully cured grass and low brush.

Division Z: Winds should be much more favorable today, but look out for lateral movement especially closer to the Y/Z division break.

Night Division: Anticipate daytime burning conditions to continue well into the night, seeing relief with a decrease in winds and/or relative humidity recovery.

AIR OPERATIONS:

Potential for some clearing of smoke between 1100-1900 today

SAFETY:

Major wind shift from yesterday's SE flow, we now have a wide spread of fire in new areas with another round of gusty Westerly winds. *Potential for another large growth day, so know what your fire is doing at all times.*



Health & Safety Message

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Hazards & Risks

Heavy Equipment Operations: Working with dozers, excavators, etc. presents unique hazards to firefighters. *Reference your IRPG* to review safety considerations when using heavy equipment on the fireline. Also, understand the performance capabilities of heavy equipment and establish good communications between the operator and swamper while they are operating in your work area. Consider road access limitations for low-boy transports and the impacts it may have on ingress and egress routes for fire traffic.

Structure Protection Safety: Structure protection operations are inherently dangerous because it frequently involves indirect firefighting. Things to consider: fire behavior, both observed and predicted; is an adequate **safety zone** available at the site; structure size up and triage considerations and available water supply and resources to support the operation. Reference pages 12-16 in the IRPG for structure protection details.

Mine Shaft Reminder: There are both active and abandoned mines throughout the fire area. **Don't get Shafted!!**

Public Encounters: There may be an increase in public encounters between fire personnel, local residents and forest visitors this coming weekend within the fire area. Be aware of increased traffic flow on all the highways and forest roads. Area closures are in place but not everyone knows of them or chooses to abide by them. Be respectful of private property boundaries and make efforts to avoid confrontations. Remember that the local folks are dealing with us and this fire.



