

Incident Management Team Transition

- Sometimes called the 19th Watch Out Situation
- Take the time to understand the plan. Ensure all resources completely understand the assignment, the Communications Plan, and the Medical Plan.
- Supervisory positions have changed. Know who you are working for.
 Briefings: Required every shift, for all personnel, for new assignments, and for changing conditions.

Planning for Medical Emergencies (see IRPG Page 2)

Prior to each operational period, Incident Commanders, supervisors, and all wildland firefighters need to ask and be able to answer the following three questions:

- 1. What are we going to do if someone gets hurt?
 - Are there personnel on your crew/division/fire that can provide medical support?
 - What type of equipment is available to treat and transport injured personnel?
- 2. How will we get them out of here?
 - Could you get an injured firefighter to a road or to a helispot?
 - How many personnel and what kind of equipment would you need to get an injured firefighter out?
- 3. How long will it take to get them to a hospital?
 - Where is the closest hospital?
 - Will you use air or ground transportation?
 - Could conditions change and affect the transportation timeline?
- Smoke/clouds/nightfall
- Fire behavior
- Mechanical failures

Risk Management Process: Implement the risk management process for all aspects of this ongoing event. The steps of the risk management process are:

- 1. Situation Awareness
- 2. Hazard Assessment
- 3. Hazard Control
- 4. Decision Point
- 5. Evaluate

- ◆ TAKE CHARGE of assigned resources.
- ♦ MOTIVATE firefighters with a "can-do safety attitude.

- SUPERVISE at the scene of action.



Giant sequoias are among the world's largest and longest-lived trees, reaching 2,500-3,000 years old. They grow naturally only on California's Sierra Nevada mountain range. They are fire adapted, and the trees survived low intensity fires every 10-15 years that removed fallen branches, leaves, logs, and other fuels while promoting seed germination. Historically, fire rarely killed mature giant sequoias. However, we now know they are vulnerable to high severity fire.

AT LEAST 10% of the world's Giant sequoias were lost during the Castle Fire last year.



THANK YOU FOR PROTECTING THE GIANT SEQUIA GROVES! Use these BMP's to help protect the big trees:

- Think of protecting old growth sequoias like a structure.
- Remove surface and ladder fuels from under sequoias. Remove nonsequoia conifers up to 16" diameter. Scatter or chip fuel away from sequoias.
- Scrape duff and fuel from around sequoias, prioritize clearing out cat faces and old fire scars.
