

### INPUTS

**WEATHER SUMMARY:**                    **\*\*\* Smokey, Warm and Dry....Again\*\*\***  
 Smoky conditions will persist today. Afternoon temperatures to lower 80s. Afternoon relative humidity into the 20-30% range with moderate recovery tonight. At the ridgetops, easterly winds will prevail during the night and morning hours with westerly winds in the afternoon and evening hours. Diurnal, terrain-driven, winds will at lower elevations.

#### Day

**Max. Temperatures-** 72°-82° **Min. Humidity-** 20 to 30% **Winds-** W/SW to 10 mph, **Gusting 16 with Terrain!**

#### Night

**Min. Temperatures-** 46°-56° **Max. Humidity-** 40 to 55% **Winds-** Becoming N/NE, and downslope to 10 mph

### OUTPUTS

#### FIRE BEHAVIOR

##### GENERAL:

- Smoke and haze can hide spot fires until well established.... **Lookouts will be tested!**
- If you can breathe better, so can the fire... **Improved Visibility Equals More Active Fire!**
- All fuel sizes are receptive and carrying fire... **Expect, and plan for, frequent spotting!**
- Steep terrain will foster rollout as heavy fuels are weakened by deep seated fire.
- This fire remains fuels driven... **But Ventilation Dependent...Read Your Smoke Often!**
- Expect drift smoke from regional fires to reduce your visibility.... **AND** situational awareness!
- Backing fire is consuming all fuels **COMPLETELY**... identify all your areas of slope reversal!

##### SPECIFIC:

- **All Divisions: All Sizes of Fuels are very DRY, very AVAILABLE, very RECEPTIVE...**

**Flame Lengths-** 2-6 ft. in Grass, Up to 30 ft. in Brush/Understory... Diminishing after midnight

**Rate of Spread-** Up to 20 chains/hour in Grass, Up to 80 chains/hour in Brush... Slowing overnight

**Spotting Distances-** Up to .25 miles from Grass/Brush, Up to 1 mile in Timber (From Torching)

**Probability of Ignition-** (Day) Unshaded Up to 80% - Shaded Up to 50% (Night) Down to <40%

##### AIR OPERATIONS:

**Sunrise: 06:46**

**Sunset: 18:50**

Expect poor smoke dispersion before the inversion breaks by early afternoon. Limited thereafter. Mixing heights start out at less than 1000 feet; rise to 10,000 AGL; then returning to less than 1000 feet after sunset. Anticipate terrain induced turbulence in the Tule and Kern River corridors, especially during peak hours of afternoon heating.

## Traffic Safety

With continued physically demanding operational periods, expect and monitor fatigue of all crew members working in and around your division. Take the following steps to limit and address traffic safety:

- Follow work/rest guidelines.
- Closed roads may still have civilian traffic. Watch you speeds!
- Headlights and/or emergency lights should be on during smokey conditions.
- Rocks and trees will continue to come down and impact the roads where fire has burned through. Use additional caution when traveling through these areas!

## Safety Around Heavy Equipment Operations

- Never assume that the operator can see you, especially at night.
- Ensure that communications are established with the operator.
- Use hand signals if other communications are unavailable.
- Maintain a 50' to 100' exclusion area around equipment. Beware of flying objects!
- Use a spotter when backing.

## Hazard Tree Safety

Hazard trees, both dead snags and live green trees, are one of the most common risks encountered on the fireline. All firefighters should frequently survey their work area for potential hazard trees.

### Situation Awareness

#### Environment:

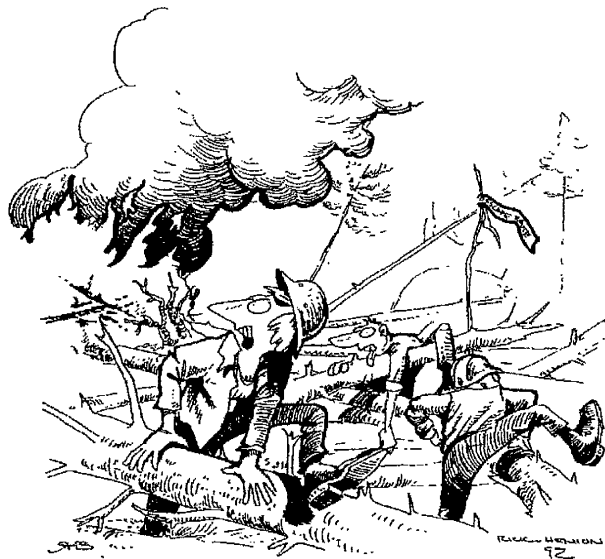
- Current and forecasted winds
- Night operations
- Steep slopes
- Diseased or bug-kill areas
- Number and height of hazard trees
- Anticipated burn-down time
- Potential for trees to domino

#### Hazard tree indicators:

- Trees burning for any period of time
- High risk tree species (rot and shallow roots)
- Numerous downed trees
- Dead, broken, or burning tops and limb overhead
- Accumulation of downed limbs
- Absence of needles, bark or limbs
- Leaning or hung-up

17. TERRAIN AND FUELS MAKE ESCAPE TO SAFETY ZONES DIFFICULT



- Provide structure prep within the community of Fairview along Mountain 99 and structures along the 22S16 Road in the Vincent/Tobias Meadow areas south of the fire's edge.



o If resource is positive for any symptoms including fever (over 100.4) at entry **DO NOT ANNOUNCE**-ask to step aside.

o Escort sick individual to isolation area.

o Isolation support personnel should begin documentation. Have sick individual contact Supervisor for further direction.

o Notify public health officials.

o Have individual transported as appropriate.

o Protect and secure any collected Personal Identifiable Information or Personal Health Information.

**Giant sequoias** are among the world's largest and longest-lived trees, reaching 2,500-3,000 years old. They grow naturally **only** on California's

Sierra Nevada mountain range. They are fire adapted, and the trees survived low intensity fires every 10-15 years that removed fallen branches, leaves, logs, and other fuels while promoting seed germination. Historically, fire rarely killed mature giant sequoias. However,

**we now know they are vulnerable to high severity fire.**  
**AT LEAST 10% of the world's Giant sequoias were lost during the Castle Fire last year.**



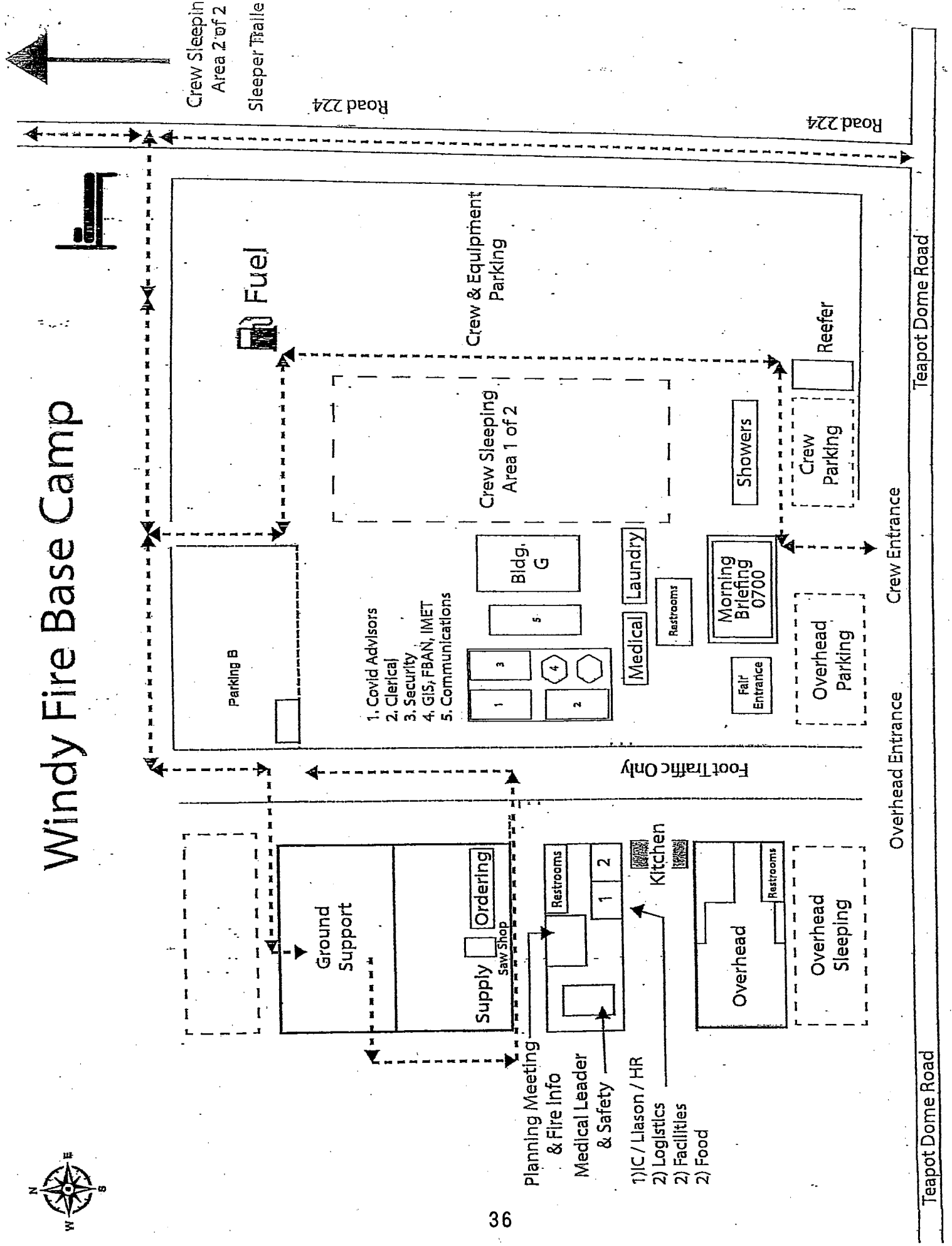
