**3. Objective(s):**

**Leaders Intent**

- An aggressive full suppression strategy will be implemented using direct tactics when safe to do so. Efforts will be made to minimize impacts to residences, the giant sequoia groves and critical infrastructure through the application of well planned tactical responses.

**Management Objectives**

- Ensure that strategies and tactics provide for firefighter and public safety through the application of sound risk management principles.
- Minimize the threat to private and public property located on the Tule River Reservation, local communities, Peppermint Work center, giant sequoia groves, California Spotted Owl and Goshawk PACs, cultural resources and the Slate Mountain Botanical Area.
- Establish and enhance cooperators, partner, and stakeholder relationships.
- Follow identified CDC, local, state, and federal procedures to minimize the spread of COVID-19.
- Minimize the cost of the incident by employing tactics that have the highest probability of success while minimizing firefighter exposure.

**Control Objectives**

- Keep the fire North of Highway 155.
- Keep the fire South of Western Divide Highway 190.
- Keep the fire East of Cow Mountain Peak, Oak Flat Peak and Gibbon Peak.
- Keep the fire West of of Kern River.

**General Situational Awareness:**

- Steep and rugged terrain, critically dry and receptive fuel beds, active area for fire history and drought stressed trees.
- In the COVID-19 environment, high density populations or large groups are particularly at risk. To help protect yourself, your family and to ensure all employees return home safely, make sure to practice social distancing.
- Enhanced hygiene (especially handwashing), PPE & monitoring practices help limit the infection rate of first responders.



**WEATHER DISCUSSION:** Smoky conditions will persist across the incident today. Afternoon temperatures will top out in the 70s to lower 80s. Afternoon relative humidity will drop into the 20-30% range with moderate recovery anticipated tonight and Sunday morning. At the ridgetops, easterly winds will prevail during the night and morning hours with westerly winds in the afternoon and evening hours. Typical diurnal, terrain-driven, winds will persist at lower elevations

### **WEATHER FORECAST FOR TODAY:**

**WEATHER:** Mostly clear. Areas of smoke.

**MAX TEMPERATURES:** 68-78.

**MIN HUMIDITY:** 22-32%.

**20 FT WINDS:**

**RIDGETOP -** North to northeast 4-8 MPH becoming southwest to west 5-10 MPH with gusts 14-20 MPH in the afternoon.

**SLOPE/VALLEY -** Variable/upslope 4-8 MPH becoming upvalley 4-8 MPH with gusts 12-16 MPH in the afternoon.

**Rate of Spread-** Up to 20 chains/hour in Grass, Up to 80 chains/hour in Brush... Slowing overnight

**Spotting Distances-** Up to .25 miles from Grass/Brush, Up to 1 mile in Timber (From Torching)

##### AIR OPERATIONS:

Sunrise: 06:47

Expect poor smoke dispersion before the inversion breaks by around noon. Limited thereafter. Mixing heights start out at less than 1000 feet; rise to 8,000 AGL; then returning to less than 1000 feet after sunset. Anticipate terrain induced turbulence in the Tule and Kern River corridors, especially during peak hours of afternoon heating.

## Accountability

- Know where your crewmembers are at all times.
- Have crewmembers work in pairs.
- Do you have the buddy system set in place on the fireline?
- Inform Division or your Supervisor of changing locations.
- Do you know how to use your radio and is it cloned?
- Check **IN** with the Division Supervisor on site if not assigned there
- Check **OUT** with your supervisor (Or Division) at the end of shift.

## Watch Out Situation #4

### Unfamiliar with weather and local factors influencing fire behavior

- Recognize and communicate any change in fire behavior
- Monitor weather conditions throughout the shift and broadcast them to all resources on the division

## Look Up, Look Down, Look Around

- Look Up: Check the sky for any weather changes such as building or approaching thunderstorms, wind shifts or increases in speed. Watch for air operations and water drops. Look for snags.
- Look Down: Watch your footing. Keep an eye out for snakes, poison oak, bee's nests and observe fine fuels on the ground.
- Look Around Check fuel loading in the area, general terrain, current fire behavior and ladder fuels. Keep an eye on fellow firefighters for signs of heat stress and smoke inhalation.




10. ATTEMPTING FRONTAL ASSAULT ON FIRE

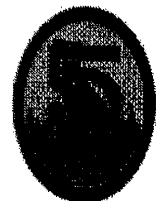

We can issue the form directly to the hospital or clinic, but we need full names and SSN for the required forms prior to being able to do that. The employee or supervisor should contact COMP/CLAIMS as soon as possible or upon arrival at the hospital, whichever is convenient.

For claims there are different forms needed based on the circumstances of the property loss or damage. Please contact COMP UL first to find out which forms are appropriate for your situation, and what additional information might be needed. This will expedite the process.

Unserviceable items must be turned into COMP if you are unable to replace at Supply. If items are lost or damaged on the fire line, the fire suppression module must provide a copy of the module's standard inventory with the documentation of broken or unserviceable items. For replacement of non-cache items, if the replacement request is approved, the reimbursement amount will be limited to the cache equivalent value. (PMS 902 Chapter 30).

Replacement for normal wear and tear will be through your home unit.

# Resource Advisors Message

**Giant sequoias** are among the world's largest and longest-living trees, reaching 2,500-3,000 years old. They grow naturally **only** on California's Sierra Nevada mountain range. They are fire-adapted and have survived low intensity fires every 10-15 years which remove fallen branches, leaves, logs and other fuels while promoting seed germination. Historically, fires have rarely killed mature giant sequoias. However, **we now know they are vulnerable to high severity fire.**

**AT LEAST 10% of the world's giant sequoias were lost during the Castle Fire last year.**

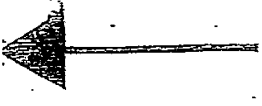
**Use these BMP's to help protect the big trees:**

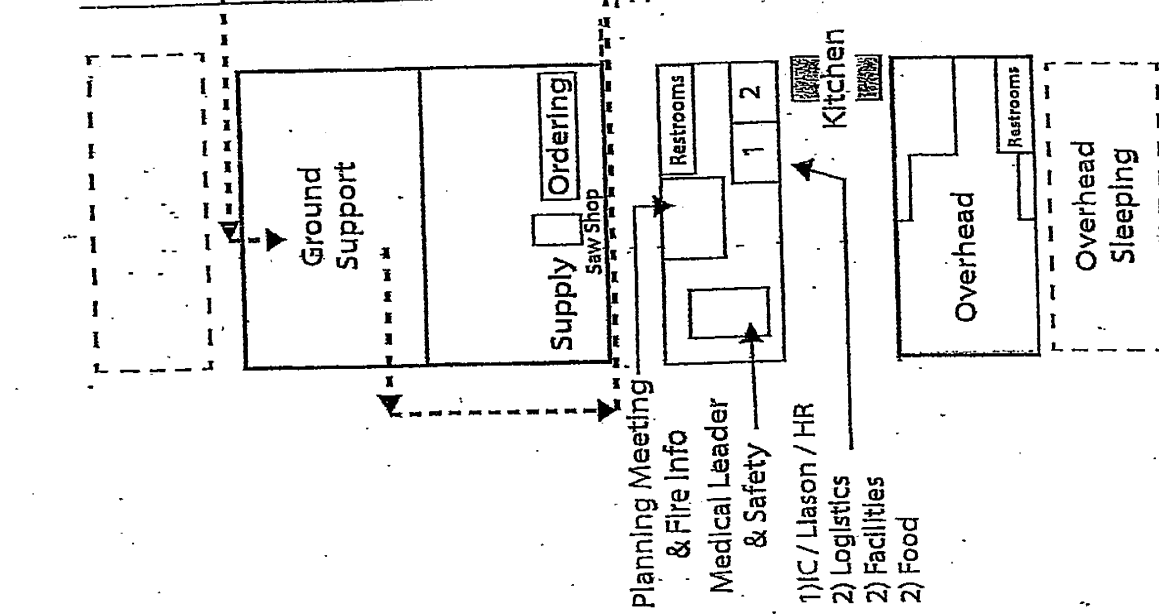
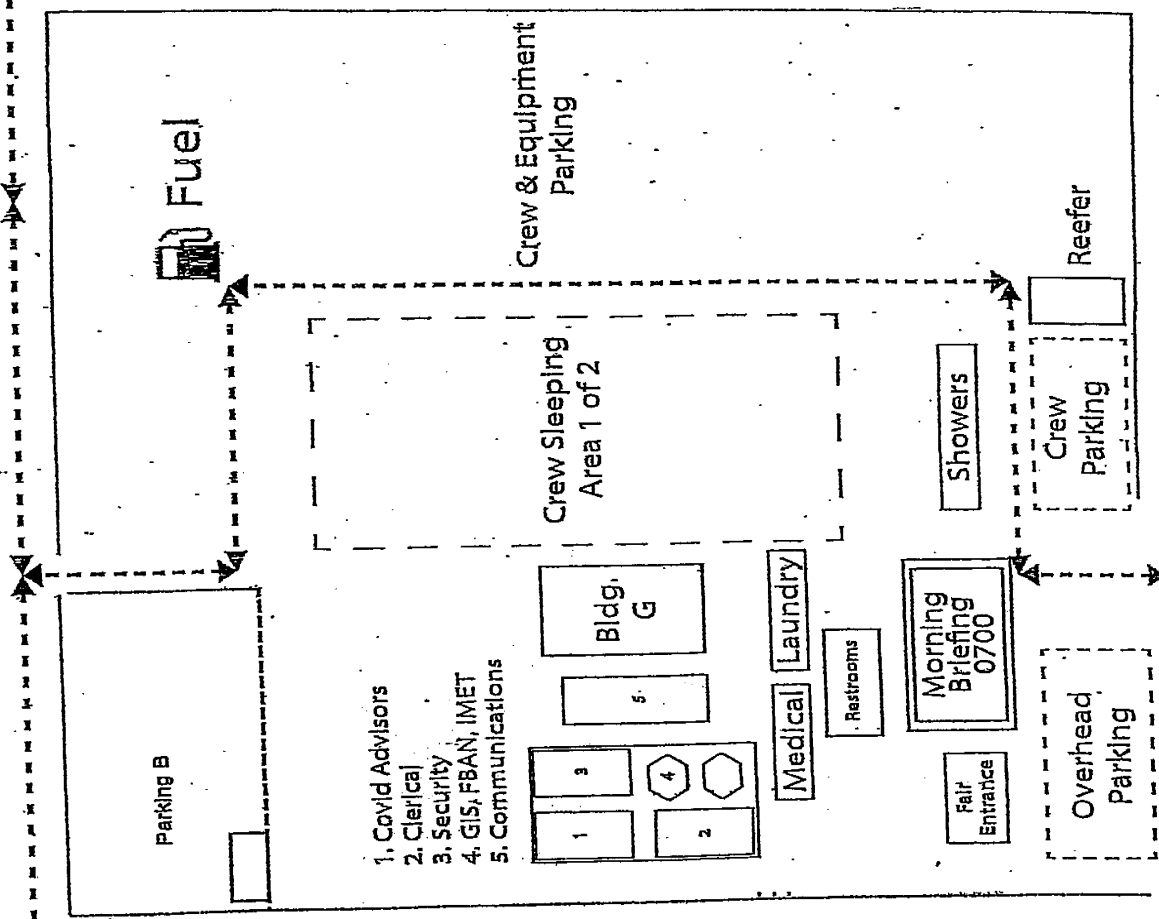

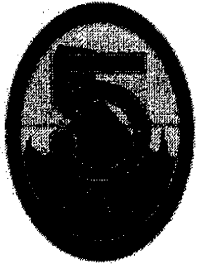
