<u>WEATHER DISCUSSION:</u> Mostly clear, but smoky, conditions will persist through the operational periods. The main concern will be winds with gusty westerly winds anticipated across the ridges and upper slopes. Wind gusts of 20-30 MPH will be likely with locally higher gusts possible. For lower elevations, typical diurnal winds are expected, but in drainages that align with the ridges, wind speeds could be a little bit stronger. Temperatures will be cooler with a slight increase in relative humidity.

On Tuesday, a dry cold front will sweep across the area, bringing cooler temperatures and higher relative humidity. However, the front will also bring very gusty southwest to northwest winds to the fire, especially at the higher elevations, with gusts around 35 MPH possible.

- Identify unburned islands close to the line... PIG values are up... Spotting is in Play!!!

Expect good smoke dispersion after the inversion breaks around noon. Less in the lower elevations. Mixing heights start out at less than 1000 feet; rise to only 3,000 AGL; then returning to less than 1000 feet after sunset. Anticipate terrain induced turbulence in the Tule and Kern River corridors, during the entire wind event.

Act Deliberately, Not Urgently

- When committing personnel to a fire, have a plan. Ensure that your plans are clearly communicated and that
 everyone clearly understands your intent and the hazards that are associated with your plan.
- Do not be afraid to say no. Refer to page 19 in the I.R.P.G. for guidelines on properly refusing risk. Do not act beyond the limits of your training or ability.
- Ensure that escape routes and safety zones are clearly defined and made known to all fire fighters. Post lookouts
 and ensure that you know what radio frequency you will be using for tactics and command. Make sure LCES is in
 place prior to taking action.
- Review the "8-Line," Incident within and Incident plan in your IAP. Spend time during breakout briefings discussing possible scenarios involving an incident within an incident. Know who that on-scene IC will be.

Fire Fighter Fatigue: Please continue to get enough rest. Take plenty of breaks and please continue to stay hydrated by drinking plenty of water. Ensure that all fire fighters meet the 2:1 work to rest ratio. Watch out for signs of fatigue in other fire fighters around you.

Snags/Hazard Trees: Maintain situational awareness and point out snags to others. Snags continue to fall in the burned area and near the fire line. Ensure that everyone is aware of the presence of snags and widow makers. Do not park vehicles under them. Use flagging tape to keep others out of the area.

Covid-19

- Be Smart! Stay Apart! Maintain CDC social distancing guidelines when feasible
- Practice good hygiene. Wash hands often and avoid touching your face
- Cover your nose and mouth with a facial covering and cough into your elbow if needed
- Monitor your health. If you have fever, shortness of breath, coughing, sneezing or any other Covid-19 related symptom, tell a supervisor and maintain physical distancing

Texting While Driving is Prohibited!

- Texting while driving is against California State Law and is enforced by local and state law enforcement agencies.

We can issue the form directly to the hospital or clinic, but we need full names and SSN for the required forms prior to being able to do that. The employee or supervisor should contact COMP/CLAIMS as soon as possible or upon arrival at the hospital, whichever is convenient.

For claims there are different forms needed based on the circumstances of the property loss or damage. Please contact COMP UL first to find out which forms are appropriate for your situation, and what additional information might be needed. This will expedite the process.

Unserviceable items must be turned into COMP if you are unable to replace at Supply. If items are lost or damaged on the fire line, the fire suppression module must provide a copy of the module's standard inventory with the documentation of broken or unserviceable items. For replacement of non-cache items, if the replacement request is approved, the reimbursement amount will be limited to the cache equivalent value. (PMS 902 Chapter 30).

Replacement for normal wear and tear will be through your home unit.

Giant sequoias are among the world's largest and longest-living trees, reaching 2,500-3,000 years old. They grow naturally **only** on California's Sierra Nevada mountain range. They are fire-adapted and have survived low-intensity fires every 10-15 years which remove fallen branches, leaves, logs and other fuels while promoting seed germination. Historically, fires have rarely killed mature giant sequoias. However, **we now know they are vulnerable to high severity fire.**

AT LEAST 10% of the world's giant sequoias were lost during the Castle Fire last year.




- Think of protecting old growth sequoias like a structure.

Medical Incident Report

FOR A NON-EMERGENCY INCIDENT: WORK THROUGH CHAIN OF COMMAND TO REPORT AND TRANSPORT INJURED PERSONNEL AS NECESSARY.

FOR A MEDICAL EMERGENCY: IDENTIFY ON SCENE INCIDENT COMMANDER BY NAME AND POSITION AND ANNOUNCE "MEDICAL EMERGENCY" TO INITIATE RESPONSE FROM COMMUNICATIONS

Use the following items to communicate situation to communications/dispatch.

1. CONTACT COMMUNICATIONS / DISPATCH (Verify correct frequency prior to starting report)

Ex: "Communications, Div. Alpha. Stand-by for Emergency Traffic."

2. INCIDENT STATUS: Provide incident summary (including number of patients) and command structure.

Ex: "Communications, I have a Red priority patient, unconscious, struck by a falling tree.
