<u>WEATHER DISCUSSION:</u> Very cool conditions will prevail across the fire today with temperatures well below normal. Relative humidity will drop to moderate levels today with moderate to good recovery tonight. Gusty westerly winds will prevail at the ridges and upper slopes through this evening with gusts 20-30 MPH (and locally up to 40 MPH this afternoon and evening). At lower elevations, typical diurnal winds will prevail with gusts around 15 MPH this afternoon and evening.

For Wednesday through the weekend, a warming and drying trend can be expected. Additionally, there will be some weak offshore (northeasterly) winds during the night and morning hours.

WEATHER FORECAST FOR TODAY:

WEATHER: Partly cloudy. Areas of smoke.

MAX TEMPERATURES: 56-66 lower elevations...46-56 ridges and upper slopes.

MIN HUMIDITY: 55-75% western side...35-55% eastern side.

20 FT WINDS:

RIDGETOP - West to northwest 8-15 MPH with gusts 20-30 MPH. Local gusts

35-40 MPH on eastern and southern flanks.

SLOPE/VALLEY - Variable/upslope 4-8 MPH becoming upvalley 5-10 MPH with gusts

STABILITY/INVERSION: Inversion dissipating around 1300.

WEATHER: Partly cloudy. Areas of smoke.

MIN TEMPERATURES: 42-52.

MAX HUMIDITY: 60-80% lower elevations...45-60% ridges and upper slopes.

20 FT WINDS:

RIDGETOP - West to northwest 8-15 MPH with gusts 20-30 MPH in the evening

becoming north to northeast 4-8 MPH with gusts 10-15 MPH

overnight.

SLOPE/VALLEY - Upvalley 5-10 MPH with gusts 12-18 MPH early becoming

downslope/downvalley 3-6 MPH with gusts to 10 MPH overnight.

STABILITY/INVERSION: Inversion possibly developing after 2200.

<u>OUTLOOK FOR WEDNESDAY THROUGH SATURDAY:</u> A warming and drying trend is expected through the period as high pressure builds over the area. From Thursday through Saturday, there will be some weak offshore winds. Otherwise, typical diurnal, terrain-driven, winds can be anticipated.

FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL:

- Fire and wind have weakened trees considerably... Carefully Evaluate All Paths of Travel!
- Expect today's Westerly wind to challenge fireline along the eastern portions of the fire!
- Fire is transitioning into old burn scars with weak trees... Count on Snags Coming Down!
- PIG values are falling... as humidity is rising... Less Spotting= Different Tactics!
- Recent RH recovery is affecting lighter fuel availability... Burn Periods are Slowly Changing!
- Newly burned areas reset the "hazard clock"... Expect fresh rollout and fire impacted snags!!
- Higher humidity will make... Fuel Arrangement Critical to Receptivity!

SPECIFIC:

All Divisions: Large Fuels remain very DRY, very AVAILABLE, very RECEPTIVE...

Flame Lengths- 2-6 ft. in Grass, Up to 30 ft. in Brush/Understory... Fuels and Wind Driven!

Rate of Spread- Up to 50 chains/hour in Grass, Up to 120 chains/hour in Brush... Wind Driven!

Spotting Distances- Up to a 1/2 mile from Grass/Brush, Up to 2 miles in Timber (From Torching)

Probability of Ignition- (Day) Unshaded Up to 50% - Shaded Up to 30% (Night) Down to <30%

AIR OPERATIONS: Sunrise: 06:50 Sunset: 18:47

Expect good smoke dispersion once the lower elevation inversion breaks around noon. Mixing heights start out at less than 1000 feet; rise to only 2,000 AGL; then return to less than 1000 feet after sunset. Anticipate terrain induced turbulence in the Tule and Kern River corridors, during the entire wind event.

General Safety Concerns:

- Driving: Thick smoke and narrow/dusty roads, others driving faster than we do. HEADS UP!!!
- Risk versus benefit: Don't get caught up in the moment! Always weigh the risks of tactical
 operations against the potential benefit. Especially on steep slopes at night!
- Drought conditions: Use all of the assessment tools; Heads up for fire behavior; Ensure LCES
 is in place; Take extra time to ensure it is safe to engage! Use extra caution all the time.
- All trees can be dangerous. They don't have to be leaning, dead, burned, or gnarly. Perform adequate assessments, minimize exposure and risk around all trees.
- Line Construction: Use all of the safety protocols concerning line construction. Watch the spacing, footing, and other firefighters below.

"SEE SOMETHING......SAY SOMETHING!"

If you see a hazard or a dangerous situation developing, tell your supervisor and those around you.

Leaders set the Example

All leaders of firefighters have the responsibility to provide a model their subordinates will emulate and follow. You should:

- Share the hazards and hardships with subordinates
- A positive attitude is infectious
- Don't show discouragement when facing setbacks
- Choose the difficult right over the easy wrong
- Provide Leader's Intent:
 - o Task
 - Purpose
 - End State

Night Shift: Patrol with a Purpose!

- Obtain a clear briefing to understand the purpose and intent of the patrol.
- Coordinate all patrol activities with adjoining patrol resources.
- Maintain strict accountability of all resources.
- Always keep the purpose of the patrol in mind before engaging.
- Always assess risk versus gain when considering taking action during patrol activities

We can issue the form directly to the hospital or clinic, but we need full names and SSN for the required forms prior to being able to do that. For replacement of non-cache items, if the replacement request is approved, the reimbursement amount will be limited to the cache equivalent value. (PMS 902 Chapter 30).

Giant sequoias are among the world's largest and longest-living trees, reaching 2,500-3,000 years old. They grow naturally **only** on California's Sierra Nevada mountain range. They are fire-adapted and have survived low intensity fires every 10-15 years which remove fallen branches, leaves, logs and other fuels while promoting seed germination. Historically, fires have rarely killed mature giant sequoias. However, **we now know they are vulnerable to high severity fire.**


AT LEAST 10% of the world's giant sequoias were lost during the Castle Fire last year.



- Remove surface and ladder fuels from under sequoias. Remove nonsequoia conifers up to 16" diameter. Scatter or chip fuel away from sequoias.
- Scrape duff and fuel from around sequoias, prioritize clearing out cat faces and old fire scars.
