WEATHER DISCUSSION: Warmer and drier conditions will be found across the fire today. Relative humidity will be much lower than yesterday with poor recoveries following for tonight. Across the ridges, light winds will start the day northeasterly but gradually veer southwesterly by afternoon. At lower elevations, look for a typical diurnal wind regime with enhanced southerly wind gusts during the afternoon through the Kern River Valley. For Thursday into the weekend, a warming and drying trend can be expected.

WEATHER FORECAST FOR TODAY:

WEATHER:

Mostly sunny. Areas of smoke.

MAX TEMPERATURES:

70-78 lower slopes and valleys below 3,000 feet west side and below 5,000 feet

east side; 60-70 higher ridges and slopes.

MIN HUMIDITY:

21-32% western side: 12-21% eastern side.

20 FT WINDS:

RIDGETOP -

Northeast 4-8 MPH in the morning gradually shifting southeast to southwest

through the day with gusts up to 16 MPH in the afternoon.

SLOPE/VALLEY - Downslope/downvalley winds 2-6 MPH with gusts to 8 MPH through mid-morning then becoming upslope/upvalley 4-8 MPH with gusts up to 12 MPH during the afternoon; except becoming southerly 5-10 MPH with gusts up to 18 MPH near

the Kern River.

STABILITY/INVERSION: Inversion dissipating around 1100-1200.

OUTLOOK FOR TONIGHT:

WEATHER:

Clear, Areas of smoke.

MIN TEMPERATURES:

45-55, locally colder in sheltered basins/valleys.

MAX HUMIDITY:

20 FT WINDS:

20-30% ridges, slopes, and exposed eastern valleys early in the evening then gradual drying overnight; 30-45% remaining valleys and lower western slopes.

RIDGETOP -

Southwest wind 4-8 mph early reversing to northeast 5-9 MPH with gusts of 12-

16 MPH overnight.

SLOPE/VALLEY - Upvalley/upslope 3-6 MPH with gusts 12 MPH, early becoming

downslope/downvalley at 2-5 MPH with gusts up to 10 MPH overnight.

STABILITY/INVERSION: Inversion developing in valleys after 1900.

OUTLOOK FOR THURSDAY THROUGH SATURDAY: A warming and drying trend is expected through the period as high pressure builds over the area. From Thursday through Saturday, there will be some weak offshore winds. Otherwise, typical diurnal, terrain-driven, winds can be anticipated.

WEATHER SUMMARY:

*** Warmer and Drier ***

Warmer and drier conditions today with poor recoveries tonight. Light northeasterly winds veer southwesterly by afternoon. At lower elevations, typical diurnal winds and southerly wind gusts through the Kern River Valley. Into the weekend, a warming and drying trend can be expected.

Expect fair smoke dispersion once the lower elevation inversion breaks around noon. Mixing heights start out at less than 200 feet; rise to 4,000 AGL; then return to less than 200 feet after sunset. Anticipate terrain induced turbulence in the Tule and Kern River corridors throughout the shift.

TRIGGER POINTS

Trigger points are not decision-makers but serve as predetermined cues to prompt you to reevaluate the current and potential situation and its associated risks. They help you to determine and implement the proper course of action.

 Use trigger points for preplanning. DO NOT WAIT UNTIL YOU ARE IN THE WRONG PLACE AT THE WRONG TIME-WITH NO TIME.

Trigger points should be based on measurable factors such as:

Relative Humidity, Winds, Fire Behavior, Topographical Boundaries, Time Constraints/Time of Day, Distance to Safety Zones, Loss of Resources, and other Operational Considerations (e.g. firefighter fatigue, loss of lookouts or communications, weather change).

 As you approach predetermined trigger points, go through the Risk Management Process to help identify if a change in tactics is required:

Identify Hazards, Assess Hazards, Develop Controls and Make Risk Decisions, Implement Controls, and Supervise and Evaluate.

SPOT FIRES

Consider the following questions if you're getting spot fires across your line.

- What is your (PIG)? Can you handle increased spotting?
- Do you have a plan for long range spotting in your fuel type?
- Are resources available and the correct type?
- Do you have more than one safety zone in case access is cut off?
- Do your primary lookouts have a good view of the current situation?
- To reduce the risk, are you ready to retreat?

HAZARD TREES

Consider the SEVERITY, PROBABILITY, and EXPOSURE OF THE HAZARD TREE problems continually as you preform fire-line operations. Remember to look for hazard trees in staging areas and parking areas.

Environmental Element:

Winds, Night Ops, Bug Kill Trees, Number, Density, Height of Hazard Tree, Amount of time the area has been burning.

Hazard Tree Indicators:

Burning Trees, High-Risk Tree Species, Dead, Broken, Burning Tops/Limbs Overhead, Absence of Needles, Bark, Limbs, Leaning or Hung -UP.

DRIVING SAFETY

To be a safe driver you must **WANT** to be one. Take a good, hard look at your driving habits. Are you training yourself to do the right things the right way, like fastening your seat belt, checking your mirrors, and maintain safe speeds and following distances?

Giant sequoias are among the world's largest and longest-living trees, reaching 2,500-3,000 years old. They grow naturally **only** on California's Sierra Nevada mountain range. They are fire-adapted and have survived low intensity fires every 10-15 years which remove fallen branches, leaves, logs and other fuels while promoting seed germination. Historically, fires have rarely killed mature giant sequoias. However, **we now know they are vulnerable to high severity fire.**


AT LEAST 10% of the world's giant sequoias were lost during the Castle Fire last year.



THANK YOU FOR PROTECTING THE GIANT SEQUOIA GROVES! Use these BMP's to help protect the big trees:

- Think of protecting old growth sequoias like a structure.
- Remove surface and ladder fuels from under sequoias. Remove nonsequoia conifers up to 16" diameter. Scatter or chip fuel away from sequoias.
- Scrape duff and fuel from around sequoias, prioritize clearing out cat faces and old fire scars.
