

## INCIDENT Weather Forecast

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**WEATHER DISCUSSION:** Warmer temperatures and low humidity levels will be found across the fire area today as Pacific high pressure continues to strengthen over the area. Winds will remain weak and diurnally driven. Expect modest northeasterly ridgetop winds this morning to switch to the southwest by afternoon. Along the slopes and in valleys, look for the typical downslope/downvalley drainage winds to become upslope/upvalley by afternoon. Peak wind gusts will be around 15 MPH or less. Heading into tonight, look for that wind pattern to reverse to northeast over the ridges and downslope/downvalley at lower elevations. Tonight's temperatures will be slightly warmer than last night and moisture recoveries will remain poor.

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### **WEATHER FORECAST FOR TODAY:**

**WEATHER:** Sunny. Areas of smoke.

**MAX TEMPERATURES:** 75-81 lower slopes and valleys below 3,000 feet west side and below 5,000 feet east side; 65-75 higher ridges and slopes.

**MIN HUMIDITY:** 10-16% eastern side; 16-22% western side

**20 FT WINDS:**

**RIDGETOP -** Northeast 3-6 MPH in the morning shifting to west southwest 5-8 MPH during the afternoon with gusts up to 15 MPH in the afternoon.

**SLOPE/VALLEY -** Downslope/downvalley winds 2-6 MPH with gusts to 8 MPH through 0900 then becoming upslope/upvalley 4-7 MPH with gusts up to 10-15 MPH by the afternoon, strongest up the Kern Valley.

**STABILITY/INVERSION:** Valley inversion dissipating around 1000-1100.

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### **OUTLOOK FOR TONIGHT:**

**WEATHER:** Clear. Areas of smoke.

**MIN TEMPERATURES:** 46-56, locally down to 38 in sheltered basins and valleys.

**MAX HUMIDITY:** 15-25%, except 25-45% sheltered eastern valleys/basins and lower slopes west of the divide.

**20 FT WINDS:**

**RIDGETOP -** West southwest wind 5-8 MPH with gusts to 13 MPH early, reversing to northeast 3-6 MPH with gusts to around 10 MPH overnight.

**SLOPE/VALLEY -** Upvalley/upslope 4-7 MPH with gusts 12 MPH, early becoming downslope/downvalley at 2-5 MPH with gusts up to 10 MPH overnight.

**STABILITY/INVERSION:** Inversion developing in valleys after 1900.

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**OUTLOOK FOR FRIDAY THROUGH SUNDAY:** Remaining mostly clear, warm and very dry with areas of smoke. High temperatures range in the 70s across the higher ridges/lower slopes and lower 80s along the lower slopes and in the lower valleys. Minimum humidity values drop into the teens for most areas each afternoon with poor recoveries each night. Winds remain diurnally driven and mostly light.

### WEATHER SUMMARY:

**\*\*\* Warmer and Much Drier \*\*\***

Warm temperatures and low humidity today. Winds remain weak and diurnally driven. Northeasterly winds will switch southwest by afternoon. Downslope/downvalley drainage winds become upslope/upvalley by afternoon. Peak gusts to 15 MPH. Tonight, winds reverse to northeast over the ridges; and downslope/downvalley lower. Overnight temperatures are warmer and recoveries remain poor.

Expect poor smoke dispersion until the lower elevation inversion breaks around noon. Mixing heights start out at less than 300 feet; rise to only 5,500 AGL; then return to less than 300 feet after sunset. Anticipate terrain induced turbulence in the Tule and Kern River corridors, as winds pivot 180 degrees during the shift.

### Common Denominators of Fire Behavior on Tragedy Fires

- On relatively small fires or deceptively quiet areas of a large fire.
- In relatively light fuels, such as grass, herbs, and light brush,
- When there is an unexpected shift in wind direction, or in wind speed.
- When fire responds to topographic conditions and runs uphill.

Alignment of topography and wind during the burning period should be considered a trigger point to re-evaluate tactics.

### Fatigue/Smoke Effects

- Be alert for signs of fatigue and take breaks as necessary.
- Maintain 2:1 work/rest ratio.
- Monitor incoming resources for level of fatigue.
- Allow for extended rest periods if needed.
- Avoid working in heavy inversions for prolonged periods if possible. Take occasional breaks in clear air to mitigate build-up of CO, and CO<sub>2</sub>.
- “Over hydrate” to assist in flushing smoke particulates from your system.

### WUI Tactical Challenges and Hazards

- Propane tanks that could B.L.E.V.E.
- Powerlines and underground utilities.
- Narrow roads, unknown bridge weight limits.
- Limited water sources.
- Property owners remaining on-site, or evacuations, which may cause panic.
- Smoke byproducts often laced with chemical compounds not found in pure wildland smoke.
- Unknown chemicals or pesticides, like Carbofuran, near residences or garden plots.

For federal employees, if you are injured, please contact the COMP UL for the Authorization for Treatment (CA-16). We can issue the form directly to the hospital or clinic, but we need full names and SSN for the required forms prior to being able to do that. The employee or supervisor should contact COMP/CLAIMS as soon as possible or upon arrival at the hospital, whichever is convenient.

For claims there are different forms needed based on the circumstances of the property loss or damage. Please contact COMP UL first to find out which forms are appropriate for your situation, and what additional information might be needed. This will expedite the process.

Unserviceable items must be turned into COMP if you are unable to replace at Supply. If items are lost or damaged on the fire line, the fire suppression module must provide a copy of the module's standard inventory with the documentation of broken or unserviceable items. For replacement of non-cache items, if the replacement request is approved, the reimbursement amount will be limited to the cache equivalent value. (PMS 902 Chapter 30).

Replacement for normal wear and tear will be through your home unit.

Per Interagency Fire Business Management Handbook Chapter 10:

Agency resources assigned to an incident or engaged in initial attack fire response will adhere to the current agency work/rest policy for determining length of duty day:

Driving:

- A driver shall drive only if they have had at least 8 consecutive hours off duty before beginning a shift.

Work/Rest Guidelines should be met on all incidents. Plan for and ensure all personnel are provided a minimum 2:1 work/rest ratio (for every 2 hours of work or travel, provide 1 hour of sleep and/or rest).

- If you work over 16 hours this must be justified and approved by the IC. All shifts that exceed 16 hours and those that do not meet 2:1 work/ratio must be justified. Justification will be documented in the daily incident records (CTR or letter). Documentation shall include mitigation measures used to reduce fatigue.

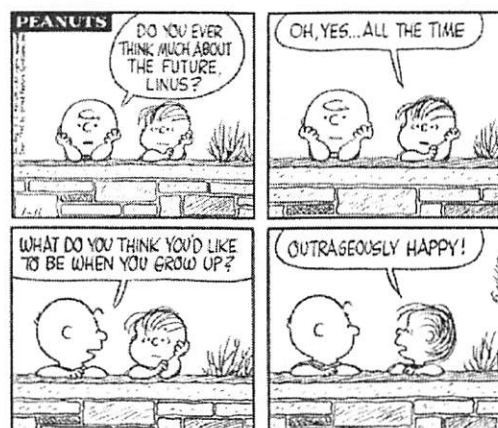
You can protect yourself by understanding how the body's stress response works, recognizing the signs and symptoms of stress, and taking steps to reduce effects.

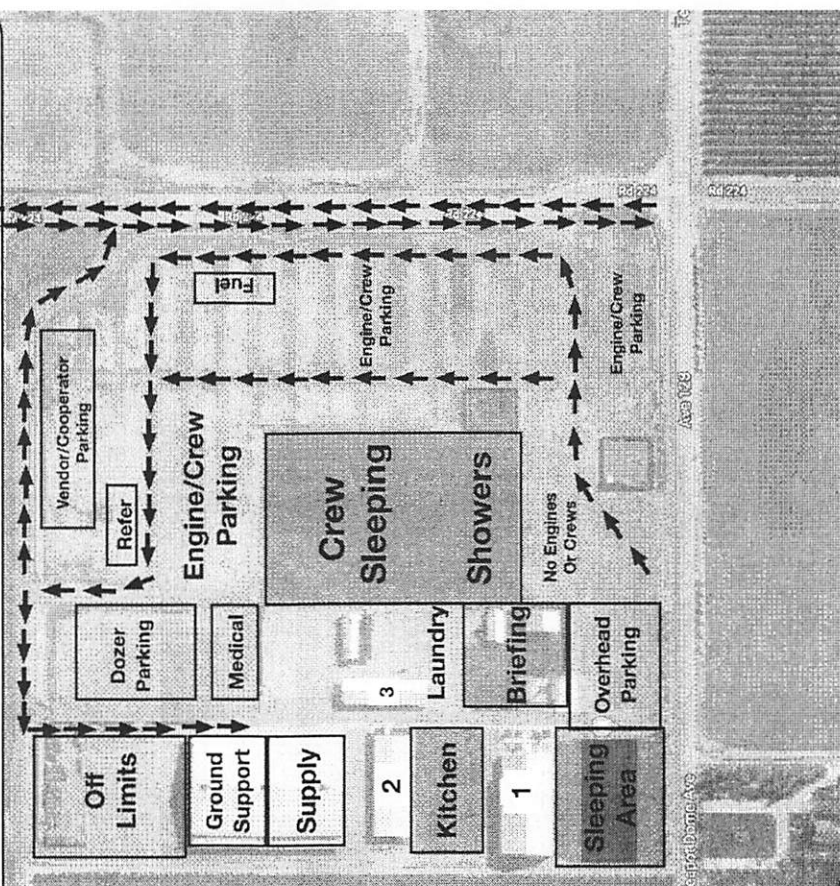

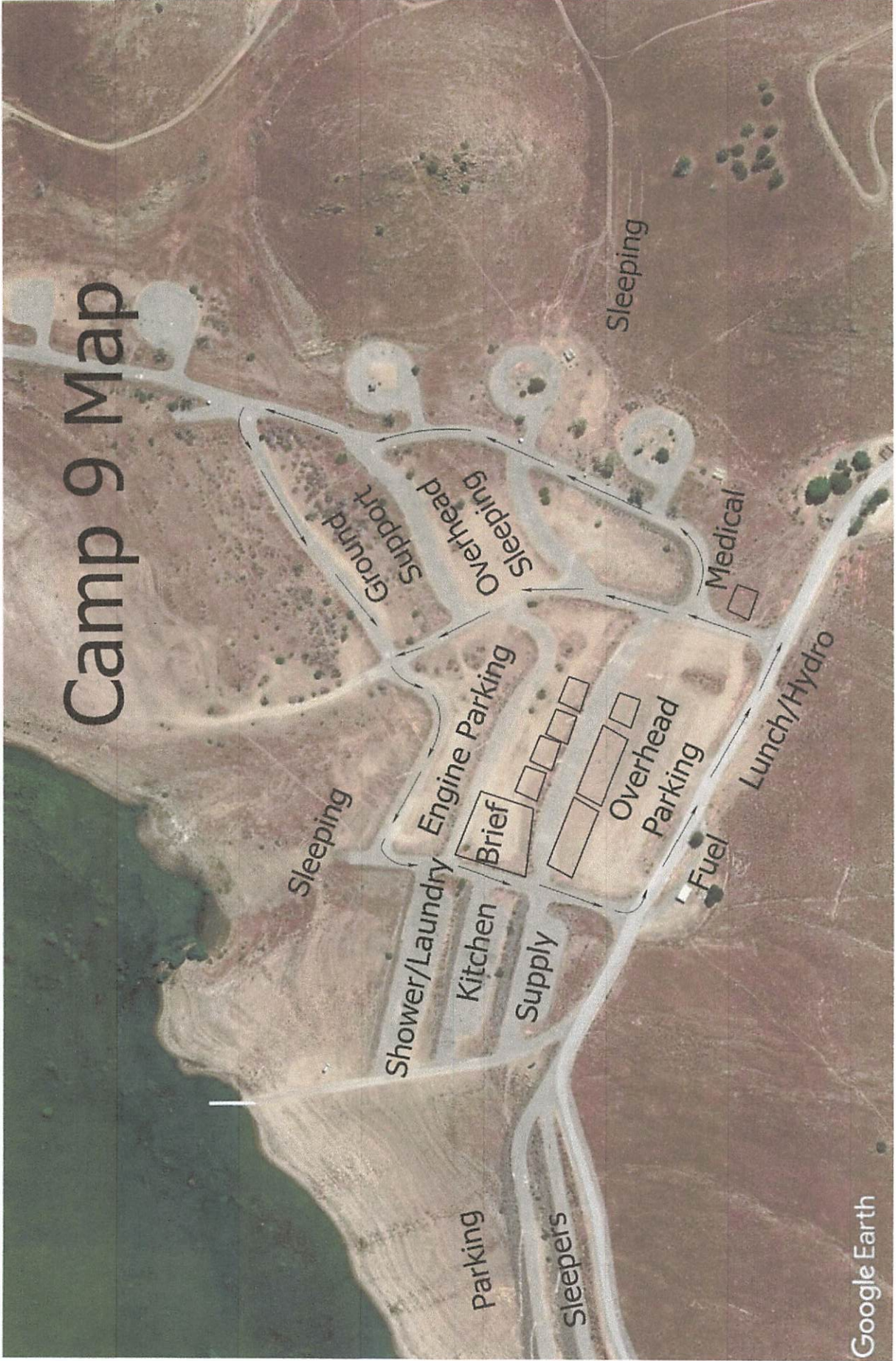
