<u>WEATHER DISCUSSION:</u> Very warm and dry conditions will continue through the weekend with poor nighttime moisture recoveries and daytime relative humidities falling to the mid single digits to mid teens. Winds will remain weak and terrain driven for most of the fire. One exception will be along the Kern River where gusts to around 20 mph can be expected due to topographic and pressure gradient effects.

WEATHER FORECAST FOR TODAY:

WEATHER: Sunny. Areas of smoke.

MAX TEMPERATURES: 80-85 below 4,000 ft. west side and below 5,000 ft. east side; 70-80 above.

MIN HUMIDITY: 6-10% eastern side; 9-14% western side

20 FT WINDS:

RIDGETOP - Northeast 3-6 MPH in the morning, turning west 6-9 MPH with gusts up to 17

MPH in the afternoon.

SLOPE/VALLEY - Downslope/downvalley winds 2-6 MPH with gusts to 8 MPH through mid-morning

then becoming upslope/upvalley 4-8 MPH by the afternoon, gusting to 13 MPH. In the Kern Valley, downvalley winds 6-11 MPH with gusts up to 16 MPH early, becoming upvalley by late morning at 7-12 mph with gusts up to 21 MPH. Winds slowing and turning downslope/downvalley at all locations toward evening.

STABILITY/INVERSION: Valley inversion dissipating around 1000-1100.

OUTLOOK FOR TONIGHT:

WEATHER: Clear, Areas of smoke.

MIN TEMPERATURES: 47-57, locally down to 36 in sheltered basins/valleys east of the divide.

MAX HUMIDITY: 14-24%, locally higher in sheltered basins and lower western slopes.

20 FT WINDS:

RIDGETOP - West wind 5-8 MPH with gusts to 16 MPH early, reversing to northeast 3-6 MPH

with gusts up to around 13 MPH overnight.

SLOPE/VALLEY - Wind becoming downslope/downvalley at 2-5 MPH with gusts up to 10 MPH

overnight. In the Kern Valley, downvalley around 1800 at 3-7 MPH and

increasing to 5-10 MPH with gusts up to 18 MPH late.

STABILITY/INVERSION: Inversion developing in valleys after 1800.

OUTLOOK FOR SUNDAY: Warm and very dry with conditions similar to today.

Flame Lengths- 2-6 ft. in Grass, Up to 30 ft. in Brush/Understory... Fuels Driven!

Spotting Distances- Up to a 1/2 mile from Grass/Brush, Up to 1 miles in Timber (From Torching)

Expect very poor smoke dispersion until the lower elevation inversion breaks around noon. Limited dissipation later. Mixing heights start out at less than 300 feet; rise to only 5,500 AGL; then return to less than 300 feet after sunset. Slight better ventilation.

Major Hazards and Risks:

- · Steep areas with great potential for rolling rocks, trees, etc.
- Narrow, winding roads with limited visibility due to smoke.
- · Winds increasing or changing directions.
- · Continued high temperatures and low humidity.
- Spot and slop fire could easily become explosive!!!

AND CONTINUE TO HYDRATE!!! HYDRATE!!! HYDRATE!!!!

Safety Around Heavy Equipment Operations

- · Never assume that the operator can see you, especially at night.
- · Ensure that communications are established with the operator.
- Use hand signals if other communications are unavailable.
- Maintain a 50' to 100' exclusion area around equipment.
- · Use a spotter when backing.
- Beware of flying objects from masticators.

Air Operations

- Follow aviation watch out situations on page 46 of the IRPG.
- Don't plan on air resources for medical transport or resupply.
- Refer to page 58 of the IRPG for properly directing bucket drops.
- Ensure positive communications with all air resources.
- Look for flying objects and debris from nearby retardant and water drops.
- Be sure to always monitor the air to ground frequency so that you are not caught off guard.



For replacement of non-cache items, if the replacement request is approved, the reimbursement amount will be limited to the cache equivalent value. (PMS 902 Chapter 30).





- Remove surface and ladder fuels from under sequoias. Remove non-sequoia conifers up to 16" diameter. Scatter or chip fuel away from sequoias up to 25ft.
- Scrape duff and fuel from around sequoias **up to 3ft**, prioritize clearing out cat faces and old fire scars.
- Use water to cool Sequoia roots, avoid dry mopping



Medical Incident Report
