**3. Objective(s):**

**Leaders Intent**

- An aggressive full suppression strategy will be implemented using direct tactics when safe to do so. Efforts will be made to minimize impacts to residences, the giant sequoia groves and critical infrastructure through the application of well planned tactical responses.

**Management Objectives**

- Ensure that strategies and tactics provide for firefighter and public safety through the application of sound risk management principles.
- Minimize the threat to private and public property located on the Tule River Reservation, local communities, giant sequoia groves and cultural resources.
- Establish and enhance cooperator, partner and stakeholder relationships.
- Follow identified CDC, local, state and federal procedures to minimize the spread of COVID-19.
- Minimize the cost of the incident by employing tactics that have the highest probability of success while minimizing firefighter exposure.

**Control Objectives**

- Keep the fire North of Highway 155.
- Keep the fire South of Western Divide Highway 190.
- Keep the fire East of Cow Mountain Peak, Oak Flat Peak and Gibbon Peak.
- Keep the fire West of of Kern River.

**General Situational Awareness:**

- Steep and rugged terrain, critically dry and receptive fuel beds, active area for fire history and drought stressed trees.
- In the COVID-19 environment, high density populations or large groups are particularly at risk. To help protect yourself, your family and to ensure all employees return home safely, make sure to practice social distancing.
- Enhanced hygiene (especially handwashing), PPE & monitoring practices help limit the infection rate of first responders.

### ....CRITICAL FIRE WEATHER CONDITIONS TODAY...

**WEATHER DISCUSSION:** High pressure ridging across the area will gradually break down over the next several days. As this occurs, the typical diurnal winds will be enhanced. Stronger winds combined with very low relative humidity values this afternoon will lead to several hours of critical fire weather conditions, especially near Kern River. After one more night of poor moisture recoveries tonight, a slow cooling and moistening trend will ensue. Small rain chances arrive Thursday into Friday, courtesy a cold front.

### WEATHER FORECAST FOR TODAY:

**WEATHER:** Sunny. Areas of smoke.

**MAX TEMPERATURES:** 80-87 below 4,000 ft. west side and below 5,000 ft. east side; 73-81 at higher elevations.

**MIN HUMIDITY:** 8-13%

**20 FT WINDS:**

**RIDGETOP -** East northeast 6-10 MPH with gusts up to 21 MPH through 0900, then becoming westerly 5-9 MPH with gusts to 18 MPH.

**SLOPE/VALLEY -** Through 0900: West of the divide, east 5-10 MPH with gusts up to 20 MPH. East of the divide, downslope/downvalley winds 3-6 MPH with gusts up to 12 MPH, except 8-13 MPH with gusts to 20 MPH along the Kern River.  
0900-1630: Becoming upslope/upvalley 3-8 MPH with gusts up to 15 MPH, except increasing to 10-15 MPH with gusts of 25-30 MPH along the Kern River.  
1630-1800: Winds diminishing and starting to turn downslope/downvalley.

### OUTLOOK FOR TONIGHT:

**WEATHER:** Clear. Areas of smoke.

**MIN TEMPERATURES:** 51-61, locally down to 40 in sheltered basins/valleys east of the divide.

**MAX HUMIDITY:** 14-24%; except 22-32% above 6,000 feet and in sheltered valleys.

**20 FT WINDS:**

**RIDGETOP -** West 4-8 MPH with gusts to 16 MPH early, switching northeast to east and increasing to 6-11 MPH with gusts up to 22 MPH after 0100.

**SLOPE/VALLEY -** West of the divide and along the Kern, downslope/downvalley winds increasing to 5-9 MPH with gusts of 15-20 MPH, mostly after 0100. Otherwise, downslope/downvalley winds 3-6 MPH with gusts up to 13 MPH.

**OUTLOOK FOR MONDAY:** Partly cloudy, slightly cooler, and little more humid with winds similar to today.

## Driver Safety/Traffic Safety

- ✓ *Many roads are steep. Avoid heating up your vehicle's brakes!! Use the transmission's gears when possible.*
- ✓ Driving conditions and stopping distances will change when the roads are dusty, wet, or muddy.
- ✓ Be familiar with the traffic plan for your division, and any division you may travel in.
- ✓ Stop and look at all unmarked intersections before proceeding.
- ✓ Use extra caution on residential streets. Watch your speeds! Beware of distracted drivers.
- ✓ Beware of congested vehicle and pedestrian conditions in the Base Camp parking lots and sleeping areas.

## **REMAIN FIRE FOCUSED!!...COVID AWARE!**

### Look Up, Look Down, Look Around

- Look Up: Check the sky for any weather changes such as building or approaching thunderstorms, wind shifts or increases in speed. Watch for air operations and water drops. Look for snags.
- Look Down: Watch your footing. Keep an eye out for snakes, poison oak, bee's nests and observe fine fuels on the ground.
- Look Around Check fuel loading in the area, general terrain, current fire behavior and ladder fuels. Keep an eye on fellow firefighters for signs of heat stress and smoke inhalation.

### Safety Zones (IRPG pg# 8)

Separation distance between the firefighter and the flames should be at least four times the maximum continuous flame height. Distance separation for flat terrain and no wind is the radius from the center of the safety zone to the nearest fuels.
