<u>WEATHER DISCUSSION:</u> A weak upper low will pass south of the incident today into tomorrow, weakening the high pressure ridge that is responsible for the very dry and warm weather over the last several days. As this occurs, look for enhanced diurnal wind speeds again through this afternoon. Increasing moisture will also lead to periods of mid to high level cloud cover, leading to slightly cooler and moister conditions than yesterday. This gradual cooling and moistening trend will continue through Thursday ahead of a cold front.

#### **WEATHER FORECAST FOR TODAY:**

**WEATHER:** Partly sunny. Areas of smoke.

MAX TEMPERATURES: 78-86 below 4,000 ft. west side and below 5,000 ft. east side; 68-78 at higher

elevations.

**MIN HUMIDITY:** 13-20%

20 FT WINDS:

**RIDGETOP** - East northeast 6-10 MPH with gusts up to 21 MPH through 0900, then gradually

shifting south to west at 5-8 MPH with gusts to 18 MPH.

SLOPE/VALLEY - Through 0900: West of the divide, east 5-9 MPH with gusts up to 15 MPH. East

of the divide, downslope/downvalley winds 3-6 MPH with gusts up to 12 MPH,

except 8-13 MPH with gusts to 21 MPH along the Kern River.

0900-1630: Becoming upslope/upvalley 3-8 MPH with gusts up to 17 MPH, except increasing to 9-14 MPH with gusts of 22-27 MPH along the Kern River. 1630-1800: Winds diminishing and starting to turn downslope/downvalley.

#### **OUTLOOK FOR TONIGHT:**

**WEATHER:** Partly cloudy. Areas of smoke.

**MIN TEMPERATURES:** 45 ridgetops to 61 Kern Valley.

MAX HUMIDITY: 30-40% eastern side and 35-50% western side and on ridges above 7,000 feet.


Unserviceable items must be turned into COMP if you are unable to replace at Supply. If items are lost or damaged on the fire line, the fire suppression module must provide a copy of the module's standard inventory with the documentation of broken or unserviceable items. For replacement of non-cache items, if the replacement request is approved, the reimbursement amount will be limited to the cache equivalent value. (PMS 902 Chapter 30).

Replacement for normal wear and tear will be through your home unit.








# Use these BMP's to help protect the big trees:

- Think of protecting old growth sequoias like a structure.
- Remove surface and ladder fuels from under sequoias. Remove non-sequoia conifers up to 16" diameter. Scatter or chip fuel away from sequoias up to 25ft.
- Scrape duff and fuel from around sequoias **up to 3ft**, prioritize clearing out cat faces and old fire scars.
- Use water to cool Sequoia roots, avoid dry mopping.
