WEATHER DISCUSSION: After the desiccating warmth of the last several days, cooler temperatures and higher humidities are on tap for today. Winds will be slightly weaker than yesterday and generally follow the typical diurnal pattern. Cumulus will also bubble up over the higher terrain during peak heating, perhaps dropping a sprinkle at a few spots. Otherwise, our cooling/moistening trend will continue through Friday.

WEATHER FORECAST FOR TODAY:

WEATHER:

Mostly sunny. Cumulus buildups over the peaks during the afternoon.

MAX TEMPERATURES: 74-81 below 4,000 ft. west side and below 5,000 ft. east side; 64-74 at higher

elevations.

MIN HUMIDITY:

22-32% below 6,000 feet: 30-45% above.

20 FT WINDS:

RIDGETOP -

Variable to easterly 3-6 MPH with gusts up to 10 MPH through 0800, then

becoming westerly 7-10 MPH, with gusts up to 18 MPH in the afternoon.

SLOPE/VALLEY -

Through 0900: downslope/downvalley 2-5 MPH with gusts up to 8 MPH; except,

downvalley 4-9 MPH with gusts up to 18 MPH along the Kern River.

0900-1630: Becoming upslope/upvalley to westerly 3-8 MPH with gusts up to 15

MPH, except 8-12 MPH with gusts of 20-25 MPH along the Kern River. 1630-1800: Winds diminishing and starting to turn downslope/downvalley.

STABILITY/INVERSION: Inversion dissipating between 1000-1100.

Partly cloudy. Areas of smoke.

43 highest ridges to 58 Kern Valley, locally colder in sheltered valleys/basins.

Expect poor smoke dispersion until the lower elevation inversion breaks around noon. Limited dissipation later. Mixing heights start out at less than 400 feet; rise to 7,000 AGL; then return to less than 400 feet after sunset. Slight worse ventilation.

Firefighter Fatigue/Driver Safety

With continued physically demanding operational periods, expect and predict fatigue of all crew members working in and around your division. Take the following steps to limit and address fatigue and driver safety:

- 1. Follow work/rest guidelines.
- Take breaks as needed.
- Rotate qualified drivers/operators.
- 4. Supervisors assess the fatigue levels of your crews during operational periods.
- 5. Ask/tell if you are physically unable to complete a task or assignment.
- 6. Front seat passengers should remain awake and maintain situational awareness while driving.

Heat Related Illness

Heat Stroke- A condition that occurs when the body becomes unable to control its temperature, and can cause death or permanent disability. Description of signs and symptoms include:

- · Confusion, loss of coordination.
- · Throbbing headaches.
- · High body temperature.
- · Seizures, coma.

Heat Exhaustion- The body's response to an excessive loss of water and salt, usually through sweating.

- · Heavy sweating, extreme weakness or fatigue.
- · Dizziness, nausea, vomiting, irritability.
- · Fast, swallow breathing.
- Trouble concentrating, loss in coordination.

Heat Cramps- Affects workers who sweat a lot during strenuous activity. Sweating depletes the body's salt and moisture levels.

· Muscle cramps, pain, or spasms in the abdomen, arms or legs.

HAZARD TREES

Consider the SEVERITY, PROBABILITY, and EXPOSURE OF THE HAZARD TREE problems continually as you preform fire-line operations. Remember to look for hazard trees in staging areas and parking areas.

Environmental Element:

Winds, Night Ops, Bug Kill Trees, Number, Density, Height of Hazard Tree, Amount of time the area has been burning.

Hazard Tree Indicators:

Burning Trees, High-Risk Tree Species, Dead, Broken, Burning Tops/Limbs Overhead, Absence of Needles, Bark, Limbs, Leaning or Hung -UP.

We can issue the form directly to the hospital or clinic, but we need full names and SSN for the required forms prior to being able to do that. The employee or supervisor should contact COMP/CLAIMS as soon as possible or upon arrival at the hospital, whichever is convenient.

For claims there are different forms needed based on the circumstances of the property loss or damage. Please contact COMP UL first to find out which forms are appropriate for your situation, and what additional information might be needed. This will expedite the process.

Unserviceable items must be turned into COMP if you are unable to replace at Supply. If items are lost or damaged on the fire line, the fire suppression module must provide a copy of the module's standard inventory with the documentation of broken or unserviceable items. For replacement of non-cache items, if the replacement request is approved, the reimbursement amount will be limited to the cache equivalent value. (PMS 902 Chapter 30).

Replacement for normal wear and tear will be through your home unit.

Human Resource Message



The point of communication is not to win or be right; the point is either to bring people together or clarify their differences. This can be difficult to do because people often are hesitant to talk about what is really bothering them. The "real issues" frequently are what they tend to hide most carefully.



28 MEDICAL EMERGENCY PROCEDURES

Medical Incident Report

FOR A NON-EMERGENCY INCIDENT: WORK THROUGH CHAIN OF COMMAND TO REPORT AND TRANSPORT INJURED PERSONNEL AS NECESSARY.

FOR A MEDICAL EMERGENCY: IDENTIFY ON SCENE INCIDENT COMMANDER BY NAME AND POSITION AND ANNOUNCE "MEDICAL EMERGENCY" TO INITIATE RESPONSE FROM COMMUNICATIONS

Use the following items to communicate situation to communications/dispatch.

1. CONTACT COMMUNICATIONS / DISPATCH (Verify correct frequency prior to starting report)

Ex: "Communications, Div. Alpha. Stand-by for Emergency Traffic."

2. INCIDENT STATUS: Provide incident summary (including number of patients) and command structure.

Ex: "Communications, I have a Red priority patient, unconscious, struck by a falling tree.
