WEATHER DISCUSSION: WEAK HIGH PRESSURE BUILDING TO THE EAST OF THE FIRE WILL BRING A SOUTHEAST FLOW THROUGH SATURDAY. THE HIGH TEMPERATURE WILL DIP ON FRIDAY THEN INCREASE AGAIN AS THE HIGH PRESSURE CONTINUES TO BUILD OVER THE AREA ON SATURDAY. A LOW PRESSURE CENTER WELL OFF THE CALIFORNIA COAST WILL CREATE A WEAK (10 TO 20 MPH) OFF-SHORE FLOW (EASTERLY WIND) SUNDAY AND MONDAY.

GENERAL FIRE BEHAVIOR

Suppression activities will limit fire activity around most of the fire. Any activity will occur in the northern portion of the fire where any runs will burn into the Day fire. Any spot fires, slop-overs or new starts in the area do have the potential to burn actively.

Indicators of Increased Fire activity

- Relative humidities below 15%
- Temperatures Increasing
- Small smokes picking up

Critical Fire Behavior

- Probability of Ignition up to 90%
- Head Fire Rates of Spread Up to 3 mph
- Spotting Distance Up to 1/2 mile
- Backing Flame Lengths up to 20'

SPECIFIC FIRE BEHAVIOR

Smoldering activity and burning of small pockets of fuel mainly inside the fire will be the main fire activity. If the fire gets established outside the fire perimeter expect rapid uphill runs and slow but intense backing fire in continuous fuels. Any fire spread will be checked or slowed by sparse or broken fuels. Some runs are expected on the northern portion of the fire south of the Day fire.

Air Operations: No limitations for aviation operations.

SAFETY: We still have very dry conditions. Do not become complacent.

- 4. Avoid staging in riparian areas.
- 5. No vehicles (staging or dozing) at Squaw Flat.
- 6. Avoid retardant drops and air operations around cliffs in Hopper and Aqua Blanca Canyons.
- 7. Notify Resource Advisor of injured Condors.
