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**WEATHER DISCUSSION:** High pressure ridge breaking down as an upper level trough approaches the Central California coast today. Winds will shift from northeast in the morning to west in the afternoon and southwest during the evening. Southwest winds to continue through the night and overpower down slope winds at times. The marine layer will deepen to 2700 feet by Sunday morning. The trough is expected to move onshore Sunday.

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### **WEATHER FORECAST:**

**WEATHER:** Mostly Clear. Smoke trapped in valleys during the morning.

**TEMPS:** Max 81-91 - down 4  
Min 69-74 - down 4.

**HUMIDITY:** Min 10-15% - up 3  
Max 25-35% - little change.

**RIDGETOP -** till 1000 PDT.....Northeast 10 mph with gusts 15 mph  
1100-1600 PDT.....Northwest 5 to 10 mph

Mostly clear except smoke and fog in valleys in the morning and again at night. Marine layer deepening to 3500 feet. Highs 74 to 80. Lows 55 to 60 mid and upper slopes...near 50 valleys and lower slopes. Min RH 14 to 20 percent...except 30 percent valleys and lower slopes. Max RH 25 percent except 85 percent valleys/lower slopes. Winds Southwest 10-15 mph with gusts 25 mph.

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### **Outlook...August 6-9, 2007**

**.Monday through Tuesday...**Mostly clear except smoke and fog in valleys nights and mornings. Highs 71-76. Lows 52-62. Min RH 25-30%. Max RH 35% except lower slopes 75-85%. Inversion lifting to 6000 feet in the afternoons. Wind west to southwest 10-15 mph afternoons and evenings.

**.Wednesday through Thursday...**Mostly clear. Highs 74-80. Lows 50-60. Min RH 25%. Max RH 35-55%. Wind east 5 mph night and morning hours...west 5 to 15 mph afternoons and evenings.

## INPUTS

**WEATHER SUMMARY:** The high pressure ridge is breaking down as the trough approaches. Winds will transition from northeast to southwest during the shift. SEE ATTACHED INCIDENT METEOROLOGIST WEATHER FORECAST.

PROBABILITY OF IGNITION = 90% (calculated), up 3 from 8/3/07

Live Fuel Moistures are 51% at Upper Oso (Los Prietos). Sample date July 15, 2007

## FIRE BEHAVIOR

**GENERAL:** A weak inversion over the fire area will mix up to 17,000 feet giving the fire room to grow vertically. Today will be a day of change as the trough begins to effect the fire area with a southwest winds late in the afternoon. Early fire activity will be on the south and eastern flanks with the fire having the potential to display similar behavior to yesterday. As the trough approaches in the afternoon the focus of the spread will shift to the east and northeast along the Buckhorn Road, Grapevine drainage and areas high along the Mission Pine Basin trail.

## SPECIFIC

**Division J -** The heat has come out of much of this division, but the large fuels will continue to burn down. Interior burning will continue with occasional torching. The SW winds late in the afternoon have the potential to effect the division and spread the fire into unburned fuels.

**Division K –** The fire is aligned in some deep drainages south of the main Mission Ridge trail. The north-south orientation of the primary ridges will act as a barrier to the W/SW winds surfacing in the drainages, but as the fire approaches ridge tops the effects of the wind of the fire could rapidly accelerate fire spread both to the east and north.

**Division L –** The Grapevine drainage will funnel this afternoon SW winds and will push the fire in an easterly direction toward the Buckhorn Road and Bluff camp. Continuous fuels are available throughout the drainage. A combination of slope runs will occur during the shift as the fire continues to reposition today.

**Division T&S –** The fire remains in Black Canyon and has been checked east of the dozer line off of Santa Cruz Peak. Expect lateral and downslope spread until the early afternoon when the shift to westerly winds occurs. This will push the fire back onto itself and will set the division for possible burning opportunities after 1500 hrs

**Division R –** Expect the uncheck fire east of Buckhorn Road. The best burning conditions on this division will be before the swing to the westerly wind. The Buckhorn ridge will act as a block to the general winds after the wind transition and the fire will then be out of alignment to both the slope and wind.

**AIR OPERATIONS:** Expect burn-off of the marine influence at Rancho helibase by 0900. The fire will remain smoky on the south. Smoke will impact visibility

## SAFETY

- The fire has repositioned into alignments that have not been previously seen. Crews need to reevaluate, their position on the fire ground in relation to the how the fire is positioned in relation to slope/wind and fuel continuity
- This is the first time in weeks that the fire will experience a SW wind. Areas of the fire that have been stable have the potential to become active today
