WEATHER DISCUSSION: High pressure at the surface will begin to build back into southern California resulting in a subtle warming and drying trend.

INPUTS

WEATHER SUMMARY: SEE ATTACHED INCIDENT METEOROLOGIST WEATHER FORECAST.

A slow-moving weak upper trough will keep unseasonably cooler temperatures over portions of southern CA.

PROBABILITY OF IGNITION = 80% above 3,500 feet, 50-55% below 3,000 feet

Live Fuel Moistures are 51% at Upper Oso (Los Prietos). Sample date July 15, 2007

FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL: Marine moisture was expected to again move up the canyons below 3,000 feet during the night and persist until about 1000h today. This will help check fire spread on the south side of the fire until the marine layer dissipates. Brush fuels will become available shortly after the inversion lifts, while grass fuels may not be available until after 1100h. Above 3,000 feet, the fire will have minimal fire growth as the North winds are being sheltered by higher terrain.

SPECIFIC

Divisions J, K – Fire activity will be limited to burnout of larger fuels, with continued burnout of interior fuels and occasional torching. Favorable winds will also move fire back into the main body of the fire.

Division L, P – Fire activity will be must the same today as yesterday. The southern half of the division will be under the influence of the inversion, damping fuel moistures. Buck Horn Ridge will block wind and hold fire in check, South and East of Little Pine Mountain. East of Buck Horn Creek, slope and fuels will align somewhat, and with changing wind directions because of topography, allow fire movement toward Indian Creek. Fire East of Buck Horn Road will remain much in place since much of this area is sheltered by Buck Horn Creek to the North.

Divisions S, T – Fire activity will be greatly diminished after the prior burnout operations. Higher humidity below 3,000 feet, and W winds, will assist in securing the line.

Divisions Q, R – Large fuels will continue to smolder next to fireline from yesterday's burnout. Interior fuels will continue to burn with occasional torching in those areas. Higher humidity will assist in securing fireline during early evening hours. The inversion should begin lift around 0900 hrs. Shortly after, brush fuels will carry fire. Grass fuels will carry fire upwards of one hour after that. The most effective burn out conditions will be from 1100 hrs until 1500 hrs.

AIR OPERATIONS: Expect burn-off of the marine influence at Rancho helibase by 1000. Haze will hang in the valley longer possibility impacting operations at Rancho helibase.

SAFETY

- The fire has repositioned into more conifer fuels to the north, and torching with resultant short- and medium-range spotting should be expected.
- Fuels will become available at different times today depending on elevation (above/below the marine layer) and time that this layer dissipates. Be aware of your location relative to this effect, and know that fuel availability and fire behavior will change rapidly as the inversion lifts and the marine layer dissipates.

***DEHYDRATION** - Dry, Hot, Potential Windy Conditions

***EXTREME CONDITIONS** - Record low Rainfall, fuels are exhibiting high fire activity. Fuels- 40%

* - Retardant Drops and Aviation Operations

***TRANSPORTATION** - Fatigue, Traffic, Narrow & Dusty Roads, Large Equipment.

***DOZER & ENGINE OPERATIONS** - Personnel Working Near or Operating Equipment

***FIRING**- Know and follow the Ignition/Firing Plan.

Fire Order of the Day - Ensure instructions are given and understood

***COMMUNICATIONS** - Ensure adequate communications with all the locations and resources that affect your operation: Medical Emergency to ICP, assigned resources, adjacent resources, Aviation assets, line locators, etc. Monitor the correct frequency for weather/fire warnings. For your Safety, USE and MONITOR assigned radio frequencies **ONLY!**

***DEHYDRATION** - It can take its toll and lead to cramps, heat stress, etc. So drink lots of **WATER**. Strive to drink enough fluids, flushing your system so as to urinate every 3 hours. Replace electrolytes every 2-3 hours by taking tablets and/or drinking Gatorade. Pre-order and plan for your current and projected operation(s).

***FIRE BEHAVIOR** - We are recording record low rainfall in this geographic area. We are in a long term drought. The probability of ignition is high. Live fuel moisture values in common fuel types for this area are extremely low and dead fuel moistures are extremely low. The fuels are in a critical stage. Due to these factors, fire will exhibit maximum flame lengths with extreme rates of spread. This fire is fuel driven and that spread is enhanced by weather and topography.

Remember and Live: The 10 Standard Fire Orders; The 18 Situations That Shout Watch Out; The Common Denominators of Fire Behavior on Tragedy Fires; and LCES.

***AIR OPERATIONS** - Maintain good communications with other ground units and aircraft in your area. Ground crews must maintain a safe distance during retardant and water drops for not only personal safety, but to allow the pilot an opportunity to do his job in a safe and effective manner. Be aware of non-incident personnel during air-ops, especially if using air tankers. Use air resources as additional lookouts when appropriate.

***TRANSPORTATION** - When traveling to & from incidents - lights on, use seatbelts, & never exceed posted speed limits. Don't allow fatigue to control your vehicle. Share driving responsibilities between licensed operators. Watch out for livestock, wildlife, pedestrians and the public. The roads around here turn to powder after several vehicles have traveled over them; maintain a safe distance from the vehicle in front of you to maintain good visibility for both you and ant oncoming traffic. Drive Defensively!

***EQUIPMENT** -Engines are working in Strike Teams. Check the underside of your vehicles when possible and especially when leaving the line to ensure that you do not have a buildup of brush and debris on the carriage and skid plates. When following a dozer-tractor, stay at least 50 feet behind. Never approach a working dozer unless you have the attention of the operator. Never approach equipment from the back or operator's blind side.

***ADDITIONAL/ASSIGNED RESOURCES** - Make sure you accomplish a complete briefing to assigned resources. Utilize the Briefing Checklist on the back cover of the IRPG, Stay within your personal and crew's capabilities. There is not a single square inch or a million square miles worth injuring firefighters. Mitigate or change tactics when faced with lack of firefighting resources and/or fatigued crews for your assignment.

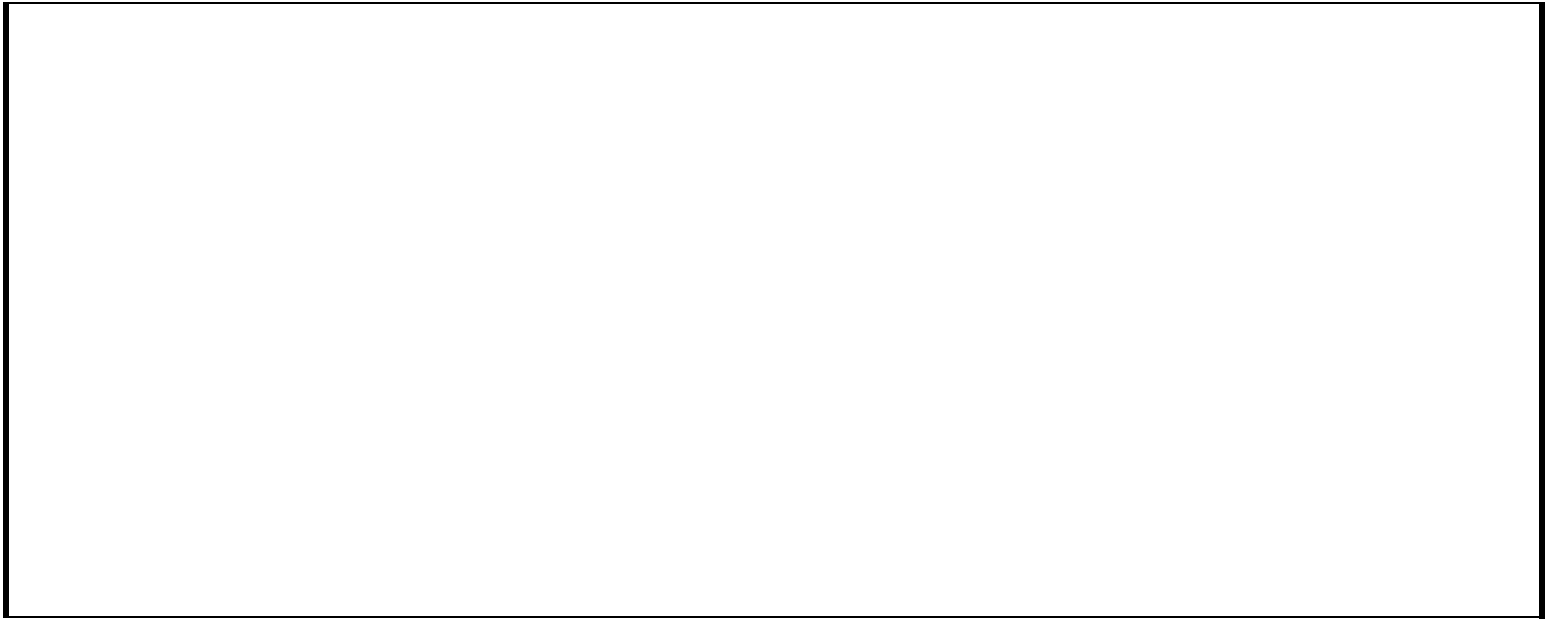

The communications unit shall limit all non essential traffic on command by declaring a "Medical Emergency" and shall then notify the Medical Unit, Safety Officer, and Operations Section Chief of the incident.
