WEATHER DISCUSSION: High pressure will begin to build back into southern California resulting in a warming and drying trend. The terrain over the local area will influence both the direction of the winds and the intensity of the winds.

A high pressure will begin to build back into southern California resulting in a warming and drying trend.

PROBABILITY OF IGNITION = 90% above 3,500 feet, 70% below 3,000 feet

Live Fuel Moistures are 51% at Upper Oso (Los Prietos). Sample date July 15, 2007

FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL: Marine moisture will again move up the canyons below 2,500 feet during the night and persist until early morning today. This will help check fire spread on the south side of the fire until the marine layer dissipates. Higher relative humidity below 2,500 feet will dampen fine fuels, delaying availability and lessen fire intensity. Grass fuels will not be available until 1000 hrs while the brush comes available shortly after the marine moisture lifts. Best window for burnout will be much like yesterday which was 1100 hrs until 1600 hrs. Fire activity above 2500 feet will be limited since the fire is out of alignment with slope resulting in a back and flanking fire with the exception of fire just West of the Pie Canyon Jeep Road.

SPECIFIC

Division L, P – Fire activity will be slightly more activity then yesterday because of the drying trend. The area of most concern is just North of Buckhorn Creek where the fire has reached the Pie Canyon Jeep Road. With the forecasted Southwest wind plus strong up canyon wind, fire will want to move laterally up canyon. For areas protected from these winds, fire will want to start backing down into the Indian Creek drainage in the Dick Smith Wilderness. Fire East of Buck Horn Road remains hung up since slope and fire are not in alignment. Fire's edge East/West, South of Little Pine Mountain has begin to cool because of current suppression efforts

Divisions Q, R –Be on watch for larger fuels smoldering next to line. Islands of unburned fuels will continue to burn with an occasional flare up.

Divisions S, T – Divisions are in a patrol status. There may be an occasional smolder of large fuels will off of fireline.

AIR OPERATIONS: Expect burn-off of the marine influence at Rancho helibase by 0900 hrs. Haze will hang in the valley longer possibility impacting operations at Rancho helibase.

SAFETY.

We have begun a drying pattern of higher temperatures and lower relative humidity. Even though the fire hasn't grown in size the last couple of days, don't drop your guard.

HAZARD MITIGATIONS

CHANGE IN WEATHER: Pay close attention to the Fire Weather Forecast and Predicted Fire Behavior Analysis. Don't be surprised if changes happen; have a contingency plan for any situations and anticipate issues in advance. There was a wind CHANGE (Speed) yesterday.

LCES BASICS and COMMUNICATIONS: Be certain that you can satisfy LCES for every operation, at all times. Reassess conditions periodically as the operational period progresses and conditions change. Don't ever be surprised.

Remember to keep in communications with your troops, even at the drop points. Did you verify your Communications TODAY? On your Division and with Adjacent Resources? Share the frequency, there is a lot of congestion. Check your assigned Repeater(s) to ensure adequate and positive communication.

DRIVING and NARROW ROADS: We continue to receive reports of fire vehicles (including crew buggies, water tenders, support vehicles) driving too fast to and from the fire line and not having their headlights on. This is a safety issue that we cannot overlook, it must be properly mitigated. If you are in this category, slow down and turn your lights on as you leave camp. If you are a passenger in a vehicle, remind the driver of their obligation.

There was a transport with dozer turned sideways in the road yesterday. Before you start heavy equipment, scout the road thoroughly before you commit.

Many safe hours have been accomplished so far but we have a long way to go yet, stay focused on SAFETY.

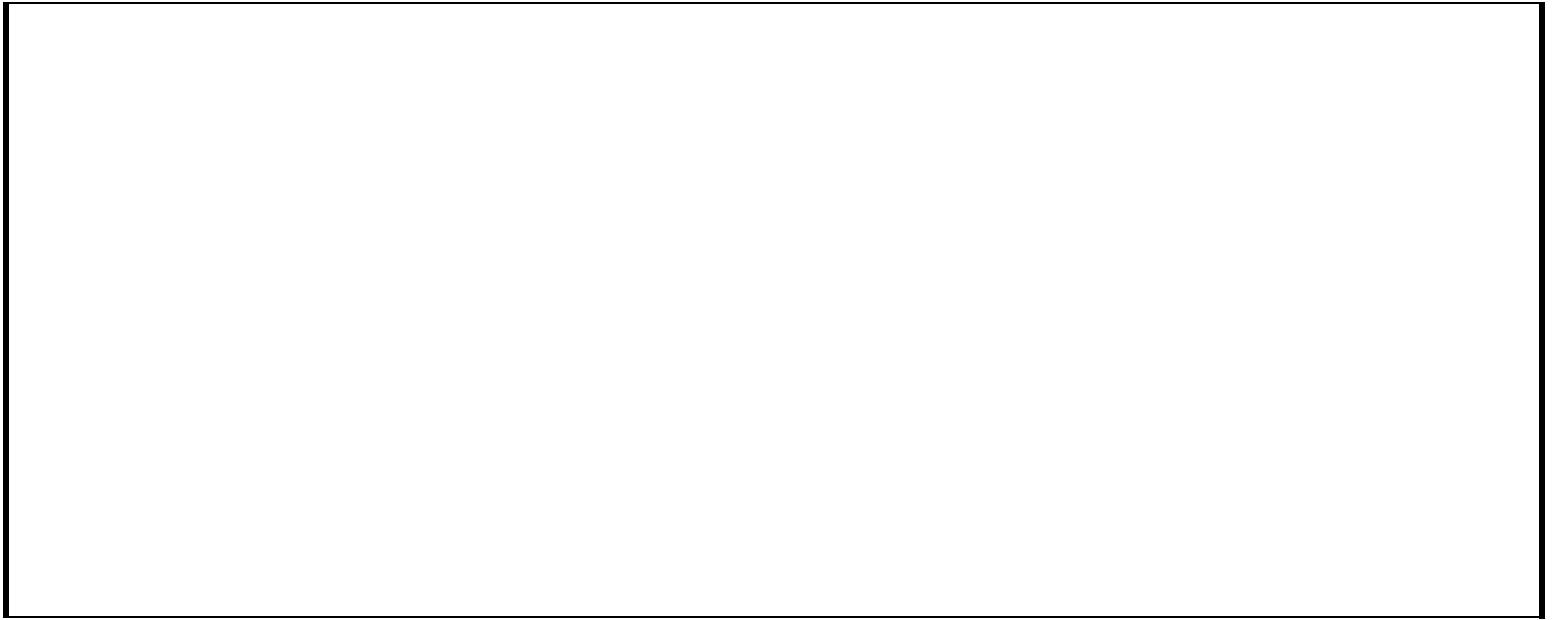
